### Howard L. Relfe resigns

The resignation of Howard L. Relfe from the property division of the State Board of Appeals was announced today by Governor Raul H. Castro.

"It's been hectic at times, but it's always been interesting," Relfe commented. "I'm sorry that I have to leave the Board, it's only because of the pressures of work in my own business."

Relfe, a Phoenix accountant, served on the Board since its formation on Feb. 1, 1968, and was Chairman for the first two years. His regular term would have ended January 1, 1977.

"I'm sorry to see him leave, he's given outstanding service to the Board and to the state," Governor Castro stated. "It won't be easy to find another man of his calibre to succeed him."

The Board consists of six members appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate, and is organized into the property tax division and the income and sales tax divisions, with three members each.

The Board hears appeals and makes decisions on classifications, valuation and taxation of property, as well as appeals concerning income, sales and related taxes.

The Immigration Council has been meeting since April, 1974, and is in the process of gathering information from various governmental and public agencies on the impact of the alien in the County of San Diego.

The San Diego County Immigration Council is very interested in following the progress of the Domestic Council Committee on Illegal Aliens, and we would like to offer our assistance to your committee in whatever manner you deem appropriate. And, we encourage a special meeting of the Domestic Council, to be held in San Diego, to gather first-hand information concerning the alien problem. San Diego would be the ideal setting for such a meeting; it is a major port of entry for aliens and is a funnel from the Mexican border to the major problem areas of Los Angeles and the agricultural districts of Northern California. Enclosed is a copy of the Resolution by the County Board of Supervisors which created the Immigration Council. This will help to explain the purpose and objectives of our Council.

### MEXICAN ALIEN PROBLEMS IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY

Over the course of the last several months, the Human Resources Agency Advisory Board has become aware that there are numerous persistent and serious problems associated with the flow of legal and illegal Mexican aliens into and through the County of San Diego.

Limited investigation by this Board has revealed that this set of problems includes the following: Increased welfare caseloads of both Mexican aliens and non-aliens who are unemployed or displaced by employed aliens; increased demand on the services of County medical facilities; County medical personnel illegally participating in Federal immigration matters by confiscating immigration documents (I-151 cards); County Port District and City law enforcement officials arbitrarily stopping individuals of Latin-American extraction who "look suspicious"; and harrassment of Mexican aliens at border crossings.

Federal Immigration and Naturalization Service officers state that some 10,000 illegal aliens are stopped each month in the City of Chula Vista alone. They estimate that 10,000 is only 10 percent of the actual flow.

After this limited introduction to the problems surrounding Mexican aliens, the Human Resources Agency Advisory Board feels that the extent and severity of the problems demand that they receive close scrutiny by all agencies affected and positive remedial action by those same agencies. Accordingly, it is our

#### RECOMMENDATION: That your Board

1. Initiate the creation of a multi-governmental Task Force to be cooperatively appointed by the County, the City of San Diego, the U. S. Department of Immigration and Naturalization and other governmental units as appropriate.

2. Charge the Task Force to define the problems pertaining to Mexican aliens in the County as those problems relate to manpower, welfare, health care, human relations and law enforcement, and to suggest solutions.
3. Charge the Task Force to determine if there are governmental units which are engaging in immigration matters outside of their legal jurisdiction.
4. Cooperatively with the City of San Diego, the U. S. Department of Immigration and Naturalization, and other appropriate governmental units establish the Task Force to include but not necessarily be limited to representatives of the following agencies and community groups:
