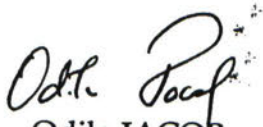

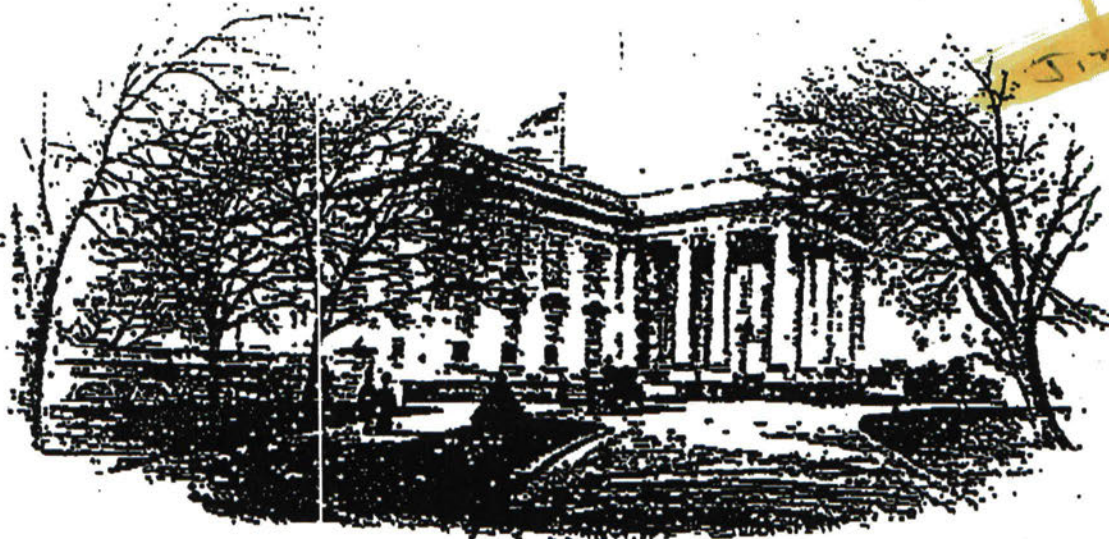

SUBJECT: BUDGETARY CONSTRAINTS AND NEW POLICY
ANNOUNCEMENTS

We understand that you may be interested in making more new policy announcements during the closing days of the campaign. In the budget and continuing in the initiatives surrounding the Chicago Convention, you have consistently shown how you plan to pay for each new initiative "line by line and dime by dime." Maintaining the fiscal credibility of your balanced budget plan will require that any new policy announcements with budgetary costs be accompanied by specific offsets.

As we know from our efforts to fashion offsets for the policy initiatives you have already announced--including most recently the literacy challenge and the welfare to work transition proposal--few if any easy offsets remain. As we look ahead to the FY 1998 budget process, based on our preliminary review, it appears that the situation if anything has gotten worse. As a result of likely changes in both the technical and economic assumptions underlying budget projections, it will be more difficult to balance the budget by 2002 than we projected in our last formal budget submission.

In short, the budgetary constraints that will confront you after the election will be tighter than our current budget projects and the tradeoffs will be even more painful. Any new policy you announce now means fewer resources later for other priorities, such as adding resources back for immigrants or food stamps, or extending the work-opportunity tax credit or the R&D tax credit beyond 1997. And the more resources you commit to new policy announcements now, the less flexibility you will have as you develop your budgetary strategy after the election.

We would like to meet with you at your earliest possible convenience after the election to provide you with an analysis of the budgetary situation and options for your budget strategy for FY 1998-2002. We will work with Leon to find an appropriate time. In the meantime, however, we strongly advise against new policy initiatives that emphasize future budget commitments. Such commitments will aggravate the difficult budgetary choices you will face at the beginning of your second term.

I am writing to you as someone whom I understand focuses on child/family matters. Enclosed is an idea I have had for some time which the President and your Council may wish to consider.

I had a brief opportunity to discuss it with Marian Wright Edelman a few days ago at Arthur Flemming's funeral and she thought it had merit enough to bear investigating.

The issue is child support and a method to try to recapture the \$10-12 billion that goes uncollected, despite legal obligations, court orders, etc. I have enclosed a sort of bare bones treatment of the concept, but wanted to send it to you before election time, in the event it might fit into an agenda you might have.

I have just retired, after nearly 40 years, in the General Counsel's Office of the Pentagon and wish you well in your Council's endeavors to improve the lives of children and their families.

CHILD-SUPPORT BONDS

The divorce of parents with children under the age of 18 should be authorized under the laws of the individual states only in circumstances where the parent or parents financially responsible are able to provide a bond or bonds assuring the full payment of court-ordered child support until the youngest child reaches the age of 18. The states should encourage appropriate financial institutions to make such bonds available for sale to parents of children under the age of 18, much as bail bonds and contractor performance bonds are made available to insure other legal requirements. The Federal Government should encourage the availability of child support bonds by re-insuring those financial institutions selling such bonds against loss from default by the financially responsible parent or parents, where the financial institution adheres to federally prescribed standards governing the terms and conditions for the sale and enforcement of the child-support bonds.

The financial institutions selling such bonds could be required to seek civil law enforcement to recover any child-support payments made on behalf of the defaulting parent or parents before seeking reimbursement from the United States for all or probably a portion of its payments. The terms of the bonds should make it clear that any reimbursement to the bond sellers by the United States would create a Federal obligation or debt for which the bond purchasers would be liable to the United States.

We have specific examples in various parts of the country where surplus property exists, where homeless groups cannot make use of it, and where Habitat for Humanity affiliates are willing to build Habitat houses to provide homes for those in need. One example of this is in Congressman John Boehner's district in Ohio. As a result of the Habitat affiliate in his district contacting him in regard to surplus property which no homeless group wishes to build and on which Habitat is prepared to build 30 Habitat houses, Congressman Boehner has taken leadership for this language which will accomplish what most persons we have talked to believe is right.

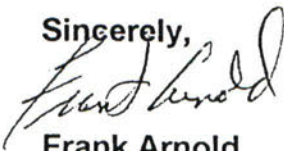

MR. SAGARDUI APPLIED FOR A VISITOR VISA ON MARCH 13, 1995
AND FAILED TO QUALIFY UNDER SECTION 214 (B) OF THE
IMMIGRATION AND NATIONALITY ACT. SECTION 214 (B) PROVIDES
THAT APPLICANTS FOR VISITOR VISAS ARE PRESUMED TO BE
IMMIGRANTS UNTIL THEY CAN DEMONSTRATE THAT THEY HAVE A
RESIDENCE OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES WHICH THEY HAVE NO
INTENTION OF ABANDONING. THE U. S. IMMIGRATION LAW PLACES
ON THE APPLICANTS THE BURDEN OF OVERCOMING THIS PRESUMPTION.AS OVER A YEAR HAS ELAPSED SINCE MR. SAGARDUI LAST APPLIED
FOR A VISA, HE MAY APPLY AGAIN WITH PROOF OF HIS CURRENT
COMMITMENTS IN HIS HOME COUNTRY AND ANY ADDITIONAL EVIDENCE
TO PROVE SHE IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE VISA. THE DETERMINATION
OF HIS VISA ELIGIBILITY WILL BE MADE BY A CONSULAR OFFICER
AT THAT TIME. PLEASE ASK HIM TO ADVISE THE INTERVIEWING
OFFICER OF YOUR INTEREST. I SHALL INFORM YOU OF THE
OUTCOME OF THE INTERVIEW.OUR RECORDS FURTHER SHOW THAT MR. SAGARDUI IS A BENEFICIARY
OF AN IMMIGRANT VISA PETITION FILED BY ONE OF HIS PARENTS
IN APRIL 3, 1990. ALTHOUGH THE EXISTENCE OF AN IMMIGRANT
VISA PETITION IS NOT A BAR TO OBTAINING A NONIMMIGRANT
VISA, IT STRENGTHENS THE PRESUMPTION THAT HE IS AN
INTENDING IMMIGRANT.IF YOU BELIEVE I MAY BE OF FUTURE ASSISTANCE, PLEASE DO NOT
HESITATE TO CONTACT ME.

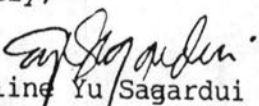
I am respectfully requesting that my husband Robertino Sagardui be granted a visitors visa to come here for a short visit. He has a pending immigrant visa petition and it will be years before his priority date becomes current. I am a resident alien (A29 300 446) since March 02, 1992. I initially came to the USA Jan. 1996 on a working H1 B visa as a physical therapist. As much as there's a shortage of therapists here in America my frequent vacation to visit my husband and family has greatly affected my work. It has interrupted my services in the needed rural areas of Arkansas. Presently, I drive 150 to 180 miles a day to treat patients in their homes. I earn a good salary and have no financial difficulties.

My husband has applied last March 1995 for a tourist visa of the intention to visit me briefly but was unfortunately turned down. It really sadden us for our intentions were truly sincere. I understand the US immigration law of presuming applicants for tourist visa wanting to migrate in your country but I also want you to understand our side that my husband and I have already invested a lot of time and emotional sacrifices living apart to abide with immigration law. For these reason, I guarantee you that my husband will return in our country after his visit and there he will wait for his immigrant visa because we do not want to endanger and risk his visa status.

I have worked hard and served the American people in my own special way as a physical therapist - patients of all ages and at their different stages of rehabilitation. It is a great privilege in my part to treat your fellow country men and in return I give my whole hearted commitment using my talents, abilities, knowledge in my profession and most of all hope and encouragement. I am grateful for all these. Seeing my patients recover and overcome their disabilities is a great reward. If you were in a foreign country where all your time is devoted for the betterment of health of these people surely a single wish granted for my husband to be with me this christmas season would make a million difference.

I humbly ask for your consideration and favorably grant my request. Thank you very much for your time in reading this letter and hoping for your kindness and consideration.

The American Cancer Society's Massachusetts Division cordially invites First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton to participate in a media event or photo opportunity to mark the beginning of National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, during her visit to Boston and Harvard University on October 3 or 4, 1996. The following is a proposal for this event, involving the First Lady and breast cancer survivors from Massachusetts.

What: Opportunity for the First Lady to highlight the Clinton Administration's support for federal funding of breast cancer research, and demonstrate the First Family's empathy for women and families affected by breast cancer-- the most common cancer among women. **This may serve as a kickoff event for October-- National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.**

The First Lady meets with 12 to 15 women who are breast cancer survivors, selected for their involvement in Massachusetts American Cancer Society breast cancer efforts, at a location convenient to her arrival at, or departure from, her speaking engagement at Harvard University.

At this meeting, the president of the American Cancer Society, Dr. Mary E. Costanza-- an oncologist, researcher, and breast cancer survivor--commends the President for his support of this important women's health issue, and has the **First Lady sign the first pink ribbon** that will hang on the Breast Cancer Memory Tree at the **American Cancer Society's October 6 Making Strides Against Breast Cancer walk in Boston**. Each year at this walk, more than 5,000 pink ribbons are tied to a young tree by participants, and signed in memory of loved ones who have battled breast cancer. The trees are then given to the City of Boston, and planted in public areas. A work of fabric art is being created with more than 20,000 pink ribbons that will be unveiled next year. (The artist herself has had breast cancer twice.) **The First Lady may wish to sign her ribbon in memory of the President's mother, who died of breast cancer;** the Virginia Kelley ribbon will become the first ribbon on the commemorative work of art, which will be displayed by the Society.

Also present at the meeting would be Barbara LeStage, the first woman Chair of the Board of the American Cancer Society, who also has breast cancer. Other survivors represent programs that provide support services to breast cancer patients, and free mammograms for underserved women. Many of the women are featured in a traveling photo exhibit sponsored by the American Cancer Society entitled, "*Living With Breast Cancer*." The photos would be on display at the event with the First Lady.

WHEN: Thursday, October 3, or Friday, October 4, 1996.

Event to precede or follow Mrs. Clinton's engagement at Harvard University.

This date is a perfect prelude to **October--National Breast Cancer Awareness Month**. It also is a prelude to *Making Strides Against Breast Cancer* on October 6. This walk benefiting the American Cancer Society is the largest single-venue fund-raiser for breast cancer in the United States, and the inspiration for numerous other *Strides* events nationwide.

WHERE: Location to be determined based upon the First Lady's schedule.

Suggested locations include: Logan International Airport in Boston; Boston City Hall, in the presence of the American Cancer Society's mobile mammography van that provides free mammograms to underserved women; a location at Harvard University, which receives more American Cancer Society research grants than any other Massachusetts Institution; or a local health center that uses the mobile mammography van.

WHY: * Highlight the Administration's support of **breast cancer, and women's health issues** on the eve of National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

* By drawing upon her own family's experience with breast cancer, the First Lady calls attention to **the impact of this disease on families**. It's not just a woman's disease. Men are affected, too.

Massachusetts Breast Cancer Event/ 3

*** Massachusetts is in the forefront of breast cancer research,**
including genetic, nutrition, and tamoxifen preventative studies.

*** Surveys show that breast cancer is the number one fear of women.**

This year, breast cancer will strike more than 184,300 American women, and will claim the lives of 44,300 more. The American Cancer Society-- the most trusted voluntary health organization fighting breast cancer-- is leading the effort to turn those statistics around. We welcome the opportunity to share our vision with Mrs. Clinton while she is visiting Massachusetts. In early April of 1990, I was sitting having coffee at a Kapulsky located in the City Center Mall in Herzlia. It had become a rather regular routine of mine, while visiting friends in Israel to take my morning walk, purchase a **Jerusalem Post** and sit down and read it at Kapulsky's while having my breakfast.

On that particular morning, I read that Saddam Hussein had reiterated his threat to "burn half of Israel" with chemical weapons. This threat had been made in the presence of a US Senatorial Delegation, led by then Minority Leader, Robert Dole.

As I recall it, I was distressed by the fact that Dole had not strongly protested this threat. With recent events in that region and the fact that Dole is now the Republican Candidate for President, I went back into the historical record recently to inquire as to whether or not my memory served me right.

In 1990, it was first reported that Saddam had made the threat against Israel on April 2. **The New York Times** had previously reported on March 29, 1990, that Iraq had the missile capability to strike both Damascus and Tel Aviv. As we found out during the Gulf War, this report was indeed factual, as was the existence of chemical weapons within their arsenal.

Senator Dole and his entourage toured the Middle East during April 8-15, 1990. Although Iraq was not on their original itinerary, the Senators paid their visit to Saddam Hussein on April 12. They delivered a letter from then President Bush which warned that Iraq's advanced weapons program would provoke dangerous tensions in the region.

It was during this meeting, that Saddam had indeed reiterated his threat to "burn half of Israel" if Israel was going "to attack Iraq with nuclear weapons." He even offered to scrap his nonconventional weapons program if Israel in turn abandoned its chemical and nuclear weapons.

In a transcript of the meeting of April 12, as broadcast by Baghdad radio, and recalled by William Safire in a Times essay entitled "Iraq's US Support" (May 4, 1990) Senator Dole "hastened to remind Mr. Hussein that 'we condemned the Israeli attack in 1981'" referring to the Israeli destruction of the Osirak reactor in Baghdad. Safire referred to Senator Dole as Saddam Hussein's "new supporter". This was four months before the invasion of Kuwait, and the resulting hostilities.

In subsequent interviews, Dole stated that a non-binding resolution passed by the Senate on March 22, 1990 recognizing Jerusalem as Israel's capital had been "a mistake" (Fact's on File; April 27, 1990). Two days after making those remarks on TV, Dole stated on April 15, that the US should consider cutting aid to Israel to free funds for emerging democracies in Eastern Europe and Latin

America. He went on to say that Americans were growing impatient with the "special relationship" between the US and Israel. (Facts on File; April 27, 1990)

In the **Jerusalem Post** of April 13, 1990, Dole was quoted as saying that threats to Israel were "probably lessening" and that American Jewish leaders "wouldn't give one penny to anybody else...it's not sensitivity, it's selfishness." This was after having personally heard Saddam's threat on April 12!

Even Newt Gingrich and several other Congressmen chastised Dole for his statements. On April 19, 1990 they made public a letter they had sent to the Senator criticizing him for his comments.

They related that such attacks and "stereotyping" damaged the Republican Party. Dole in turn attacked them for going public with such a letter, offering to match his "Pro-Israel" record with any of them.

What Safire referred to in his essay on May 4, 1990 as Dole's "old anti-Israel resentments" become apparent when the **Wall Street Journal** reported that Dole "was unhappy with the level of financial support he had received from Jewish contributors" (WSJ; April 20, 1990).

Perhaps, there's something more to Saddam's recent activities than meets the eye. Maybe he was attempting to aid an old acquaintance with whom he'd rather have dealings than the present occupant of 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue.

Senator Dole has referred to President Clinton's

foreign policy as "a sad interlude of American waffling and weaknesses" though nothing is more obvious than the Senator's own irresponsible missteps in the foreign policy arena when examined in light of the historical record.

President Clinton is so popular in Israel that he is even reported to have received a number of ballots in the May election. An Israeli friend jokingly refers to the President as the best "Prime Minister Israel ever had".

The Senator's recent opposition to the President's moves against Iraq sends a message to Saddam that support for the moves is not entirely universal in our country and therefore may encourage further military adventures by Iraq in the immediate future.

Only one conclusion can be drawn from Senator Dole's past comments and present actions, that is that President Clinton is the best friend Israel ever had and it should be clear that inspite of whatever Senator Dole now claims, he would certainly be a disaster for Israel if ever elected.
