We need the federal government to increase its efforts in controlling the flow of illegal aliens into our community and to offer assistance to the local municipalities and schools to provide the services that are required by those who are here legally but need special services.

The second concern is ACCESS TO AND COST OF HEALTH CARE. Many people remain very concerned over the prospect of their requiring health care and the payment for these very expensive services. Contrary to much of the current discussions on cost containment, when you are really sick

you have very little if any control over the cost of those services your doctors say you need. Everyone is concerned that if and when that catastrophe happens to them, either the medical care will not be available or it will bankrupt them. The whole issue of the availability of and cost of medical insurance, especially for major illness, needs to be further examined to make it available to more of the population.

The third concern is **THE TOTAL COST OF GOVERNMENT**. Many residents recognize that what is happening now is a shell game. I see this very much as a local Mayor. One level of government reduces funding but does not reduce people's expectations of services needed. This reduction of financial resources then "trickles down" to the lowest level of government where we have no where to hide. Due to the growing realization of this situation, a great deal of cynicism now exists among people of the whole subject of revenue reduction-cost containment by all levels of government.

The final concern is **THE ESCALATING COST OF EDUCATION ESPECIALLY AS IT RELATES TO SPECIAL NEEDS CHILDREN**. Every time we have discussions with local elected school board members, they regale us with the "mandates" they have to meet from federal and state regulation without the corresponding financial resources. It is nice for the federal and state leaders to respond to concerns by those parents who have children needing special attention; but there must be a realization of the cost of these special services and the capability of the local taxpayer to foot this bill.

The above is by no means inclusive but reflects many of the current attitudes of local residents. I recognize that these are issues you are dealing with in the National Election. Please be assured that they are real local issues also.

Again I am looking forward to the honor of meeting you on the 24 Th.

SUBJ: Campaign '96

Since June I have, more or less, been involved in the campaign. Peter Knight designated me a Vice-Chair, National Leadership Council, with responsibility for business outreach. Since August, I have been calling "business leaders" I know looking to build a list of endorsers. I was in Chicago and saw you briefly when you arrived as I was with Tom & Cynthia Schneider.

So, why the memo? First this not about right or wrong since the campaign is going well and I do not pretend to know all that much about campaign strategy. Primarily I wanted you to be aware of two things.

The attached memo I wrote to Peter and Eli speaks for itself and, after many discussions with people such as Tom, Beth & Ron Dorante, Phil &

Linda, etc., I know can have a significant impact. Obviously, print ads don't "walk & talk," but they certainly can be effectively targeted. It is equally obvious it won't happen unless you want it to be so.

More importantly, however, is what is happening in Virginia, North Carolina & Colorado. I have volunteered as a surrogate for these areas and will be spending as much of my time as I can trying to push Virginia. The fact is you can carry Virginia. From all reports, virtually nothing is being done here and you are behind Dole by only 1% (43% to 44% according to latest Mason/Dixon poll). Not that the campaign should change direction, clearly, but I am going to try to make a dent for you in my home state.

Subj: Post Endorsement Activities of Business Outreach

Attached is a suggestion for both a print ad and TV ad to be used in specific contexts to reach the widest distribution of business persons. To date, we have focused on senior management for endorsements. The attached ad would target white collar workers who constitute the bulk of the "business" community.

GOAL: To provide a hard-hitting, factual message to the business community in terms they understand conveying the Clinton/Gore economic success.

STRATEGY:

1. Print - Ad, similar to attached, which would appear in targeted states, in targeted publications.

- in flight editions of selected magazines
- suggested magazines: Forbes, Newsweek, Time, Sport Illustrated, Fortune, Chief Executive Magazine, Barons, others as appropriate.
- choose edition based on zip code delivery of targeted demographics
 - income
 - education

2. Electronic media - run ads on selected outlets:

- CNBC; Moneyline; Evening news of ABC, CBS, NBC; Headline News during the business segment of the programming during early morning, lunchtime, and evening hours.
- Appearances by Tyson/Rubin etc. on business targeted programs:
 - Moneyline, Wall Street Week, etc.

3. Local newspapers in critical states.

4. Faxed to business endorsers.

5. Fliers/reprints made available to state campaign chairs for direct distribution at:

- sporting events, state fairs, etc.
- shopping malls.
- business district street corners
- wherever concentrations of people occur

Our focus on endorsers only relies on the newsworthiness to the market place of business voters. The bulk of "business" voters are middle income, middle managers. They are, obviously, the bulk of the middle class - in many cases, while having somewhat more formal education, the income levels of this group are not dissimilar to upper level blue collar employees.

The message to the business community need not be any different. The distribution of the message needs to be modified. By targeting the straight forward record through the channels described above, the impact becomes significant and extremely cost effective. I strongly encourage you to revisit the idea of using this type of direct approach.

My unaccustomed silence over the past month or so has not been due to any lack of admiration for what you and the President have done - and are doing - but simply due to the fact that I have been away from Washington until very recently. You did smashingly at the Convention; the campaign since then seems, from the outside, to be going as well as could possibly be expected; and the appearances I have seen by the two of you on television (right through the President's exceedingly engaging interview with Jim Lehrer last night) have been right up to your usual standards. In short - terrific!

I have been particularly pleased recently to see all of the support the President has been giving Democratic Congressional candidates, both in personal appearances and, more recently, in major new financing. Your second term (and I say that with all fingers and toes crossed) will be an extraordinary opportunity, and the more Democratic the Congress, the greater your opportunity.

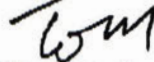
I attach a piece on the Joint Committee's cost estimate for the Dole tax plan. A \$1.1 trillion estimate from a thoroughly Republicanized staff (politicized for the first time since I have been in Washington, and so far as I know, for the first time since the advent of the income tax) thoroughly justifies Charlie

Rangel's quoted statement and could be useful in the debates. As for the President's own tax proposals, the Joint Committee has revised the estimate you see here down to only slightly over \$29 billion.

Keep fighting - and let me know if you think of anything in particular that I can help out with.

JCT Analysis Shows Cost Of Dole Tax Cuts Would Top \$1 Trillion Over Ten Years

The 10-year cost of the tax cuts advanced by GOP presidential nominee Bob Dole would be \$1.1 trillion, according to a Joint Committee on Taxation staff analysis released Sept. 13 by House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Bill Archer (R-Texas).

Archer said the numbers show that Dole's plan truly represents a tax cut, in contrast to President Clinton's tax proposals, which JCT staff estimated would raise net revenues of \$63.9 billion over the 10-year time frame (177 DTR G-7, L-1, 9/12/96). "While the Clinton budget calls for a tax hike, the Dole plan calls for a tax cut," Archer said. "The two plans represent very different governing philosophies."

A GOP congressional aide told BNA the difference between the two plans is "big picture." Dole would "shift resources back to the private sector, Clinton would not," the aide said.

In contrast, senior committee Democrat Charles Rangel (NY), who was among the Democrats requesting the 10-year cost estimate of Dole's plan, took direct aim at what the cost of this tax cut will mean in broader budget terms. "As we suspected, Dole's trillion dollar proposal leaves him a choice between two evils: cutting Medicare and Social Security or digging our children another trillion dollars in debt."

Senate Finance Committee ranking Democrat Daniel Patrick Moynihan (NY) had made three requests in August and September for a 10-year analysis of the Dole plan from JCT, according to a Senate Democratic aide.

Both Clinton and Dole have pledged to balance the federal budget as part of their overall plans, and as the 1995 balanced budget debate illustrated, the more that is provided in tax cuts, the deeper spending reductions must be in order to balance the books.

The 10-year numbers revealed few surprises relative to the six-year JCT staff analysis of the proposal released Aug. 8 (154 DTR GG-1, L-1, 8/9/96).

Over the expanded four years, however, the one provision that would dramatically increase in cost would be the American Dream Savings Account.

Over six years, the proposal, which generally would replace nondeductible individual retirement accounts with new American Dream Savings Accounts — which would allow nondeductible contributions, but also would allow withdrawals for certain purposes to be made tax-free — would cost only \$2.8 billion.

The 10-year cost of the new ADSAs would be \$18.5 billion, according to the JCT staff.

The text of the JCT staff estimate of the 10-year revenue effects of the Dole tax cut plan is in Section L.□
