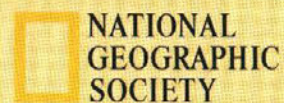


Centrally located in the heart of Washington, D.C., the National Geographic Society headquarters is within walking distance of the White House and other historic points of interest.

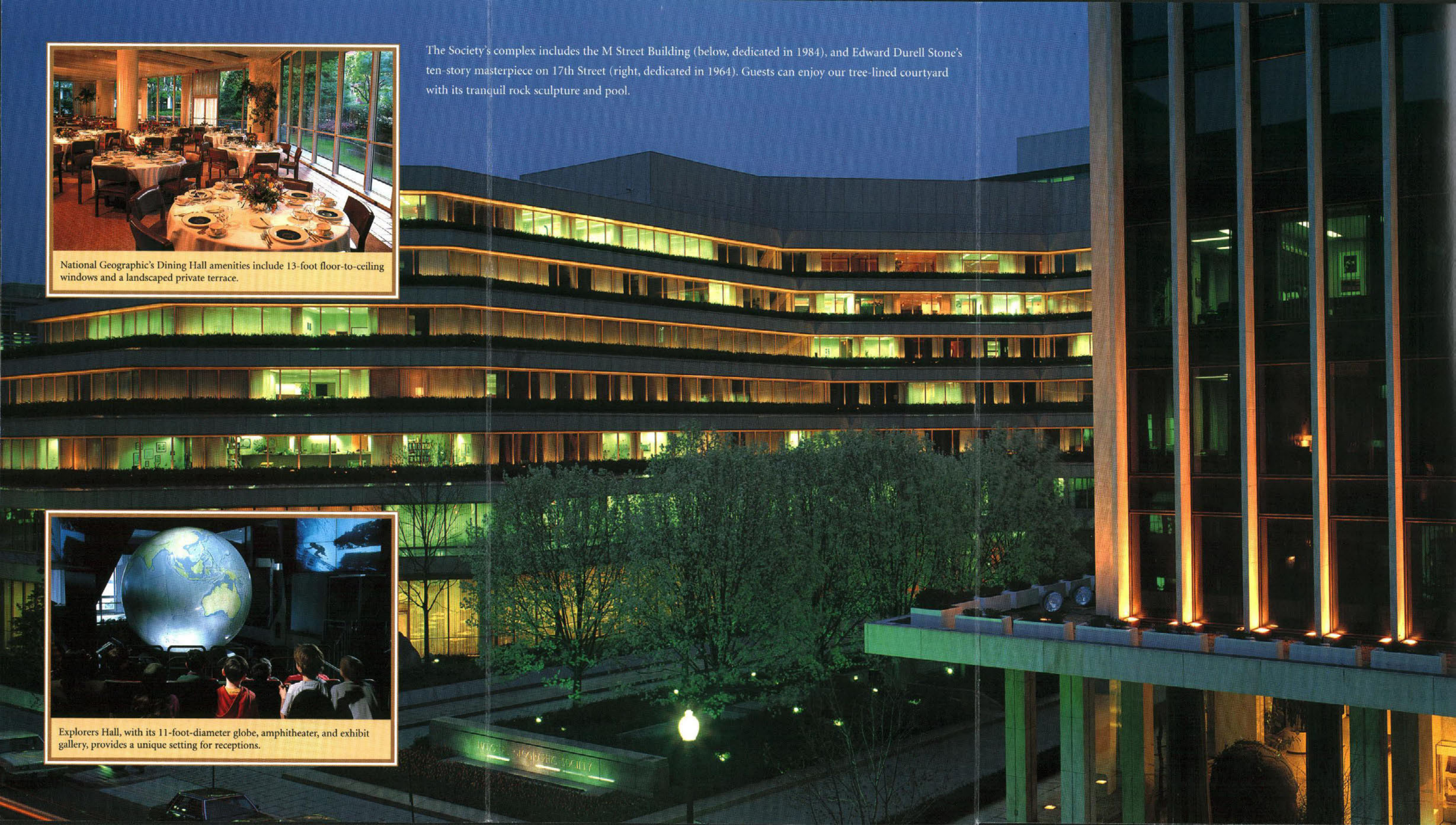


National Geographic's Dining Hall amenities include 13-foot floor-to-ceiling windows and a landscaped private terrace.

- President Clinton's speech outlining his new proposals on climate change will be on Wednesday, October 22 at 2:30 p.m. at the National Geographic Society. MEMORANDUM FOR LIST

SUBJECT: Roll out of Climate Change Announcement

This memo is intended as a checklist for Roll out of the President's announcement on climate change. It covers press, outside validators, outside notifications, Hill, Cabinet, diplomatic.

Press

The press plan includes the following:

- Briefing of White House reporters shortly after President's speech. By some appropriate mix (to be determined) of Gene, Katie, Dan, Jim, Todd, Janet, Larry.
- Round table briefing of environmental reporters in Roosevelt Room same day as announcement, following briefing of White House reporters. Appropriate group of briefers, to be determined.
- Briefing of major pundits/talking heads. Probably Thursday. Appropriate group of briefers, to be determined.
- Ed boards of national press. Same day calls, probably by Gene, Katie, Dan, Todd.
- Regional ed boards. Cabinet calls Thursday. Kris Balderston and Natalie Wymer to work up list of assignments.
- Other -- e.g., Sunday Shows, etc. To be determined.

Outside Validators

Calls have been or are being made to [around 20] business people, scientists, economists and foreign policy thinkers to line them up tentatively (a) to take press calls Wednesday, and (b) to do op-eds. Bill Antholis is managing this. Need to check on how many people we have reached and whether we need to expand list.

Calls will need to go out to all the people we have lined up on Wednesday morning, before the President's speech, to brief these people on the policy. Our paper (fact sheets, etc.) will be faxed to them at point it is made available to press. Bill and I will divide calls up among the policy group.

Notification calls

Dirk Forrister and Shelley Fidler are preparing a list of people who we will need to call to give a heads up on the President's announcement. Most of these calls will be quite brief, informing the people that the President is going to make his climate change announcement and getting fax information for people who want to get the press packet. Those calls can be made Tuesday evening or Wednesday morning. Dirk and Shelley should make initial call assignments.

There is a subset of these calls where we will need to give people a more substantive briefing. This should be done for people who, though not our validators, are obviously important to us and will be likely to be called for comment. Example: AFL-CIO. These calls will need to be made Wednesday morning, in same time frame as calls to our validators. Bill and I will divide these up among policy group.

Hill

Lucia Wyman and Dan Tate are working on three tiers of Members in the House and Senate: (1) those who are potentially willing to speak on the floor in support of the President's plan; (2) those potentially willing to put out written statements in support of the President's plan; (3) those who we will need to notify before the President's announcement.

For those willing to go to the floor, we are exploring the possibility of a breakfast on Wednesday morning with the President and/or Vice President and Erskine Bowles to brief them. For those potentially willing to put out written statements, we will need calls made Wednesday morning before the speech. These can probably be heads up calls, with our paper to follow. In addition, we could schedule a short briefing for staff of these Members Wednesday after the speech. Dirk could handle this.

Notification calls on Wednesday morning -- to leadership, and those in the Senate Observer Group who aren't in one of the first two categories above could be made by White House (Dan and Lucia should work with Dirk to make initial assignments); to chairmen/ranking members of relevant committees should be made by Cabinet. Kris Balderston should work with Dan and Lucia on Cabinet assignments.

Cabinet

We should have a short Cabinet briefing Wednesday morning -- I'd suggest around 8:30 am -- to walk Cabinet through plan and give them fact sheets, talking points and selected Q&A. Meeting should last no more than 30 minutes, because we won't have time for more than that.

Diplomatic

We need to coordinate with State about necessary notifications to foreign governments such as Japanese, and any paper that should go to our embassies, etc. I understand that David Sandalow is working on this.

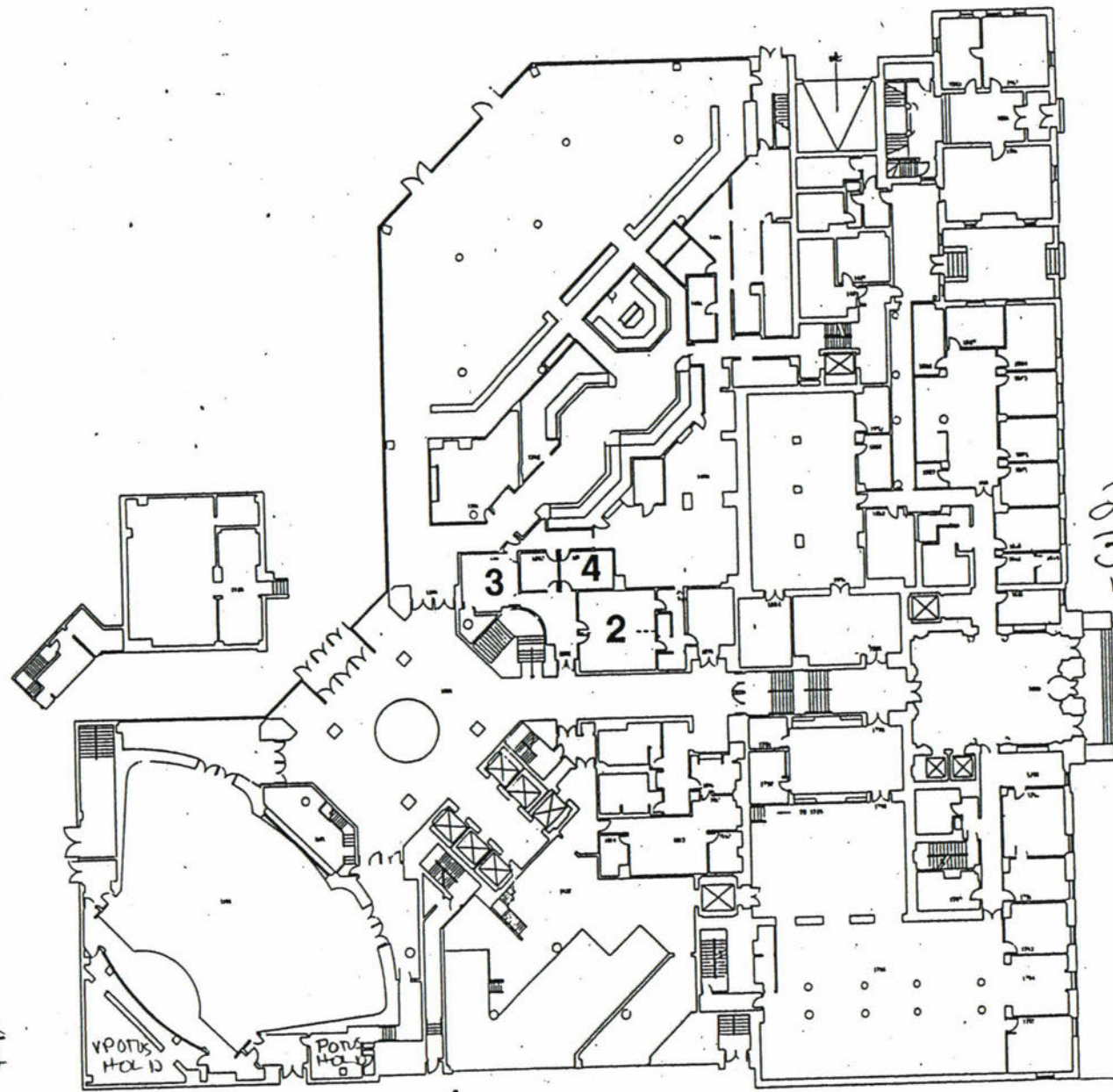

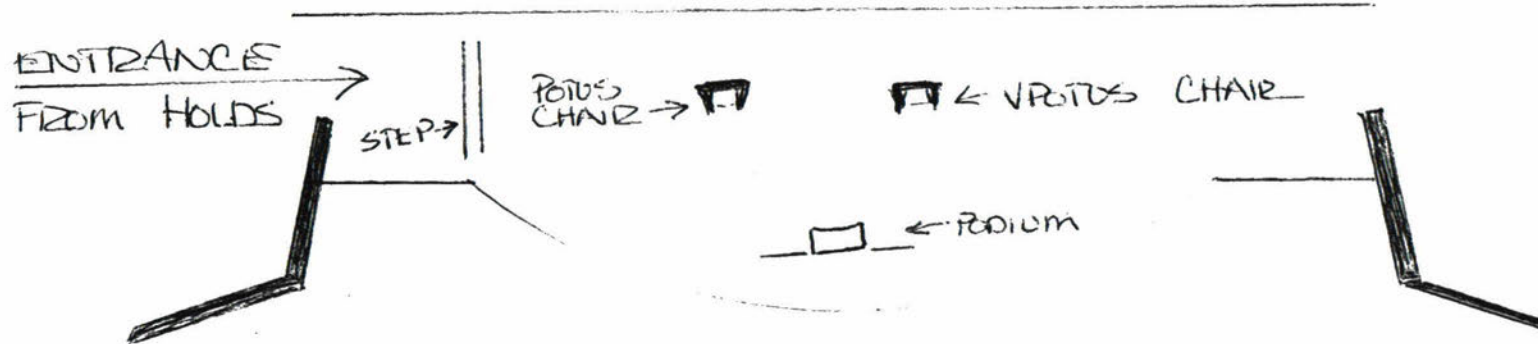

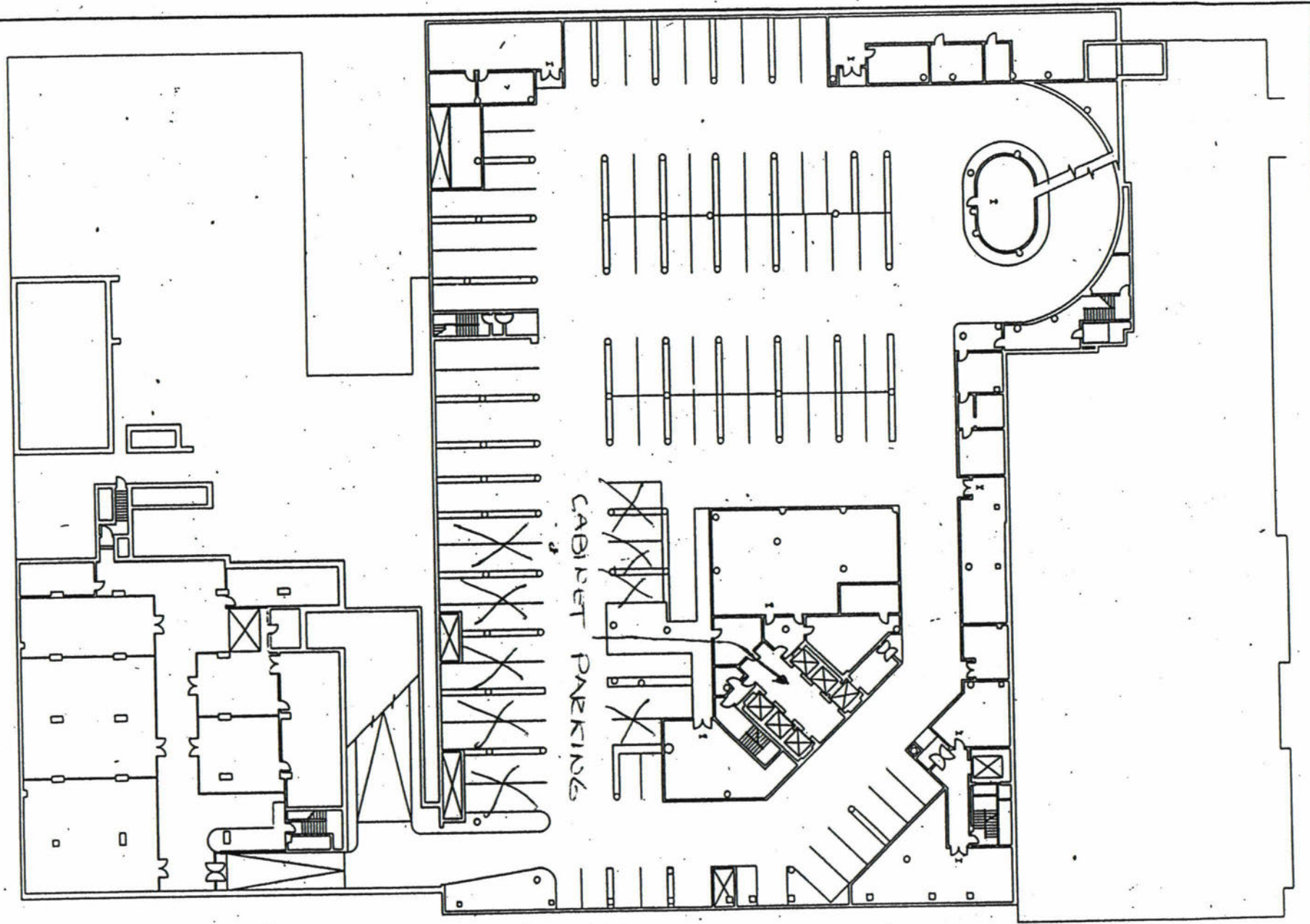

REG MURPHY

Reg Murphy, a distinguished veteran newspaper reporter, editor and publisher, became the National Geographic Society's 15th president and chief executive officer May 1, 1996. He succeeded Gilbert M. Grosvenor, who retired. Grosvenor is a member of the family that had headed the Society for five generations.

Murphy joined the National Geographic staff in 1993 as executive vice president. In that position, second to Grosvenor's, he managed the Society's financial operations, long-range planning, administration, electronic publishing, information and computer systems and its human resources. He negotiated a joint operating agreement with a Japanese publishing company to produce the first foreign-language edition of *National Geographic*. The Japanese magazine debuted in April 1995.

As president, Murphy also oversees the Society's newest ventures, including its first taxable subsidiaries and its first online site on the World Wide Web.

Before coming to the Geographic, Murphy was publisher of the Baltimore Sun from 1981 to 1992. He was editor and publisher of the San Francisco Examiner from 1975 to 1981 and editor of the Atlanta Constitution from 1968 to 1975. He started at the Constitution as political editor in 1961. A native Georgian, Murphy began his newspaper career in 1955 as a sports writer at the Macon (Ga.) Telegraph and News. He was later the paper's Atlanta bureau chief.

Murphy is still active in the Baltimore community and in educational endeavors. He served as chairman of the board of Baltimore Reads, Inc., which promotes literacy in Baltimore. He is a member of the Board of Visitors at the University of Maryland and a trustee of Mercer University in Macon, GA. He is former chairman of the Board of Trustees of Loyola College in Maryland and of the Board of Visitors of the University of Maryland's College of Journalism.

A serious golfer, Murphy is past president of the United States Golf Association. He has lectured before numerous professional and civic groups as well as before students on more than 200 college campuses.

Born Jan. 7, 1934, in Hoschton, Ga., Murphy attended Mercer University. He received a Nieman Fellowship to Harvard University in 1959. He holds honorary doctorates from Mercer University, Utah State University, the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, Towson State University and Loyola College.
