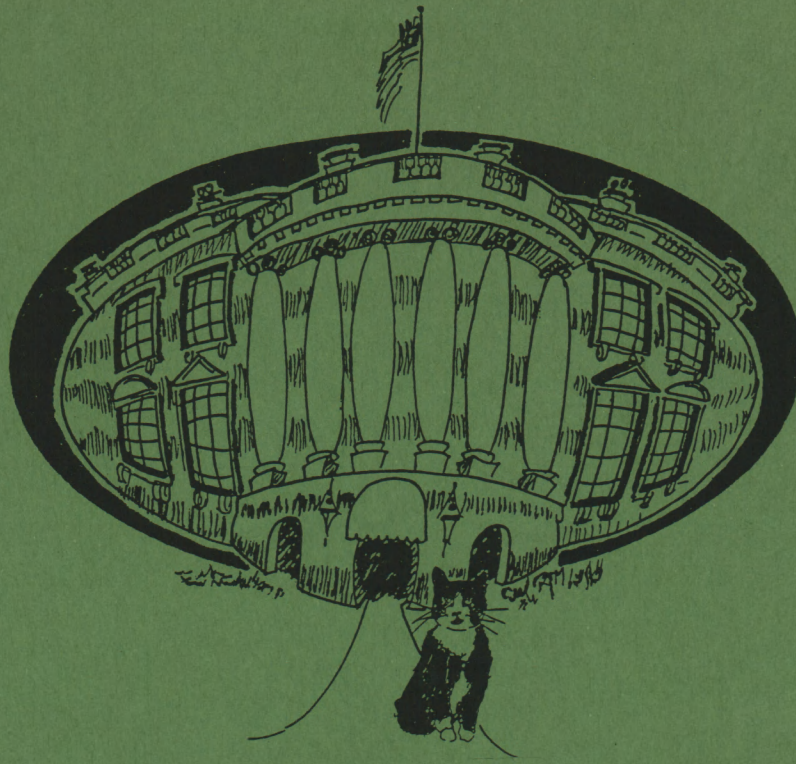

NEC BRIEFING PAPER ON COPYRIGHT TERM EXTENSION

ISSUE

Whether the Administration should support the twenty year copyright term extension proposed in H.R. 989.

BACKGROUND

- Under U.S. copyright law, the length of the copyright term is either from the time the work was created until fifty years after the author's death or, where the length of copyright protection is not measured by the author's life, 75 years from first publication or 100 years from creation, whichever is shorter.
- The European Union (EU) passed a directive that, *inter alia*, requires each EU Member State to provide copyright protection for a term of life plus seventy years by July 1, 1995. A provision in the EU Directive explicitly requires each Member State to implement "the rule of the shorter term," which prohibits any EU Member State from protecting a work originating outside the EU for the entire life plus seventy year term unless the country the work originated in also provides for a term of life plus seventy years. Thus, U.S. copyright owners will only be protected for a term of life plus fifty years in the EU, while their EU counterparts will be protected for a term of life plus seventy years in the EU unless the U.S. copyright term is extended to life plus seventy years.
- H.R. 989 proposes to extend the term of copyright protection in all copyrighted works that have not fallen into the public domain by twenty years in an effort to conform U.S. copyright law with the copyright laws of the European Union Member States. Thus, if H.R. 989 is enacted the length of the copyright term would be either from the time the work was created until seventy years after the author's death or, where the length of copyright protection is not measured by the author's life, 95 years from first publication or 120 years from creation, whichever is shorter.

ANALYSIS

Constitutional Considerations

- The purpose of the U.S. Constitution's copyright clause is to promote the public welfare by giving authors the incentive to create new works. The current life plus fifty year term provides authors with sufficient incentives to create new works. An additional twenty years of copyright protection will not increase the number of works created.

- Extending copyright protection by twenty years prevents copyrighted works from falling into the public domain for an additional twenty years. Since quality copies of public domain works are often not available and not much cheaper than copyrighted works, it is not clear how much the public stands to lose by extending copyright protection for twenty years.

Economic Considerations

- The primary reason for changing the copyright term by twenty years would be to bring U.S. law into conformity with that of the European Union. If the United States extends the copyright term to life plus seventy years the EU would be forced to protect U.S. works for the life plus seventy year term. This would benefit the copyright owners of many U.S. works. However, for many other U.S. works, such as sound recordings and most computer software, the copyright owner will get the benefit of the additional twenty years in the EU regardless of whether the U.S. copyright term is increased because the term of protection in the United States for these works is already greater than the EU grants under the Directive.
- Because the United States is a net exporter of intellectual property products and increasing the term of copyright protection in the United States would also have the effect of extending copyright protection for U.S. intellectual property products in the EU, a copyright term extension might increase the trade balance of the United States. However, since most of the positive trade balance of intellectual property products comes from contemporary works and older works would be the first to benefit from any term extension, it is not so clear that an extension of the copyright term would increase the trade balance of the United States in the immediate future.
- In determining whether an increase in the U.S. copyright term would increase the U.S. trade balance one must also consider the effect on the trade balance caused by the United States protecting all foreign works for an additional twenty years. If the term extension is going to further increase the U.S. trade balance, the money earned by U.S. copyright owners by exploiting their works for an additional twenty years in the EU must outweigh the money earned by all foreign copyright owners exploiting their works in the United States for an additional twenty years.

Policy Considerations

- The purpose of H.R. 989 is to harmonize U.S. law with the laws of the EU Member States. The increase in copyright term proposed by H.R. 989, however, would not harmonize U.S. law with EU law because there would still be many areas where the EU term of protection would be incompatible with the EU term of protection. In fact, the extension proposed in H.R. 989 for certain works, such as sound recordings and computer software, would actually increase the differences in the term of protection between the United States and the EU.

- The U.S. copyright industry contributed approximately \$40 billion in foreign sales to the U.S. economy. Several U.S. industries strongly support the bill, including the Motion Picture Industry and the Music Publishers.

POTENTIAL ADMINISTRATION POSITIONS

- The Administration could oppose the twenty year copyright term extension proposed in H.R. 989.
- The Administration could support the twenty year copyright term extension proposed in H.R. 989 as a *quid pro quo* for proponents of H.R. 989 agreeing to support performance rights legislation or support a mechanism for funding the National Endowment of the Arts.
- The Administration could not oppose the twenty year copyright term extension proposed in H.R. 989.

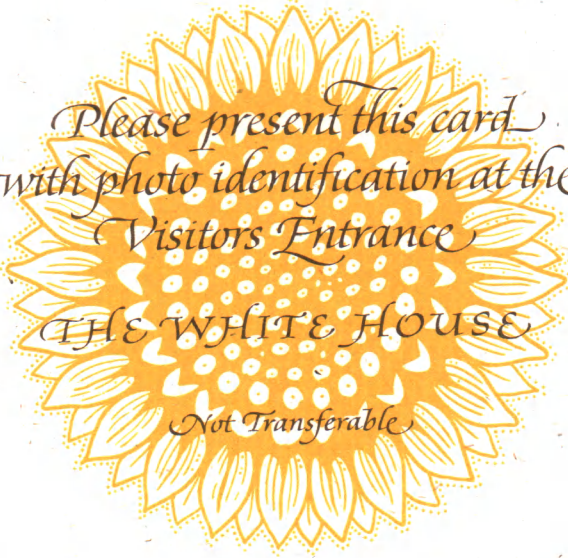
