Dear Friend of Small Business,

It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to The 1995 White House Conference on Small Business. For many of you, this Conference marks the culmination of many months of service to your country. I appreciate your important contributions.

Since 1992, our economy has created ^{more than} ~~nearly~~ six million jobs, and ^{industries dominated by} ~~small businesses~~ ^{dominated industries} have been responsible for more than two-thirds of these new jobs.
