The Colloquia

COLLOQUIA OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the colloquia are to prepare ninety (90) bilingual Mexican-American/Chicanos who are now involved in work relating to financial aid to become better at their work, to prepare them to have the capability of moving upward in the organization chart to assume responsibility for the administration of a financial aid program at some institution.

12-13 January 1976	Lone Mountain College San Francisco, California
10-24 May 1976	Our Lady of the Lake Coll. San Antonio, Texas
1-15 June 1976	University of Arizona Tucson, Arizona

PARTICIPANT SELECTION CRITERIA

The criteria for selection of participants are the following: (1) minimum of bachelor's degree, with additional weight given to applicants with master's degree, (2) position of applicant in financial aid office or financial aid-related work, such as Upward Bound, Educational Talent Search, etc., (3) type of institution where applicant works — 75% of participants be from community/junior colleges, (4) geographic area, (5) applicant's aspiration upward mobility and (6) sex of applicant.

ROOM AND BOARD

All participants will have to stay in facilities provided by the institution and will have to pay for their meals for the two week period.

STIPENDS

Participants will be paid \$75 per week for each of the two weeks of the colloquia, or a total of \$150. Participants will be paid at the end of the second week.

TRAVEL

No travel expenses for participants to or from the colloquia are authorized under the program. The individual and/or the institution where he works will have to pay for travel expenses.

TUITION/CREDIT

No tuition will be charged for the program itself. Graduate credit is available for those who want it, providing they complete registration procedures and pay tuition charges.

NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS

Thirty (30) participants will be selected for each colloquium or a total of ninety (90) participants will be served by the program.

nature

El Congreso Nacional de Asuntos Colegiales (CONAC) is a nationwide network of educators and scholars committed to promoting the educational, social, and economic well-being of the Spanish Speaking primarily in the community and junior colleges and other levels of education as they pertain, and to deliver adequate and effective education to all Spanish Speaking Americans.

purpose

El Congreso directs its efforts towards the preparation of Spanish Speaking educators; the collection, research, analysis, assessment and dissemination of data relevant to bilingual and bicultural education, the identification and recommendation of model approaches for meeting the educational needs of the Spanish Speaking; and the communication among members of developments in community based education for and by the Spanish Speaking. In addition, CONAC assists national organizations seeking solutions to the education-related problems of the Spanish Speaking nation in the U.S.

membership

Members of CONAC are primarily faculty, administrators and students in the community and junior colleges; however, personnel working at other levels of education and in related community based activities are also eligible for membership.

projects

Since its inception, CONAC has provided leadership at the community and junior college level thru a number of projects and programs. One of its thrusts has been the preparation of Chicano's at the doctoral level for administration positions in the community and junior colleges. In addition, CONAC has sponsored and co-sponsored a number of seminars, work shops, institutes, symposiums, colloquia, related to the Spanish Speaking student. Future plans include the preparation of more Spanish Speaking administrators and the preparation of bilingual teachers, counselors, librarians, financial aid administrators and personnel in the sciences.

affiliation

The Congreso is affiliated with the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges to provide a national linkage with the Spanish Speaking population in community and junior colleges. CONAC is also affiliated with the American Council on Education and the American Society for Engineering Education.

governance

El Congreso's Board of Directors consists of representatives from those states with a large Spanish Speaking population and enrolling a significant number of Spanish Speaking students. The States of California, Colorado, Texas, Arizona, New Mexico, and New York are currently represented on the Board.

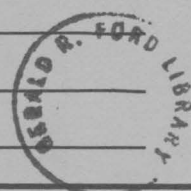
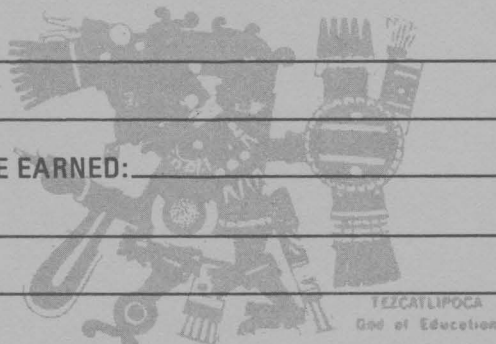

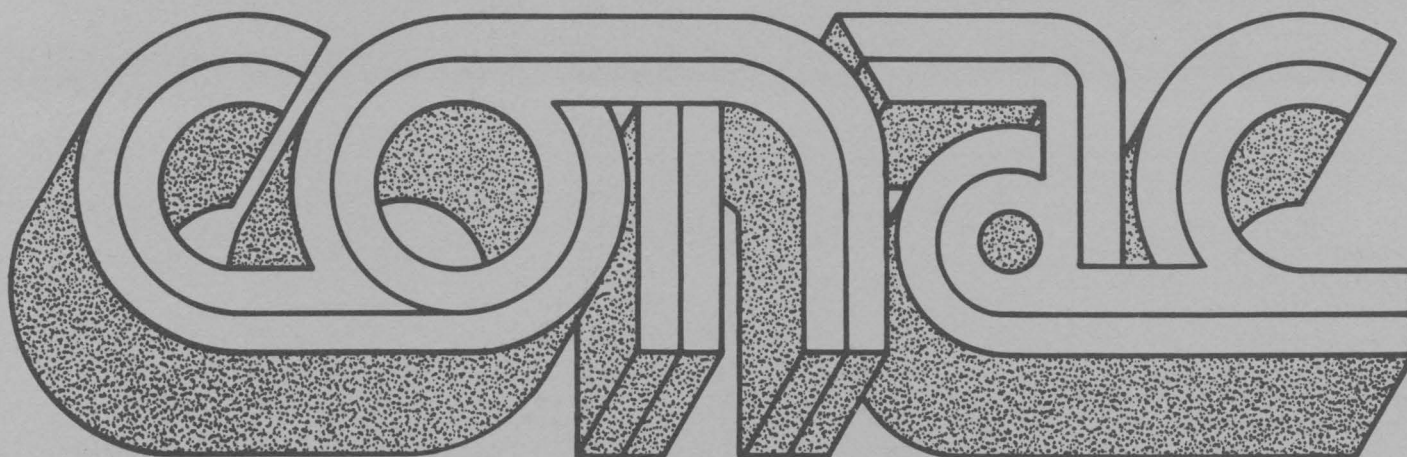

AACJC members earlier this year approved changes in the association's constitution which in turn changes the procedures which AACJC-affiliated Council (of which CONAC is one) have to use to get representation on the AACJC Board of Directors. Before this change, each Council named its own representative and he/she would be seated on the Board, each Council's turn coming on a rotating basis. Now each Council not having a representative on the Board nominates a candidate and the AACJC membership selects one or two from all Council nominees.

In addition, the procedure to be used by each council in deciding who will be its nominee has to be approved by its membership. Thus the reason for this portion of this memo.
