Our 9-Second Message For Vice President Gore:

"We are pulling together a tightly focused package of climate change initiatives aimed at helping our state to become an international leader in clean energy technologies and energy efficiency. We're already leaders in aerospace and software. We want to help China take the clean energy path — we have the best trade relations with the Far East and our Governor - Gov. Locke - is a Chinese-American. If you could zip Gov. Locke a call, lend your support to the climate package, and perhaps invite him to join your delegation to Kyoto, it would be a tremendous help."

On September 23/24 we are hosting a summit for 20 to 25 allies to determine the package of climate stabilization measures and develop strategy. Participants include: renewable energy and efficiency business leaders, key state government and trade officials and public interest advocates.

Why This Is Good Politics:

- This is about global climate change as an *economic opportunity*.
- Gov. Locke could provide visible support for the Administration on climate from a Western Governor from a state with a thriving economy.
- Washington's aerospace and software expertise is transferable to cutting-edge solar and efficiency technologies.
- Washington has extensive trade ties with the People's Republic of China, a potentially enormous market for clean energy and efficiency technologies and services.
- Gov. Locke's family is from China, he is in China now doing business networking for the state, and Pacific Rim trade is a priority for him.

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Background: Request for White House Call to Governor Locke

TO: Vice President Gore and Staff

1) Washington is well-positioned to become an international leader in post-carbon energy policies and technologies.

- Washington has some of the leading renewable energy and energy efficiency firms in the world, including the world's largest manufacturer of inverters for solar systems (Trace Engineering) and a facility that produces 20% of the world's supply of silica crystals for solar PV manufacturing (Siemen's Solar).
- We have a long tradition of leadership in energy efficiency that helped us build a sizable commercial infrastructure for efficiency.
- We do not have especially large fossil fuel interests.
- We are very export-oriented and have uniquely favorable trade relationships with fast-growing Pacific Rim economies, especially China, where demand for energy technologies is strong.

2) Nothing would move this more quickly or powerfully in Washington than a call from the President or Vice-President to Governor Locke. The purpose:

- First, urge him to adopt an Executive Order (EO) responding to climate disruption (see next page).
- Second, consider inviting him to join the delegation to Kyoto, or to meet the President and/or Vice-President at Boeing Field on their way to Kyoto to have a signing ceremony for the EO.

3) As of now, this is not on Governor Locke's radar, but there is groundwork laid.

- The Governor's policy staff has been briefed on climate change by Ross Gelbspan and by the Department of Community, Trade and Economic Development (DCTED).
- The Director of DCTED, Tim Douglas, spoke very directly to the economic opportunities for Washington state at the "Business, Government, and Climate Change" conference.
- Since June, media coverage of climate change in the state has been excellent, the Atmosphere Alliance is releasing a 30 second TV PSA statewide, and there is a strong network of people active on the issue.
- An alliance of key people in state government, business, and the public interest community is organizing to forge support for a package of climate change-clean energy initiatives.

Governor Locke: An Executive Order on Global Climate Disruption

During the past year, intensive discussions and organizing on the climate change issue has proceeded in Washington state. Currently, a core group is convening a summit for 20 to 25 allies to define a package of climate stabilization measures and develop strategy to push it forward. Participants in the summit include: renewable energy and efficiency business leaders, key state government and trade officials, communications specialists and public interest advocates.

The explicit goal of the package will be to make Washington state an international leader in clean energy and energy efficiency technologies and services.

The package will include both administrative and legislative measures. *The administrative components could be enacted in an Executive Order by Governor Gary Locke.*

The Executive Order is good for Locke and the Clinton Administration because it:

- visibly demonstrates support from a western governor for the Administration's climate change efforts;
- is relatively easy to implement and not terribly threatening to fossil fuel interests;
- includes powerful connections to Locke's stated priorities;
- provides strong testimony for the proposition that good environmental policy and good economic policy converge;
- will garner immediate support from federal agencies, so that they will push from their end;
- makes a lasting and important contribution to our efforts to build a sustainable energy future and avert catastrophic climate disruption.

The elements of the Executive Order will be discussed at the September 23/24 summit, but could include a variety of elements. In the scenario below, 1) and 2) get the ball rolling now, while 3) and 4) give us a clear mandate to keep it rolling:

- 1) Washington adopts three federally-sponsored initiatives that the Department of Energy (DOE) and Environmental Protection Agency are already urging us to undertake:
 - 20,000 solar roofs, as our contribution to the Administration's Million Solar Roof campaign. This could begin with "Roof One" - the Governor's Mansion - as the Federal effort will reputedly begin with the White House.
 - Super Energy Service Performance Contracting - A DOE program that provides an umbrella contract to vastly simplify the process for public agencies to make energy efficiency investments. (This connects to the public facility energy challenge, below.)
 - Energy Star, a voluntary DOE program that promotes purchases of energy-efficient equipment.

These are easy to do, off the shelf, non-threatening to in-state interests, and strongly supported by federal agencies.

- 2) Public facilities energy challenge: Call on all state (or perhaps all public) facilities to reduce their energy consumption by 30 percent by the year 2010, in parallel with a federal executive order that does the same for federal facilities. The proceeds from energy savings could be split between enhancement to the participating agency's budget and deposits in the school construction fund. (Locke introduced this formula in order to get past the "use it or lose it" quality of state budgets.) This supports two Locke priorities: education and public sector efficiency.
- 3) An order to the Department of Community, Trade, and Economic Development to deliver recommendations by September 1998, on the best ways to attract, retain, and expand renewable energy and energy efficiency enterprises while expanding their domestic and foreign markets.
- 4) An order to the Departments of Transportation, General Administration, Ecology, Agriculture, and Community, Trade, and Economic Development to develop an inventory of the most cost-effective ways to reduce in-state carbon emissions by 15 percent by 2005.
