This summer has brought a sudden flood of surveys, projections and predictions. Taken together, they suggest that Dade County is in the midst of an extraordinary transformation

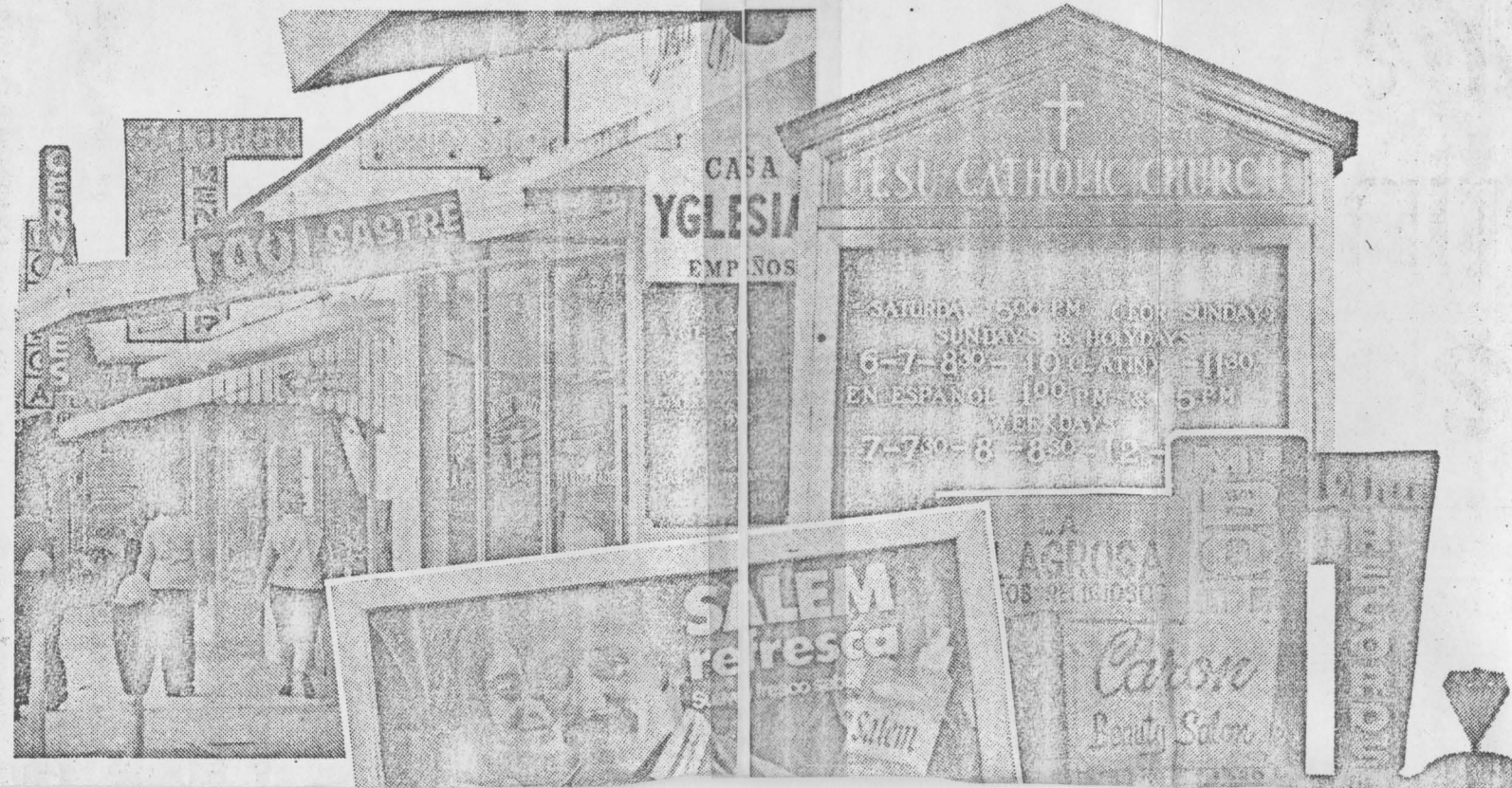

home as much as — maybe even more than — it has changed them.

IT IS easier to pinpoint what has not occurred than to describe precisely what has. The Latin exiles have not melted into the Anglo-Saxon patterns characteristic of mainstream America. They have not been absorbed. Certainly they have not taken control of the place either. Miami may have taken on much of the ambience and color and pace of old Havana, but it has not by any stretch of the imagination become a Cuban city in politics or power structure. Nor, according to the best guesses available, does anything approaching the total Latinization of Dade County seem to be in the offing.

What does seem to be coming, and quickly, is a new multi-ethnic mix that is bringing new problems — and new possibilities.

The mood of what's going on here was unusually visible the other morning at the Sheraton Four Ambassadors. At 9 a.m., about 200 people were standing around the lobby outside the west ballroom. The women were gorgeously



abominable. Among those who don't like it at all is Mrs. Ardee Kafka of Miami. Her side of the family is Irish; her husband is the descendant of Bohemians. They learned to speak English and she thinks other people should too. Mrs. Kafka, who has lived in South Florida for 35 years, does not approve of Miami's becoming a bilingual city.

"This is our country," she says. "If we went to their country, we'd have to learn Spanish. They're infiltrating our schools, our institutions, they're trying to set up a foreign power structure. They're ruining everything."

At the other end of the reaction spectrum are 16 residents of Nob Hill, an apartment complex near Dadeland, who have signed up for a Tuesday night Spanish class. One of them is a nurse who wants to communicate better with Latin patients. One is the wife of an executive who travels in South America. One is Miriam Hirschberger, a secretary. "I cannot be surrounded by a culture and not want to know something about it," she says. "We have a dual culture here. Let's face it. That's what it's going to be."

SUCH SENTIMENTS, on both sides, may be only the tip of an ice-

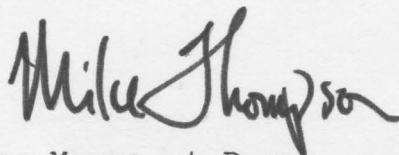
Dear Miss Dress:

I cannot comprehend the meaning of your first sentence, "Mr. De Baca's staff consists of one, myself." My reference to "the White House staff" meant precisely that--those who, among other things, process correspondence and determine the nature of replies in the President's name.

Perhaps you did not see my original letter to the President, but it consisted of information, not opinion, acquired by a random survey of Cubans residing or doing business in Greater Miami. 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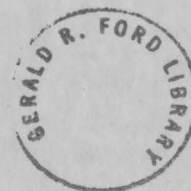
