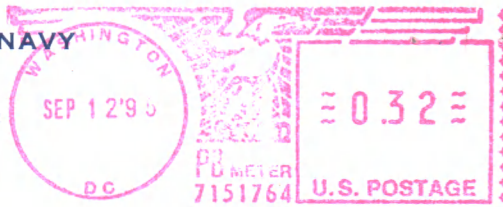

Dear Mr. Stern:

The *Yale Law and Policy Review* and *Yale Journal on Regulation* will be holding a symposium on March 2 to 3, 1996, at Yale Law School entitled, "Prospects for a New Federalism: Jurisdictional Competition and Competence." We are writing you to invite your participation in or attendance at this event.

The symposium will explore the policy and legal ramifications of today's devolutionary politics. We plan to bring legal scholars together with policymakers to analyze this new politics and its effects on law and policy in the United States. Separate panels will address constitutional issues, as well as general theoretical issues relating to jurisdictional competition and competence. In addition, panels will be convened around a number of policy areas, including: environmental regulation, economic development and taxation, health care, corporate law, torts, insurance and banking, welfare, education, and employment. While domestic policy will be the primary focus, we hope to include comparative and international analyses as well.

Panelists should address one or several of the following questions in their chosen policy area:

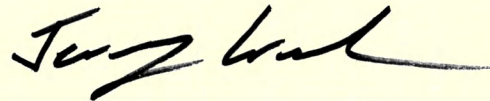
- What exactly motivates the current architects of devolution? Are their efforts based on political expediency or firmer theoretical foundations?
- Will devolution succeed? How will it shape policy in different areas?
- Will there be races to the top, to the bottom, or to somewhere else?

- What do states do better than the federal government, and vice versa? Which areas are most appropriate for devolution and why?
- How is the current constitutional framework of federalism changing? How should it change?

We have asked all interested parties to submit draft papers or short proposals of at least five pages by November 15. Panelists and participants will be selected on the basis of these submissions, and should plan to have final paper drafts completed by February 1, 1996. Selected papers will be published in a joint issue of the *Yale Law and Policy Review* and *Yale Journal on Regulation* in May 1996.

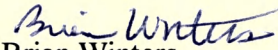

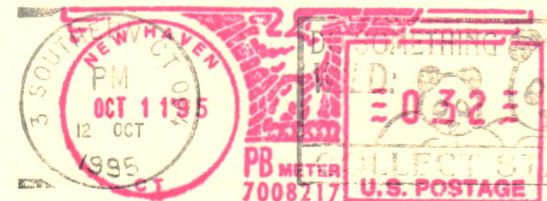

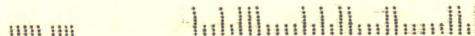
