Dear Assistant Stern:

I am writing to ask that the current U.S. policy towards the Ottawa Conference process on the global banning of anti-personnel mines be changed.

As things currently stand, the U.S. has been opposed to pursuing the Ottawa Conference process, in order to rather go only with a U.N.-based negotiation.

In other words, the U.S. stance currently is that getting a global land mine ban that the Chinese and the Russians refuse to sign onto is not preferable to waiting until such time as the Russians and the Chinese are willing to sign onto a watered down land mine control regime (that may be only slightly improved from the one currently in place).

I believe that this "hold out for a non-starter" approach, to sit on our hands and hope that the Chinese and the Russians go along at some indefinite time in the future, is a big mistake.

We should all note that it is as a consequence of delays in the UN Conference that U.S. servicemen and servicewomen have been put in danger from anti-personnel land mines in U.S.-patrolled zones in Bosnia. These anti-personnel mines have in fact been the greatest threat to U.S. troops during our peace-keeping work in Bosnia.

There are already 95 nations that are willing to go along with an Ottawa Conference-based global unequivocal land mine manufacture, sale, possession, and distribution ban. In addition, the Central American states and CARICOM states have created the world's first regional landmine-free zone, and these states have committed to signing an Comprehensive Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Treaty by the end of 1997.

The odd thing about waiting until all nations are willing to sign on to a land mines ban is that this is the exact opposite of the approach that was taken to put in place the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty. In fact, in that case, there are a number of nations that have refused to cooperate in the treaty (Iran, Pakistan, India, Israel, and Iraq). Despite this opposition from the countries most likely to violate the Test Ban, the treaty was put in place.

What is the logic of not passing a law against something until the most egregious violators accede to it? Yet that is apparently what the U.S. government is doing in its opposition to the Brussels declaration, the Brussels International Conference, and the coalescing of all of the opponents against the use and manufacture of anti-personnel land mines.

What possible objection could the U.S. have to proceeding with diplomatic negotiations where outlaw states like Serbia, China, Iraq, Syria, and Burma will not be able to cast unilateral vetoes over the international negotiation ?

Please change this apparent U.S. policy, and come up to the plate and bat - support the Ottawa Conference and the Joint Resolution now. When, as is unavoidable, the governments of China and Russia realize that they are isolated and perceived as outlaws (and rightly so), then they will turn about and they too will participate in a global land mine ban. We cannot depend upon a U.N. Treaty process that appears more and more to be not just futile but counterproductive, (and particularly when there are officials of the U.S. government bad mouthing the efforts of those who are in the lead on this vital issue.)

Please help all of the sufferers of land mines over the world. Make the U.S. policy productive and active, towards a global ban on these instruments of havoc, and towards support of the Diplomatic Conference in Oslo and the resultant Global Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Treaty in Ottawa.

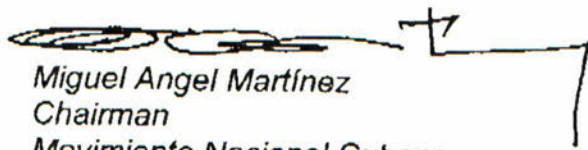
