Subject: Message Events for July, August, and September

The following is a list of potential Presidential events for the next several months. We have submitted scheduling requests for several of the events and will be sending in requests for the remainder of the events soon.

Climate Change Events

International negotiations on climate change are set to conclude in December. During the next several months, the President will need to make important and far-reaching decisions on this issue. The following is a series of meetings and events that are part of an overall strategy to address climate change as we head into December's treaty negotiations.

Meeting with Nobel Laureates

(July/ August)

The President and Vice President meet with a group of preeminent economists and scientists to discuss climate change. Recently 2,400 economists -- including 8 Nobel prize winners -- signed a statement agreeing that the benefits of action on climate change outweigh the costs and that in fact these measures may *improve* U.S. productivity. A similar statement has just been signed by over 2,400 scientists. As we move toward a global treaty on climate change by the end of the year, our opponents will claim (a) that it will ruin the economy and (b) that scientists cannot even say the problem we seek to address is real. A meeting would help preempt those attacks. *Status: scheduling request is pending.*

Meeting with religious leaders

(July/August)

The religious community has been tremendously outspoken about protecting public health and the environment. Climate change is a major priority for many of these leaders. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

Meeting with the Green Group

(July/August)

A meeting with the environmental community will give the President the opportunity to discuss upcoming issues in the 105th Congress in addition to discussing climate change issues. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

Chicago Board of Trade

(July 17)

This Administration will advocate innovative policies that will encourage flexibility and use market mechanisms to reduce pollutants. An event at the Chicago Board of Trade's emissions trading center would highlight these activities and would be very attractive to the business community. The President can do this event when he is in Chicago in July. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

Dedication of BP solar facility

(July/August)

In August British Petroleum (BP) will be opening a new, state of the art solar panel manufacturing facility in California. BP's CEO John Browne has recently become an advocate on climate change, and has announced that BP will take actions to reduce the amount of greenhouse gases that the company produces. The opening of the solar facility is one of the first of these initiatives. We are checking on whether this event could be held during the President's trip to California on July 27. *Status: we will be submitting a request.*

Sea level rise event

(July/August)

The President meets with scientists and tours the Outer Banks of North Carolina, an area vulnerable to sea level rise and hurricanes. Climate change models predict that an increase in the earth's temperature will cause a rise in sea level and increased storm activity. This event could be held in other lowlying areas such as Florida or Louisiana. *Status: we will be submitting a request.*

National Park Event

(August/September)

A new report shows that America's national parks and wildlife refuges are already beginning to show signs of climate change. Noticeable effects of global warming in Americas' parks include the melting of glaciers in Montana's Glacier National Park, inundation of wetlands in Maryland's Blackwater National Refuge, and changes in alpine flower meadows in Washington's Mt. Rainier National Park. If climate change continues to accelerate, our children and future generations could be robbed of part of their National Park experience. The summer is the perfect time for an event in a national park, and many of these locations would provide tangible visuals on climate change. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

Climate Change Conference

(September/ October)

As part of the outreach strategy and process, the series of meetings and events on climate change will culminate with a White House conference on climate change. This conference, to be held in Washington, will be the centerpiece of several climate change conferences to be held around the country chaired by Cabinet members and the Vice President. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

Other Events:

Clean Air Event

(July 27)

The President's trip to Los Angeles presents the perfect opportunity to tout the tough clean air standards that he approved yesterday. The Administration faces stiff opposition to these new rules on the Hill and will need to rally public support. An event in LA, with its strict smog regulations, will give the President an opportunity to highlight how southern California's economy has boomed despite its strict air regulations. Griffith Observatory, with its panoramic views of smog-covered LA, would provide good visuals for an event. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

Reinventing the US Forest Service

(July/August)

The USDA Forest Service, under the leadership of the new Chief, is in the process of developing a package of initiatives that will significantly change the direction of forest management in the U.S. as we head into the 21st century. We expect the action items to encompass new policy direction on roadless areas, elimination of perverse incentives that reward unsustainable logging, revision of current forest planning regulations, and possible incentives for good forest management on private lands. These are important actions that will put this Administration's stamp on forest management. This event could be held in any of the country's national forests. *Status: we will be submitting a scheduling request.*

125th Anniversary of Yellowstone

(August 25)

August marks the 125th anniversary of Yellowstone -- the world's first national park. The National Park Service is planning the principal anniversary-year event for August 25 at the Old Faithful geyser. This is a good opportunity to highlight the President's sound stewardship of the country's natural heritage as well as to celebrate the first anniversary of the agreement the President signed last summer to protect Yellowstone from the notorious New World gold mine. *Status: scheduling request is pending.*

American Heritage Rivers

(September 9, 10, or 11)

By September, the American Heritage Rivers program will be ready to be launched. The President will announce the details of the American Heritage Rivers program and will challenge communities across the country to begin nominating outstanding stretches of river for American Heritage River designation. We continue to suggest Mt. Vernon as the ideal site for this event. *Status: scheduling request is pending.*

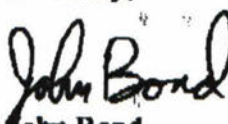
Dear Tom:

Mr. Porter and Mr. Gilchrest sent an invitation to the President to speak by video link to the GLOBE EU climate change conference to be held October 16-17 (next Thursday and Friday). As we are now one week away and have not received a response, I am assuming the invitation will not be accepted.

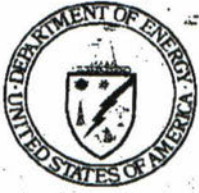

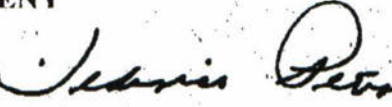

MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT**FROM:**Federico Peña **SUBJECT:****Invitation to Announce 305,000 Roofs Toward your Million Solar Roofs Initiative**

I. **ACTION-FORCING EVENT:** Since your announcement of the Million Solar Roofs Initiative in June, the Department of Energy has received initial commitments and expressions of interest of 305,000 solar rooftops. The major contributors are the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (100,000), the New England Electric System (100,000), the Sacramento Municipal Utility District in California (25,000), State of Maryland (20,000), County of Hawaii and Hawaii Electric (20,000), the Washington Solar Energy Industrial Association/Washington State Energy Program (20,000) and the Federal Government (20,000). These commitments demonstrate strong support for the Initiative and should be highlighted and publicized. Your announcement of the commitments would give the early partners much deserved credit for helping achieve your goal of one million solar rooftops and will demonstrate how Americans are rising to the challenge of addressing global climate change. Your presence would also be invaluable in encouraging other potential Initiative partners. Possible locations for the announcement include:

- Maryland - Dedication of new solar installation at Montgomery College in Germantown; or the Solarex manufacturing plant in Frederick with backdrop of rooftop solar panels.
- Los Angeles, CA - Event with Los Angeles Department of Water & Power.
- Sacramento, CA - Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) with backdrop of rooftop solar installation on a home, school, church or at the airport.
- Hawaii - Manaloa Naval Base with backdrop of existing solar on base housing.
- New England Area - New England Electric System (NEES) event in Massachusetts (backdrop of school in Boston with rooftop panel), Rhode Island, or New Hampshire.
- Washington State - Event with Governor Gary Locke - dedication of photovoltaic panel on the Governor's mansion.
- White House - representatives of business and government. DOE has a solar panel available if you would like to make the White House roof a part of the initiative.

II. **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:** During your speech before the United Nations Session on Environment and Development in June, you announced the Administration's goal of working with businesses and communities to install solar panels on 1 million roofs around our Nation by 2010. These commitments reflect the partnerships among communities, utilities, states, and businesses that will make this Initiative successful.

III. RECOMMENDATION: That you announce progress on the Million Roofs Initiative prior to the Kyoto climate change meeting at an appropriate location.

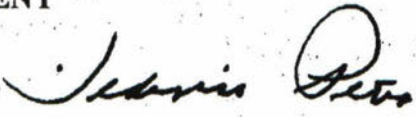

SUBJECT: An Invitation to Announce the National Laboratory Study:
"Technology Opportunities to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions"

- I. ACTION-FORCING EVENT:** Your announcement of a study by eleven National Laboratory directors of technologies for reducing greenhouse gas emissions provides a timely opportunity to focus public attention on the technology component of the Administration's climate change position.
- II. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:** The National Laboratory study will serve as a component of our national climate change technology strategy. The study establishes that there are numerous advanced technologies whose development can contribute to reducing greenhouse gas emissions. It describes nearly 50 technology pathways that have significant potential to reduce greenhouse gas emissions while sustaining economic growth. Three areas are addressed: energy efficiency, clean energy, and carbon sequestration.

One opportunity to build public support is through a media event at the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) during your Colorado visit on November 22. You could: a) announce the study and b) receive the support of the National Laboratory directors and industry CEOs for your climate change strategy and the U.S. position at Kyoto.

NREL, as the Nation's leading laboratory on renewable energy R&D, provides the perfect visual backdrop for you to highlight the role of clean energy technologies in reducing greenhouse gas emissions. (Vice President Gore used NREL as the site for his announcement of the Administration's Sustainable Technology initiative in 1994.)

III. RECOMMENDATION:

Hold Presidential media event to:

- Announce the DOE National Laboratory study, *Technology Opportunities to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions*; and
- Help build public support for the U.S. position at Kyoto by highlighting at NREL the kind of clean energy technologies recommended by the National Lab Study.

Date:

November 22, 1997 (to coincide with your visit to Colorado).

Location:

National Renewable Energy Laboratory, Golden, CO.

Program:

Prior to your arrival, a technology roundtable would be conducted with the National Laboratory directors, industry CEOs, and the media to discuss opportunities for deploying clean energy technologies highlighted in the study.

Your visit to NREL:

- A stage would be set with displays of clean energy technologies highlighted by the National Laboratory study;
- You would review the technology displays and take a brief tour of the Solar Energy Research Facility;
- You would announce the National Laboratory study and make brief remarks to an audience of the National Laboratory directors, industry CEOs, and the media.

Media:

There will be national media coverage. A tour of the Solar Energy Research Facility would be offered to media representatives.
