Now that his death plays such a central part of my life it would be nice to bring closure to this issue before my life joins his in death. Even better would be to resolve this before my young daughter has death so engrained in her that it goes hand in hand with life. Personally I am pleased that she seems comfortable with Life & Death being interconnected.

At this time I'd like to request your personal appointment of a person who would be an advocate for those of us involved with the mission.

I am personally involved in an advocacy capacity, but feel it would be helpful; in the spirit of the recommendations being made by your commission on Air Transportation Safety, to have a non-military representative of your office to assist with the families.

In reading a previous letter to you I'm alerted to the spit & vinegar that drives my soul pertaining to the issues surrounding Adam's death. In comparison this letter is so dry & matter of fact.

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The difference I feel regarding this incident is the matter of responsibility. AS a nation & a planet we are becoming much more aware of matters of responsibility, calling to account industries & individuals who are not acting accordingly. We expect responsible behavior from alcohol & tobacco industries, the food & drug industries, endless individual involvements.... the military industry is no different & need to properly account for their numerous avenues of wrong doing, deceptiveness, & negligent lack of safety.

On many occasions persons & groups have tried to discourage us from pursuing the military, a force so awesome that even you the Commander & Chief, are told to "obey". This is not a good sign. I know Adam agrees.

The system is in need of drastic updating, & scrupulous reevaluation.

I realize this very statement may put my life in a compromised situation. I wish I didn't have to trust the U.S.P.S. & your aides with my life but I would like to be able to trust you.

However, I do trust God & the blanket of Her power merely brushes your own. As for the military Her strength outweighs their wildest dreams. The military can't hurt me, though it may kill me, as it killed my brother, for I believe in Resurrection.

I pray that the military never again brings harm to my family or yours. I wish for them to comprehend the absurdity of their neglect of human life & find the true power they seek through respect & responsibility.

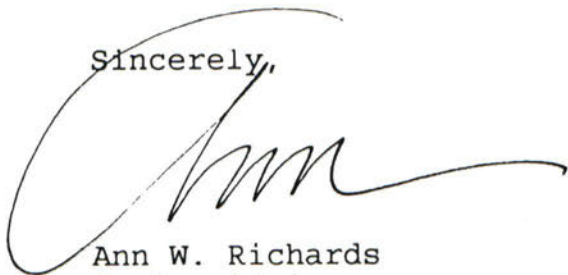

Dear Mr. Jones:

Being integrally involved with the creation of Metropolitan Emergency Medical Services (MEMS), I would like to bring to your attention the proposed regulatory changes which will devastate America's ambulance and emergency medical services systems, both urban and rural.

The Healthcare Finance Administration (HCFA) has proposed dramatic changes to the ambulance industry. The immediate and tragic result of these regulations will be to force all ambulance providers to go backwards a full generation. They will affect not just Medicare patients; but every man, woman, and child throughout the nation that depends on a pre-hospital emergency medical care system.

If such a sweeping policy change is to occur, it should come not from HCFA, but only from Congress, and only then after hearings, research, input and discussion. Therefore, I am respectfully requesting you to forward this information to your friend, President Clinton. Hopefully, he can take any necessary actions that will stop HCFA from imposing these onerous regulations on the EMS industry.
