It was an honor and pleasure to be a part of these events and I have enclosed a few candid photos I thought you might enjoy.

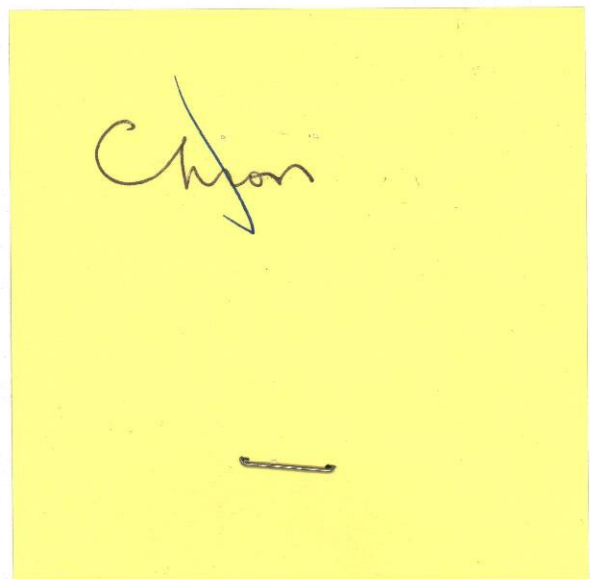
I am very interested in being considered for a position as a White House photographer. I am aware that you have special events and projects that need to be documented, perhaps this is where I could fit into your administration.

Dear Mr. President:

It was a great pleasure for Roger and me to hear your lively and statesmanlike remarks introducing The Kennedy Center honorees.

I am enormously grateful to you for saying that you will look into the situation regarding the cruel steel jaw leghold trap. You mentioned that you didn't know anything about it, so let me, very briefly, urge you to accept the European Union's ban of imports of fur from 13 species of animals from the United States because we haven't prohibited use of leghold traps.

Enclosed is an ad we took at the time of the Genesis Awards, featuring you and Socks. Since the ad appeared, the number of countries that have outlawed steel jaw leghold traps has risen to 88!

I beg you to withdraw the United States' threat of a World Trade Organization challenge of the European Union's praiseworthy Regulation 3254/91, which has eliminated use of these traps in all EU nations. The U.S. Census reports that only 2,099 individuals' principal occupation is hunting and/or trapping. The value of the furs involved is \$23 million--surely not worth a nasty fight with the EU.

If Congresswoman Lowey's bill to end the use of steel jaw leghold traps were passed, we would be the 89th country to take this civilized step, and we could continue to sell furs to the EU using the many alternative traps available.

The most recent poll sponsored by the Animal Welfare Institute shows 74% of the American public wants these traps to be prohibited by law. Last month, referendum votes in Colorado and Massachusetts resulted in prohibition of these traps.

The totally unacceptable proposal being made by Sir Leon Brittan is no solution at all. It would inflict years of agony on trapped animals. Please reject it and support what the great body of American citizens want and expect from you: an end to the use of these agonizingly cruel traps.

More than 70 nations have outlawed the hideously cruel steel jaw leghold trap, most recently Russia (last year). The United States, however, still hasn't banned this trap—in fact, it still sets out thousands of its own steel jaw traps, and is even trying to dismantle the European Union's law against the traps.

Please ask President Clinton to bring our country out of the Dark Ages, where hidden traps catch any creature unfortunate enough to trigger the traps' bone-crushing steel jaws. Ask the President to picture the agonizing pain and fear his family's cherished cat, Socks, would experience if he were caught in a leghold trap.



We hope this photo brings home what it would be like if Socks were the unwitting victim of a steel jaw leghold trap.



Urge Clinton to protect Socks and his fellow furbearers by supporting the bill now pending in Congress to end use of the steel jaw leghold trap, and by accepting the European Union's ban on importation of furs from many wild species commonly caught in leghold traps from countries that haven't yet prohibited them.

Remind him of his promise: "I have always loved and respected animals and abhorred any cruelty toward them. Please be assured that a Clinton Administration would be extremely sensitive to these issues and concerns."

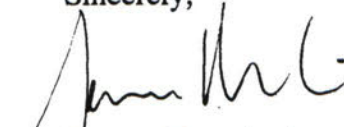

Dear Mr. President:

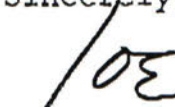
