Re: Next Study Group Meeting
Date: February 14, 1997

We have spent the last two sessions looking at the general issue of Judaism and civil disobedience. In looking at some classical texts, we find that, while there is not an exact match to the contemporary category, the rabbis did weigh in on when it might be permissible to violate or circumvent the law if some greater good might be served. At our last session we looked at some texts which challenged us to think about when we might be prepared to "take a stand" even when it posed some risk to ourselves. Because we had several new people, it was also an opportunity to do some more personal sharing. It is exciting to see the group starting to gel.

We will spend one more session on civil disobedience, specifically looking at some more contemporary perspectives. We hope you make every effort to attend.

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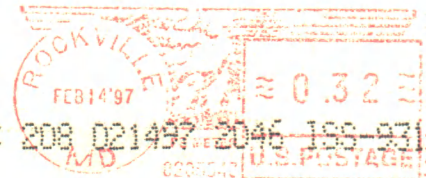
