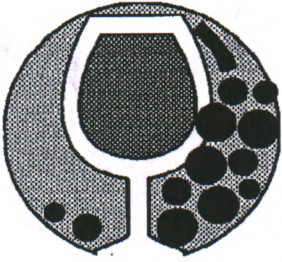

Dear Mr. Stern:

I am writing as Chair of Proskauer's Entertainment, Media and Information Technology (EMIT) Group to invite you to a private briefing on the legal issues implicated by doing business on the Internet.

Virtually every business is or will be doing business on the Internet, and should be aware of the existing and emerging legal rules which will govern. At Proskauer, we are deeply involved with this area of the law. - * What are the protections available to owners of materials on the Internet?
- * What rights do you need to obtain to create a Web site and how do you get them?

The Internet and the Workplace

- * How far can an employer go in regulating employee use of the Internet?
- * What privacy rights do employees have?
- * What liability does an employer have from employee use of the Internet?
- * How are the laws prohibiting sexual harassment implicated by employee use of the Internet?

Conducting an On-line Business

- * What exposure does an operator of an Internet or on-line service have for libel and copyright infringement?
- * What happens when law enforcement officials demand access to information?

Joining us at each of the briefing sessions will be senior practitioners from our Intellectual Property, Corporate, Litigation and Dispute Resolution, and Employment and Labor Law groups. In addition, we are pleased that Kenneth Richieri, in-house counsel at the New York Times specializing in new technologies, will join us for the New York session, and that Robert Kruger, Vice-President for Enforcement at the Business Software Alliance, will join us for the Washington and Boca Raton sessions. The Los Angeles speaker will be Christine Steiner, General Counsel at J. Paul Getty Trust.

The American Film Institute is dedicated to advancing and preserving the art of film, television and other forms of the moving image. AFI's programs promote innovation and excellence through teaching, presenting, preserving and redefining the moving image.

Since 1967, the American Film Institute has been devoted to the preservation of America's film heritage. At that time, initial efforts began to find 250 of the most significant movies for which there were no surviving copies. AFI assumed principal responsibility for an international "search and rescue" mission to find the best surviving copies of movies not held in archival collections in the United States. Today, the AFI Collection consists of over 25,000 films at the Library of Congress and other archives across America.

Since its formation in 1990, The Film Foundation has been committed to fostering greater awareness of the urgent need to preserve motion picture history. Through such national efforts as the annual Preservation Festival on the American Movie Classics channel and other individual gifts, the Foundation raises funds and distributes them directly to its member archives. The Film Foundation is led by Martin Scorsese and eight other eminent directors: Woody Allen, Francis Ford Coppola, Clint Eastwood, Stanley Kubrick, George Lucas, Sydney Pollack, Robert Redford and Steven Spielberg.

The Film Foundation and AFI will present the proceeds from the premieres of VERTIGO to match AFI's NEA Preservation Challenge grant and support the work of our sister institutions: George Eastman House – Rochester, NY; Library of Congress – Washington, DC; Museum of Modern Art – New York; Pacific Film Archive – Berkeley, CA; University of California Los Angeles Film Archive – Los Angeles.

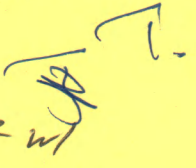

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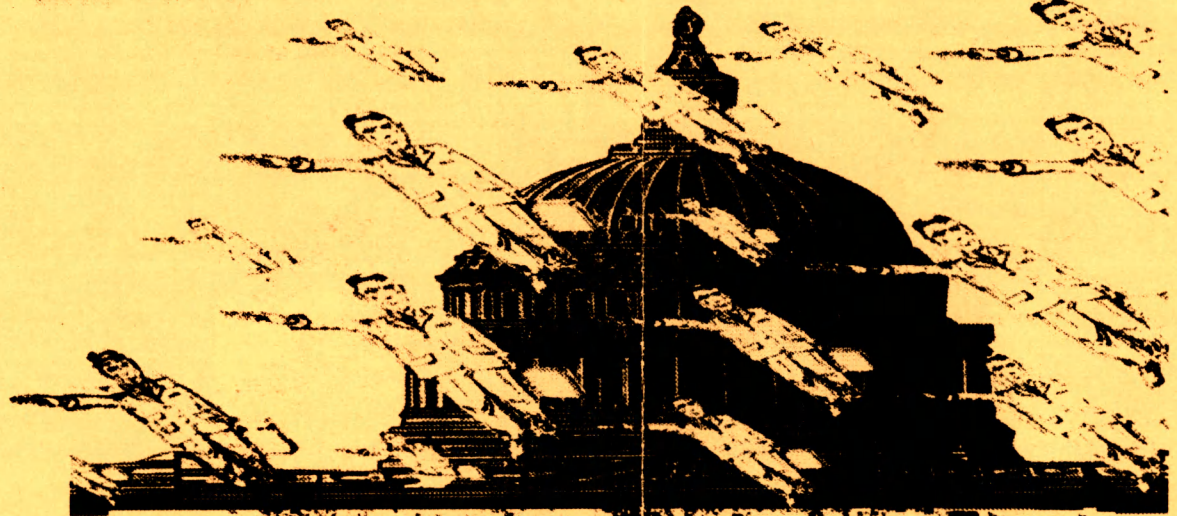
