Powers Act

Dear Mr. President:

In Executive Order No. 12924 of August 19, 1994, you declared a national emergency under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 *et seq.*) to deal with the threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States caused by the lapse of the Export Administration Act of 1979, as amended (50 U.S.C. App. 2401 *et seq.*). Under the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1601 *et seq.*), the emergency will terminate automatically on the anniversary of your declaration unless, within the ninety-day period prior to the anniversary date, you publish in the *Federal Register* and transmit to the Congress a notice stating that such emergency must continue in effect. You published continuation notices on August 17, 1995 and August 15, 1996, and must publish another continuation notice no later than August 18, 1997 to continue the emergency in effect.

Enclosed is a proposed notice which fulfills the National Emergencies Act requirement for continuation of the emergency until August 19, 1998. I recommend that you sign and transmit the enclosed notice.

Continuation of Emergency Regarding Export Control Regulations

On August 19, 1994, consistent with the authority provided me under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 *et seq.*), I issued Executive Order No. 12924. In that order, I declared a national emergency with respect to the unusual and extraordinary threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States in light of the expiration of the Export Administration Act of 1979, as amended (50 U.S.C. App. 2401 *et seq.*). In accordance with section 202(d) of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622 (d)), which provides that an emergency will terminate automatically on the anniversary of its declaration unless a notice is published and transmitted to the Congress stating that such emergency must continue in effect, I published continuation notices on August 17, 1995 and August 15, 1996. Because the Export Administration Act has not been renewed by the Congress, the national emergency declared on August 19, 1994 must continue in effect beyond August 19, 1997. Therefore, I am again continuing the national emergency declared in Executive Order No. 12924.

This notice shall be published in the *Federal Register* and transmitted to the Congress.
