1. Situation. The semi-isolated location and the large sum of money stored at the Culpeper facility of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond require a comprehensive plan for the defense of the facility against criminal attack.
 - a. Criminal forces -- as established by the existing or potential situation.
 - b. Friendly forces
 - (1) Culpeper facility guard force.
 - (2) Culpeper County Sheriff's Office.
 - (3) Virginia State Police.
 - (4) Virginia National Guard.
 - (5) United States Marine Corps.
 - c. Assumptions
 - (1) Well organized criminal elements could attack the Culpeper facility in sufficient strength to call into question the ability of the internal guard

force and available local and State law enforcement organizations to control the situation.

- (2) Local police, off-duty facility guard forces, Virginia State Police, the Virginia National Guard and appropriate supporting Federal troops can be alerted and employed, individually or in combination as the situation dictates, in sufficient time to frustrate a criminal attack launched against the Culpeper facility.

2. Mission. To frustrate a criminal attack launched against the Culpeper facility.

3. Execution.

a. Concept of operations, (see Annex A).

- (1) Operations will be based upon using only the required degree of force -- internal, local, State, and Federal military forces -- appropriate to the situation.
- (2) Notice of attack will be initiated by direct voice communication from the Culpeper facility and/or the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond to the Sheriff's Office of Culpeper County and to Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police.
- (3) The Sheriff's Office and the Virginia State Police will respond to an alert as outlined in Annex A, Appendices III and IV.

- (4) Upon receipt of an alert as specified in 3.a.(2) above, Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police will issue an advisory alert to State Headquarters of the Virginia State Police. If investigation indicates that a situation has developed or is developing that may tax the capabilities of the immediately available local forces, Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police will so advise State Headquarters, Virginia State Police, and will inform the Commanding General, U.S. Marine Corps Development and Education Command (MCDEC), Quantico, Va.
- (5) If locally available law enforcement officers are unable to control the situation, State Headquarters, Virginia State Police, will notify the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Should the Governor determine that other forces available to him, including the Virginia National Guard, cannot cope with the situation or cannot respond in time, the Governor will request Federal assistance from the President.
- (6) In the event the President decides that Federal assistance is required, the Deputy Director for Operations, National Military Command Center, will be the point of contact between the President's designated representative (the Attorney General)

and the Department of Defense. Coordination between the Deputy Director for Operations, NMCC, and the Attorney General's Office (Interdivision Information Unit) will be assisted by a Military Liaison Officer designated by the Commanding General, MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia, (Annex A, Appendix VI).

- (7) In the event Federal forces are employed, the relationship between the Military Liaison Officer and the Senior Civilian Representative of the Attorney General, if present, will be as prescribed in the Joint Department of Justice/Defense Memorandum for the President dated April 1, 1969, Subject: Interdepartmental Action Plan for Civil Disturbances.

b. Tasks.

- (1) Culpeper facility officials will prepare and maintain plans and procedures for notifying local law enforcement authorities of an attack situation, (see Annex A, Appendix I).
- (2) Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond will, in coordination with Culpeper facility officials, prepare and maintain plans for alerting the Sheriff's Office, Culpeper County, and Division 2, Virginia State Police, (see Annex A, Appendix II).
- (3) The Sheriff's Office, Culpeper County, will prepare and

maintain plans to respond to alert notification, (see Annex A, Appendix III).

- (4) Division 2, Virginia State Police, will prepare and maintain plans to respond to alert notification, (see Annex A, Appendix IV).
- (5) Authorities of the Commonwealth of Virginia will be prepared to request Federal military assistance from the President, (see Annex A, Appendix V).
- (6) The U.S. Marine Corps will provide a fast-reaction military support capability to be used upon receipt by the President of a request from the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and authorization for its employment by the President, (see Annex A, Appendix VI).

X. This plan is effective for planning on September 30, 1970, and for execution when directed.

ANNEX A
Operations

1. General. To insure that operations to prevent the theft of the Federal Reserve emergency monetary supply stored at the Culpeper facility would be successful, coordination of emergency support plans is essential.

To facilitate required coordination and to insure the most effective employment of available forces, the following outline of operations is envisioned.

- a. Culpeper facility guards will attempt to repel initial attack and will carry out procedures for internal and external alerting. The alert may be disseminated in one or more of the following ways:

- (1) By voice communication from the facility to the Sheriff's Office and to Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police, if the facility is directly attacked and telephone lines remain available, (see Appendix I).
- (2) By voice communication from the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond to the Sheriff's Office and to Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police, if local telephone lines are inoperative, if a scheduled security call is missed, or if one or more of the vault alarms is activated, (see Appendix II).

- b. When alerted, off-duty facility guards and officials will report to the Commanding Officer of Virginia State Police forces at a designated rendezvous point near the facility, (see Appendix I).
- c. The Sheriff's Office will deploy all available personnel to the facility and will coordinate with the Virginia State Police in estimating the situation and in controlling it with immediately available personnel if possible, (see Appendix III).
- d. Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police will respond to an alert, coordinate with Sheriff's Office personnel in estimating the situation, and inform other elements of the supporting forces as appropriate, (see Appendix IV).
 - (1) If the initial alert is received directly from the facility with firm information that an attack in force is in progress, Headquarters, Division 2, will begin mobilizing all available State troopers and will inform the Commanding General, MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia.
 - (2) If alert is received indirectly, with no direct information that an attack is in progress, Headquarters, Division 2, will initiate a reconnaissance to develop the situation.
 - (3) If information indicates that a situation has developed or is developing that may tax the capabilities of the immediately available local forces, Headquarters,

Division 2, will issue an advisory alert to State Headquarters of the Virginia State Police and will inform the Commanding General, MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia.

- (4) Upon decision that the situation is beyond the control of available local enforcement agencies, the Commanding Officer, Headquarters, Division 2, will so notify State Headquarters, Virginia State Police.
- e. Headquarters, Virginia State Police, Richmond, will relay any advisory alerts or requests for assistance to the Governor's Office and will provide estimates on the continuing capability of the Virginia State Police to control the situation, (see Appendix V).
- f. The Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the event additional forces are urgently required, will determine whether the Virginia National Guard can respond in time or whether Federal troops are required to control the situation. In the latter case, the President will be requested to provide such forces, (see Appendix V).
- g. The U.S. Marine Corps will provide a fast-reaction military support capability to be deployed upon receipt by the President of a request from the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia and approval of its use by the President, (see Appendix VI).

ANNEX A

APPENDIX I

Culpeper Facility Security Force Procedures

1. General. Actions required by the Security Force of the Culpeper facility in the event of an imminent or actual attack on the Center.
 - a. Alert Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police (telephone).
 - b. Alert the Protection Department, Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond (operator delinquency panel).
 - c. Alert the Culpeper County Sheriff's Department (direct telephone line).
 - d. Initiate the Center Security Force Re-Call System (telephone).
 - e. Notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Alexandria (telephone).
 - f. Utilize available members of the Security Force in defense of the Center.
2. In the event telephone communications lines are out of order, the alert to the Protection Department, Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, (1.b. above) would initiate alert procedures in accordance with Annex A, Appendix II.

ANNEX A

APPENDIX II

FRB Richmond Protection Department Procedures

1. General. Vault alarms at the Communications and Records Center, Culpeper, are transmitted through the Hi-Line Security Device to the Protection Department. These alarms may be automatically created by the Center alarm system or manually created by a member of the Center Security Force.
2. Tests of the alarm system will be made each time the vault is opened and closed. Prior to the test, a supervisor of the Center Security Force will establish and maintain telephone contact with the Protection Department until the test is completed and the alarm system reset.
3. The Protection Department Supervisor on duty when an alarm is received (except for the test alarms as in paragraph 2 above) will take the following emergency actions:
 - a. Telephone Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police at (1-825-8315). Report that an alarm has been received from the Communications and Records Center located off Route 3, east of Culpeper, and request that they investigate to determine if an actual emergency exists or if equipment malfunction caused the alarm.
 - b. Telephone the Culpeper County Sheriff's Office at (1-825-1232); report the same as in a. above and, in addition, advise the Sheriff of the report made to the State Police.
 - c. Telephone the Chief of the Center Security Force (after hours)

- at (1-825-1584); during working hours at (extension 377).
- d. Telephone the Center, Manager, Division of Services; (after hours) at (1-825-1968); during working hours at (extension 212).
 - e. Make a complete report to the Manager, Protection Department, concerning the alarm condition.

ANNEX A

APPENDIX III

Culpeper County Sheriff's Office Procedures

1. General. Actions required by the Culpeper County Sheriff's Office in support of this plan are envisioned as follow:
 - a. If alert is received directly from the Culpeper facility by voice communication, alert all Sheriff's Department personnel.
 - b. If alert is received from the Protection Department, Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, by voice communication, investigate the situation before alerting other members of the Department.
(The alarm may be caused by equipment malfunction.)
2. In either of the above alert situations liaison will be established with Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police, to coordinate the investigation or defensive actions, as may be necessary.
3. Upon alert, all available members of the Sheriff's Department will report immediately to a staging area near the Culpeper facility.

ANNEX A

APPENDIX IV

Division 2, Virginia State Police

1. General. Actions by Headquarters, Division 2, Virginia State Police, in support of this plan are envisioned as follow:
 - a. Following standing operating procedures, upon receipt of an alert, Headquarters, Division 2, will:
 - (1) If alert is received from the Culpeper facility and includes information as to the strength of the attack, alert all troopers in Division 2 area and State Police Headquarters, and inform the Commanding General, MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia.
 - (2) If alert is received from Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, investigate the situation at the Culpeper facility before alerting all troopers in Division 2 or informing the Marine Corps support force. Inform State Police Headquarters that an alert has been received.
 - b. If in the judgment of the Commanding Officer, Division 2, the situation may be out of control before a sufficient number of troopers can be mobilized from Division 2 and other divisions, he will so notify Virginia State Police Headquarters and the Commanding General of the MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia.

- c. If use of Federal troops is authorized, the Commanding Officer, Division 2, the Sheriff, and the Commanding Officer, Marine Corps support unit, will coordinate the use of all available support units.

2. Preattack Planning and Coordination.

- a. Plan roadblocks in event attacking force leaves the facility.
- b. Establish rendezvous points for units of the support force, including the U.S. Marine Corps support force.
- c. Establish communications procedures with:
 - (1) Culpeper facility, including guards and officials.
 - (2) U.S. Marine Corps support force.

ANNEX A

APPENDIX V

Commonwealth of Virginia Procedures

1. General. Actions by authorities of the Commonwealth of Virginia in support of this plan are envisioned as follow:

- a. Office of the Superintendent, Virginia State Police

- (1) Monitor situation reports from the Commanding Officer, Division 2, Virginia State Police, as to the progress of law enforcement actions related to a criminal attack on the Culpeper facility.
- (2) Keep the Office of the Governor, Commonwealth of Virginia informed and, as appropriate, alerted to the possible need for armed forces over and above those available to the Superintendent.

- b. Office of the Governor, Commonwealth of Virginia

- (1) Upon notification by the Superintendent of State Police that an attack on the Culpeper facility of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond is in process, notify the United States Attorney General that Federal military assistance might be required (Chief, Interdivision Information Unit, Department of Justice, Area Code 202, 737-8200, exts. 2364 or 2365, or Duty Officer, Switchboard).
- (2) In the event armed forces, over and above those available to the Superintendent, Virginia State Police, are

determined to be needed to frustrate a criminal attack on the Culpeper facility, take action for the timely employment of the Virginia National Guard; or

- (3) If appropriate, request Federal assistance from the President in accordance with the Attorney General's letter to the Governors dated August 7, 1967.
- (4) If Federal assistance is requested, inform the Attorney General (Sec. b.(1) above) and the Commanding General, MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia, (telephone area code 703, 640-2811 or 640-2707).

Short Title: Culpeper Reaction Plan

Ref: (a) DepSecDef Memo to SecNav of 26Aug70
(b) MarCorCasProcMan P 3040

1. Situation. The Culpeper Facility of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond requires a comprehensive plan for the defense of the facility against criminal attack. The planned employment of a Federal Military Support Force is included in the Federal Reserve Plan and is predicated upon Presidential authorization. MCDEC, Quantico, Virginia is the best equipped of local available forces to undertake such a task should the President so direct federal military deployment to Culpeper. This Marine Corps operation plan is prepared in response to and in support of reference (a).

- a. Criminal forces

- (1) As established by an existing or potential situation.
- (2) As identified by local and/or state law enforcement officials.

- b. Friendly forces

- (1) Culpeper Facility Guard Force
- (2) Culpeper County Sheriff's Office
- (3) Virginia State Police, Division 2
- (4) Virginia National Guard

c. Assumptions

- (1) The employment of Federal Military Forces will be based on Presidential Proclamation and authorized by issuance of an Executive Order.
- (2) The Executive Order will contain the authority for the Department of Defense to take all appropriate steps to assist state and local law enforcement officials in bringing to an end the criminal activities described in the proclamation and in bringing into custody of appropriate state and local law enforcement officials, the persons responsible for these criminal activities.
- (3) Marine Corps receipt of the order to execute this plan constitutes concurrent Department of Defense and Department of the Navy delegation of authority to use force, including the use of deadly force when necessary, in the accomplishment of the assigned mission.
- (4) The employment of Federal Military Forces will be terminated at the earliest practical time that they can be replaced by state controlled forces.

2. Mission. When directed, the Marine Corps provides a reinforced rifle platoon to assist and augment the local and state authorities in reacting to a criminal attack launched against the Federal Reserve Bank Facility at Culpeper, Virginia.

3. Execution.

a. Concept of Operations. See Tab A (Concept of Operations).

b. Commanding General, MCDEC

- (1) Be prepared, upon notification that the Culpeper facility is subject to or under a criminal attack, to designate one field grade officer to proceed to the Headquarters Division 2, Virginia State Police, Culpeper, Virginia to function as the Marine Corps Liaison Officer.
- (2) Be prepared to provide one reinforced platoon as the Culpeper Reaction Force. Include a demolition, machine gun, rocket launcher and 106 RR capability within the reinforced platoon if practicable.
- (3) Be prepared to deploy the force by either helicopter or ground transportation means.
- (4) Be prepared to implement this plan on or after 1 October 1970.

c. Coordinating instructions

- (1) Direct liaison is authorized with local and state authorities in planning and execution of this mission.
- (2) No mortar, artillery or aviation fire systems will be employed.
- (3) Helicopter landing zones will be preselected in coordination and cooperation with local and state authorities. Landing zones will be limited to those approved by state authorities.
- (4) Use of personnel and/or equipment assigned to the MCDEC

Civil Disturbance Battalion is authorized in the planning for and execution of this plan.

- (5) The use of force, to include the use of deadly force when necessary, is authorized in execution of this plan. The principle of minimum force required will be adhered to and the CG, MCDEC supporting plan shall include guidance based on the minimum force required principle.
- (6) CG, MCDEC will provide this Headquarters with six copies of the MCDEC supporting plan when promulgated. CG, MCDEC is authorized to provide copies of the supporting plan to appropriate local and state authorities.

4. Administrative and Logistics

a. Administrative

- (1) Casualty reporting will be in accordance with reference (b).
- (2) No public announcement of the implementation of this plan will be made. All inquiries will be directed to the Department of Justice (Interdivision Information Unit).

b. Logistics

- (1) No special allowances or funding is authorized in support of this plan.
- (2) Upon termination of employment of Marine Corps forces in execution of this plan, submit to Commandant of the Marine Corps (A03H) a listing of resources expended.

5. Command and Signal

a. The Federal Military Support Force will be known as the "Culpeper Reaction Force".

Short Title: Culpeper Reaction Plan

I. Conditions under which Federal Military Support will be requested by the Governor of Virginia in response to a criminal attack on the Culpeper Federal Reserve Bank Facility will probably fall into two categories:

- a. State National Guard cannot report to the Culpeper site within three hours of being alerted.
- b. Fire power available to the criminal element is significantly greater than that available to state law enforcement agencies.

II. Pre-employment Phase Sequential Actions

- a. Division 2 of the Virginia State Police will directly notify CG, MCDEC when there is a possibility that the Culpeper Reaction Force will be employed. Due to the low probability of commitment, the Culpeper Reaction Force will not be required to maintain any alert status prior to this notification.
- b. CG, MCDEC will immediately dispatch the Marine Corps Liaison Officer to Culpeper with an appropriate communications capability.

- c. CG, MCDEC will prepare the Culpeper Reaction Force for possible deployment.
- d. CG, MCDEC will notify the Marine Corps Command Center that he has been alerted for possible employment of the Culpeper Reaction Force.
- e. Marine Corps Command Center will advise the National Command Center that the Culpeper Reaction Force has been alerted for possible employment.

III. The Marine Corps Liaison Officer, Culpeper Reaction Force is responsible for:

- a. Notifying the Department of Justice (Interdivision Information Unit, Area Code 202 Republic 7-8200 Ext 2364/2365) upon arrival in the objective area and when contact with Division 2, Virginia State Police has been established.
- b. Notifying the Department of Justice when it is ascertained that the Governor of Virginia is considering requesting Federal Military Support from the President of the United States. The Marine Corps Liaison Officer may be asked by a representative of the Department of Justice to express an opinion as to whether the employment of Federal Forces is justified. No predetermined criteria has been established upon which this opinion should be based. The opinion should be formed on the basic logic of the situation.
- c. Notifying CG, MCDEC of the intention of the Governor to request Federal Military Support from the President of the United States.

- d. Exercising operational control of Culpeper Reaction Force in coordination and cooperation with local and state law enforcement authorities as the senior Department of Defense representative present. Specifically, work in cooperation with Division 2, Virginia State Police.

IV. Execution Phase

- a. The Marine Corps Command Center will be notified by the National Military Command Center that the President has issued the Executive Order authorizing the use of Federal Troops to assist in suppressing a criminal attack against the Culpeper Federal Reserve Bank Facility.
- b. The Marine Corps Command Center will notify CG, MCDEC of the order to execute the Culpeper Reaction Plan.

- V. Upon receipt of the order to execute, CG, MCDEC will dispatch the Culpeper Reaction Force to report to the Marine Corps Liaison Officer located in the Culpeper objective area. Movement of the force will be by either helicopter or motor transport depending on weather conditions and the situation in the objective area.

- VI. The local and state law enforcement officials will advise the Marine Corps Liaison Officer when the reaction force is no longer required. Receipt of such notification constitutes authority to terminate assistance and return the force to Quantico.

- (1) CG, MCDEC will submit an after action report to the Commandant of the Marine Corps (AO3H) within ten days following execution of this plan.

ANNEX B

Responsibility and Coordination

- I. Investigation of a crime at the local level is the responsibility of the County Sheriff.
- II. The Virginia State Police also have authority and responsibility to investigate crimes typically in a supportive role to local law enforcement officials.
- III. The plan recognizes the limited size of the staff of the Culpeper County Sheriff and thus provides for simultaneous alerting of State Police forces.
- IV. Direction and control of State Police forces will be by the Commanding Officer, Division 2, who will coordinate the use of State Police forces with actions by the County Sheriff or his deputies.
- V. In the event of the deployment of the Virginia National Guard or a Federal military support unit, the commanding officer of such a unit will coordinate use of his troops with the ranking officials of local and State Police forces investigating the crime.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia has informed me that massive violent criminal activities that endanger the operations of an instrumentality of the Federal Government are in progress in Culpeper County in that Commonwealth, and that the law enforcement resources immediately available to the County and State, including the National Guard, are insufficient to bring those criminal activities under control and bring into custody the persons responsible for these activities.

WHEREAS the Governor has requested me to use such of the armed forces of the United States as may be necessary for that purpose:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICHARD NIXON, President of the United States of America, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the United States, including Chapter 15 of Title 10 of the United States Code, do command all persons engaged in these criminal activities to lay down their arms and to surrender peacefully to the law enforcement officers present at the scene of the crimes involved.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I hereunto set my hand this
in the year of our Lord , and the
Independence of the United States of America the

SECTION 1. The Secretary of Defense is authorized and directed to take all appropriate steps to assist State and local law enforcement officials in bringing to an end the criminal activities described in the proclamation and in bringing into custody of appropriate State and local law enforcement officials, the persons responsible for these criminal activities.

SECTION 2. In carrying out the provisions of Section 1, the Secretary of Defense is authorized to use such of the Armed Forces of the United States as he may deem necessary.

SECTION 3. The Secretary of Defense is authorized to delegate to the Secretary of the Navy or any other official of the Department of Defense any of the authority conferred upon him by this order.

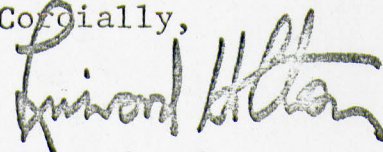

Dear Dave:

As indicated in my letter of April 9, 1970, and in line with your suggestions, we have developed a plan for the alerting and employment of armed forces in defense of our facility at Culpeper against criminal attack. The draft outline plan, copies of which are enclosed, places primary reliance on forces available to the Governor, Commonwealth of Virginia, but includes provisions for alerting Federal authorities and for the employment of Federal forces should the Governor of Virginia so request and the President so authorize.

In developing our outline plan, we have had assistance from General Lincoln and his staff in the Office of Emergency Preparedness. It is my understanding that they, in turn, have had informal discussions on the subject with members of your staff, principally Mr. Leonard Niederlehner, Acting General Counsel, OSD, and Colonel Williford, USA, OSD(A).

Both Governor Holton and his Superintendent of State Police, Colonel Burgess, have reviewed the plan insofar as it affects their responsibilities and outlines their actions in the event Virginia authorities cannot cope with the situation. As indicated in the attached letter, Governor Holton will request Federal assistance if units of the Virginia National Guard cannot report to the Culpeper facility within three hours after receiving an alert.

To become fully effective, the concept and procedures now need to be coordinated with the Department of Defense. Since in an emergency, speed and effectiveness of response may largely depend on the adequacy of prior planning, I would appreciate your assistance in completing such advance arrangements as you may consider desirable and mutually beneficial, particularly with respect to meeting the necessary statutory requirements. Specifically, it would be helpful if your staff would provide the material to be included in Annex A, Appendix VI of the enclosed outline plan.

Our operational plans for the use of the Culpeper facility will be facilitated if we can accomplish the necessary actions not later than September 30, 1970. My staff and their liaison officer in the Office of Emergency Preparedness are, of course, available for further coordination and consultations as may be appropriate.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF THE NAVY

SUBJECT: Contingency Plan for Federal Armed Forces Support
of the Federal Reserve System Facility, Culpeper,
Virginia

The Chairman, Federal Reserve System by letter (attachment 1) has forwarded a security plan for the Federal Reserve System facility at Culpeper, Virginia. This plan was developed in consonance with the suggestion forwarded in my letter of 6 April 1970 (attachment 2).

The Federal Reserve System proposes to house \$3 billion in emergency currency at this facility placing primary reliance for protection on its local guard force. The local guard force is to be reinforced by forces available to the Governor, Commonwealth of Virginia should an attempt be made by organized crime to penetrate the vault facility. The employment of Federal armed forces is predicated upon Presidential authorization. Affixed to Chairman Burns' letter is a letter from Governor Holton which implies that Federal assistance would be requested by him from the designated Federal Military Command Headquarters. Subsequent to Governor Holton's letter, we informed Chairman Burns' office that any request for Federal armed forces must be made by Governor Holton to the President and not the Military Command Headquarters.

Chairman Burns, in consonance with my suggestion and offer of assistance, requests that we, in conjunction with his staff, develop a contingency plan to support his security plan. It appears that your Quantico installation is the best equipped of local available forces to undertake such a task should the President so direct military deployment to Culpeper. Accordingly, I desire that the Department of the Navy develop this contingency plan in conjunction with the Federal Reserve System staff not later than 30 September 1970. When your plan has
