the United States, is having difficulty creating jobs. If I knew everything that needs to be done, I'd be glad to tell you, and we could just call off the whole deliberations of Congress and everything else. I don't have all the answers. But I know this: Doing nothing is not the answer.

And so the jobs program that I have presented to Congress, with the summer jobs, with the money for the cities and the counties, through the community development program, with the infrastructure money, is a small part of a big budget. It is an attempt to engage in an experiment to see whether or not, with the economy recovering in terms of corporate profit, we can give a little boost to it, give opportunities to young people, create a half a million jobs, and maybe get the engine going again.

Most of the jobs in this program are going to be jobs in the private sector, not Government jobs, even though it's Government money. And the lion's share of the work in rebuilding the American economy obviously will come from the private sector. That's the kind of system we have, and it works pretty well.

But this is the challenge we have. So I ask all of you here today to support the summer jobs program, to ask your friends and neighbors to support it, to go back home and ask your employers to make a little extra effort, to do what you can to help me pass the funds to

create the 700,000 jobs that the United States Government should create this summer, so that together we can have this partnership. Because more than anything else, we have to give a future, a future that our young people can believe in.

We need to send them a message that here in America if you study hard and work hard, if you obey the law and contribute something to your community, you will be rewarded by your country. You can build a future from your own dreams.

That has always been the promise of America. Together that's what this summer of challenge needs to be: a reaffirmation of the promise of America for so many young people to whom that promise has been an illusion. We can make it a reality.

The President announced his intention today to nominate Albert Herberger to be Administrator of the Federal Maritime Administration, Department of Transportation; Loretta Dunn to be Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Import Administration; and Christopher Finn to be Executive Vice President of the Overseas Private Investment Corporation, U.S. International Development Cooperation Agency.

Additionally, he has approved the appointments of Joan Yim to be Deputy Administrator of the Federal Maritime Administration, Alice Maroni to be Principal Deputy Comptroller of

the Department of Defense, and Deborah Castleman to be Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Command, Control, and Communications.

"We are continuing to move forward with putting together a Government of excellent, diverse Americans who share my commitment to changing the way that Washington works," said the President. "These six people I am naming today fit that bill."

Dear Mr. President:

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG), I am writing to invite you to be the Honorary Chair of the 1996 JAG LEADERSHIP AWARDS event that will take place in Washington, D.C. this December. I chair JAG's Executive Committee and am one of its founding members. JAG Board member, John J. McKernan, recognized your commitment to youth and school-to-work transition last May on the anniversary of the signing of the School-to-Work Opportunities Act and you have since honored the program with your personal endorsement.

Today JAG serves nearly 34,000 at-risk youth in 26 states across the country, making it the nation's largest and most consistently used model for school-to-work transition for at-risk youth. Over JAG's 16-year history, more than 175,000 at-risk youth have been served. Our goal is to see to it that JAG reaches 65,000 youth in 40 states by the year 2000. The enclosed briefing paper tells the story of JAG's impressive track record--at a cost of less than half the national average for similar programs.

JAG had an extremely good year in 1995, culminating in the first JAG LEADERSHIP AWARDS event that featured House Speaker Gingrich, Secretary of Labor Reich and Miss America 1996 as the keynote speakers. An additional 17 Members of Congress and nearly 500 corporate and education leaders joined us for this event. JAG enjoys broad bipartisan support and has received endorsements from every U.S. President since its inception.

Given your commitment to the youth of this country, I write in the hope that it will be possible for you serve as our Honorary Chair this year. Ken Smith, the President of JAG will be in touch with Paul Diamond to provide further information. I am, of course, always available to respond to any questions that you may have.

Dear Mr. President:

This past Monday, your White House Counsel wrote to a House Subcommittee on Government Reform and Oversight that he was unable to consider releasing the names of the 200,000 Americans whom you keep in your White House "Big Brother" Database. He wrote that he was "too busy" helping you draft legislation that would give you sweeping new powers, including the power to order secret wire taps on American citizens without court approval.

We strongly support efforts to protect American citizens against foreign and domestic terrorist attacks. However, we find it extremely difficult to grant you additional powers that can be used against innocent Americans, such as secret wire taps without court authority, given your record of abuse of the civil liberties of Americans.

FBI files. For over a year, your White House has sought and maintained at least 700 to 1,000 files from the FBI containing personal, sensitive background information on your political opponents and continues to withhold information from Congress on this matter. Any legislation that is passed must guarantee that such abuses and possible illegal uses of FBI files can never occur in the White House again.

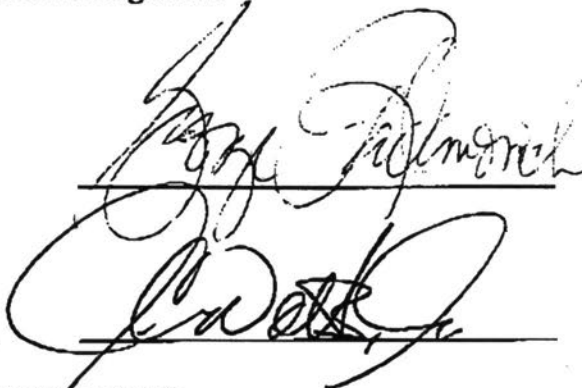
White House Big Brother Database. You have refused three requests to release the names of the 200,000 Americans on whom you keep computer files in the White House Big Brother Database. Before any serious consideration can be given to granting you additional powers to conduct wire taps of American citizens and to other requests in your anti-terrorist bill, we insist that you release all the data you maintain on the 200,000 Americans in the Big Brother Database.

We all strongly support efforts by the law enforcement community to do everything possible to fight terrorism at home and abroad. However, in order to fulfill our oath to uphold the Constitution, we must protect the civil liberties of innocent Americans. Your actions in bringing improper FBI files into your White House and failing to release the names of 200,000 Americans in the Big Brother Database, indicate that you cannot be trusted to protect the civil liberties of Americans. In order to ensure that Congress can protect the rights of all Americans and make them secure from terrorism, we urge you to immediately reverse your course and allow complete and unrestricted access by Congress to all information relating to the FBI files and Big Brother Database investigations.
