REQUEST: For the President to meet with Nobel Laureates on Climate Change

PURPOSE: To discuss the economic, scientific and technology issues related to possible actions on climate change. This meeting would demonstrate the President's interest and concern about this issue, would be a useful background to any G-7 discussion on climate, and could serve as a backdrop for a major policy statement in the Rose Garden of U.S. policy priorities.

BACKGROUND: In February, 2,400 economists including 8 Nobel prize winners endorsed a statement supporting action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and stating that policies exist where the benefits outweigh the costs and that may in fact improve US productivity in the long run. The statement specifically endorsed market-based approaches including the emissions trading model the US has proposed internationally. A similar statement is currently circulating among the scientific community. The most definitive published report on the science of climate change was issued at the end of 1995 by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. This assessment report discussed the many uncertainties remaining in our understanding of climate change, but also the potential of a range of actions to mitigate risks.

ATTENDEES: Possible attendees could include Nobel Laureates Kenneth Arrow and Robert Solow. Other distinguished economists to consider include Paul Krugman, William Nordhaus and Dale Jorgenson. Joe Stiglitz followed this issue closely when he was here and is also a possibility. Nobel scientists that could be invited include Sherry Rowland, Mario Molina and Henry Kendall. Other distinguished scientists, with specific expertise in climate, that could be invited include: Wallace Broecker, George Woodwell, Robert Watson and Eric Chavion. A possible technology expert that could be invited is

Harvard's John Holgren, chair of PCAST.

From within the Administration, invitees would include Katie McGinty, Jack Gibbons, Gene Sperling, Dan Tarullo, Robert Rubin, Janet Yellin and Madeline Albright.

SCIENTISTS' STATEMENT GLOBAL CLIMATIC DISRUPTION JUNE 18, 1997

We are scientists who are familiar with the causes and effects of climatic change as summarized recently by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC). We endorse those reports and observe that the further accumulation of greenhouse gases commits the earth irreversibly to further global climatic change and consequent ecological, economic and social disruption. The risks associated with such changes justify preventive action through reductions in emissions of greenhouse gases. In ratifying the Framework Convention on Climate Change, the United States agreed in principle to reduce its emissions. It is time for the United States, as the largest emitter of greenhouse gases, to fulfill this commitment and demonstrate leadership in a global effort.

Human-induced global climatic change is under way. The IPCC concluded that global mean surface air temperature has increased by between about 0.5 and 1.1 degrees Fahrenheit in the last 100 years and anticipates a further continuing rise of 1.8 to 6.3 degrees Fahrenheit during the next century. Sea-level has risen on average 4-10 inches during the past 100 years and is expected to rise another 6 inches to 3 feet by 2100. Global warming from the increase in heat-trapping gases in the atmosphere causes an amplified hydrological cycle resulting in increased precipitation and flooding in some regions and more severe aridity in other areas. The IPCC concluded that "The balance of evidence suggests a discernible human influence on global climate." The warming is expected to expand the geographical ranges of malaria and dengue fever and to open large new areas to other human diseases and plant and animal pests. Effects of the disruption of climate are sufficiently complicated that it is appropriate to assume there will be effects not now anticipated.

Our familiarity with the scale, severity, and costs to human welfare of the disruptions that the climatic changes threaten leads us to introduce this note of urgency and to call for early domestic action to reduce U.S. emissions via the most cost-effective means. We encourage other nations to join in similar actions with the purpose of producing a substantial and progressive global reduction in greenhouse gas emissions beginning immediately. We call attention to the fact that there are financial as well as environmental advantages to reducing emissions. More than 2000 economists recently observed that there are many potential policies to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions for which total benefits outweigh the total costs.

The Framework Convention on Climate Change, ratified by the United States and more than 165 other nations, calls for stabilization of greenhouse gas concentrations in the atmosphere at levels that will protect human interests and nature. The Parties to the Convention will meet in December, 1997, in Kyoto, Japan to prepare a protocol implementing the convention. We urge that the United States enter that meeting with a clear national plan to limit emissions, and a recommendation as to how the U.S. will assist other nations in significant steps toward achieving the joint purpose of stabilization.

ECONOMISTS' STATEMENT ON CLIMATE CHANGE

*Endorsed by Over 2000 Economists
including six Nobel Laureates*

I. The review conducted by a distinguished international panel of scientists under the auspices of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change has determined that "the balance of evidence suggests a discernible human influence on global climate." As economists, we believe that global climate change carries with it significant environmental, economic, social, and geopolitical risks, and that preventive steps are justified.

II. Economic studies have found that there are many potential policies to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions for which the total benefits outweigh the total costs. For the United States in particular, sound economic analysis shows that there are policy options that would slow climate change without harming American living standards, and these measures may in fact improve U.S. productivity in the longer run.

III. The most efficient approach to slowing climate change is through market-based policies. In order for the world to achieve its climatic objectives at minimum cost, a cooperative approach among nations is required—such as an international emissions trading agreement. The United States and other nations can most efficiently implement their climate policies through market mechanisms, such as carbon taxes or the auction of emissions permits. The revenues generated from such policies can effectively be used to reduce the deficit or to lower existing taxes.

John Browne, Group Chief Executive of British Petroleum:

May 19, 1997 – Stanford University

“There’s a lot of noise in the data. It is hard to isolate cause and effect. But there is now an effective consensus among the world’s leading scientists and serious and well informed people outside the scientific community that there is a discernible human influence on the climate, and a link between the concentration of carbon dioxide and the increase in temperature . . .”

“The time to consider the policy dimensions of climate change is not when the link between greenhouse gases and climate change is conclusively proven . . . but when the possibility cannot be discounted and is taken seriously by the society of which we are part. We in BP have reached that point.”

“We’ve been looking at alternative energies for a long time, and our conclusion is that one source which is likely to make a significant contribution is solar power.”

24th Meeting with Nobels

August

There are several days in August when the VP is in DC that present opportunities to schedule a climate related event/meeting. These dates are:

1st, 4th, 6th, 8th, 13th, 14th.

Suggested events for the VP in August include:

- The VP convene the diplomatic corps here in Washington to discuss U.S. position on global climate change.
- He visit the Chicago Board of Trade to discuss the benefits of trading in meeting climate change objectives.
- Consider using the meeting on the fifth with labor leaders as counter scheduling -- to engage them on our desire to have their support on this issue.
- Visit Glacier National Park in Montana on August 16th to focus on the already visible effects of climate change. (This could coincide with the 125th anniversary of Yellowstone National Park).
- Tour a solar plant in Norfolk VA owned by Enron (helpful on climate) and Amoco (not currently supportive) to highlight the role of technologies in addressing the climate change issue.

September

Again, there are plenty of days when the VP is scheduled to be here that could be used for climate. They are:

2nd, 3rd, 4th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 15th, 17th

Possible events include:

- VP teach a science class during back to school week in either Boston or New

Hampshire (trip currently planned for the 5th)

- Dedication of Dartmouth Medical School - if the VP does this, it would be an opportunity to talk about infectious diseases and the link to climate change.
- Possible travel to Delaware - VP could attend groundbreaking for photovoltaics manufacturing plant in Newark, DE.-- a joint venture with Corning Glass.
- Cabinet members will be hosting regional climate change conferences across the country -- the VP could attend one or more of these. We suggest he do one in the midwest and combine it with a visit to an environmental technology manufacturing facility or an automobile manufacturing facility (counter scheduling). We recommend Ohio or Michigan. This would be a good opportunity to discuss our intention to support policy that will keep or create jobs in this country.
- As he is scheduled to be in Tennessee on the 27th, the VP could visit Oak Ridge Laboratory to highlight their leadership as the repository for world-wide CO2 data -- to talk about the role for science and research to address climate change.
- VP could travel to NY to address a trade association (such as oil) or a financial institution (brokerage firm or investment banking company) to discuss issues of competitiveness.
- The VP has been invited to address the BRT on the 12th. This is a great opportunity for him to address industry concerns on this issue.
- The VP should host a dinner at NAVOBS with members of Congress.

BACKGROUND: This event would be part of a series of events to raise public profile on the climate change issue. Scientists believe that one of the more severe consequences of global warming is a rise in sea level. If we fail to act, scientists expect that our seas will rise one to three feet, and thousands of square miles in the United States, including Rhode Island, Florida, Louisiana and other coastal areas will be flooded.

The event would take place at Block Island, RI, a location that would be very adversely affected by a significant rise in sea level. Marshes and wetlands would be drastically reduced, destroying nurseries for fish. The scenic cliffs on the island would suffer accelerated erosion and beaches would disappear.

LOCATION: We are looking at sites on Block Island, RI. The island's low elevation makes it extremely vulnerable to a rise in sea level. Currently we have two options for an event site (please note that these sites have not been fully checked out):

Southeast Lighthouse. This historic lighthouse is located on Moheegan Bluff on the island, and recently had to be moved back from the bluffs that it sits on because the bluffs were eroding, threatening to topple the lighthouse.

Great Salt Pond. Part of this pond is a wildlife refuge that would presumably be flooded if the sea were to rise, destroying a scenic haven for wildlife, waterfowl and fish. There is a also similar site at another wildlife refuge on the island.
