## Important Notice About Your Welfare Check and Food Stamps

The Welfare Department is proposing to take the following action:

If you want a prior hearing by the State (without a county conference) before your welfare check or Food Stamps are stopped, decreased, held, or suspended, you have a right to one; but you must circle box #3 on the reverse side of this letter and mail it so that it reaches the Welfare Department within fifteen (15) days of the above date.

# COUNTY OF FRANKLIN

A county conference means that you have the right to discuss the proposed action of the county before a representative of the State Welfare Department before the action is taken. In such a hearing you have the right to be represented by any person of your choice. Until the hearing is held the county's proposed action will not be taken.

One of the following decisions will be made from the evidence presented by you and the Department:

- 1) Your check or Food Stamps will be stopped, decreased, suspended or held.
- 2) Your check or Food Stamps will be adjusted to meet continuing need.
- 3) You will be determined no longer financially eligible and you may be requested to repay your last check.

**YOUR REPLY MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE WELFARE DEPARTMENT WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS OF THE DATE ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THIS NOTICE**

2. I want a conference with a representative of the county before my welfare check or Food Stamps are changed.

Dear Sir:

I am an ardent admirer of our great President. I congratulate him therefore most sincerely for his efforts in bringing Peace to Viet Nam and in the world at large.

However, I am taking this opportunity to write because I would like to express my opinions on two subjects which I feel are important.

First, let me say that I call myself a square liberal because I believe in being as thoughtful of the rich as I am of the poor -and vice versa. To me, the wealthy are responsive to the poor by making jobs, by their tax monies and by charitable contributions, etc. This is the American way and I love it! Indeed, the more rich people a nation has -the less poor people that nation will have to care for. America therefore brings to life and personifies Freedom in truth because of her limitless ability for Achievements in the midst of Diversity existing in harmony with Tolerance.

I believe in these Lefty principles above wholeheartedly and most sincerely. However, as one who has had a long illness which I am now recovering from, I was in a position to see and know certain things which working people were not able to perceive or notice.

What I am going to say, please keep my name out of it and in strict confidence because I have had enough troubles than to get myself mixed up in politics or a controversial matter. But, I feel it is my duty to bring this matter to your attention.

I have looked at a lot of TV news programs (nightly news) the past several years or more and many, many other programs and personality shows and specials of news making variety. I am not going to be specific other than to give you some fine advice. Why is it that small influential segments of a one-sided political thought or point of view is allowed a disgraceful monopoly-ship? Doesn't the people of America as a whole, Republicans and Democrats, Liberals and Conservatives alike own the Air Waves over which one-sided opinionated views and slanted, selected coverage is given to the advantage of only a one sided political point of thought and expression? The danger in this is great and revealing in my opinion. It can effect our very Freedom if it is allowed to get out of hand or pass completely into an unscrupulous one-sided point of view as it seems presently moving towards. Now, this is only my opinion at present but it does seem serious if nothing is done to secure freedom of expression for everyone over publicly owned air waves. I don't criticize anyone -I am merely pointing out to you a clear cut terrible danger to our very freedom and the peoples right to know both sides of every story and to hear jibes and jokes at all political trend of thought and expression -not just one-sided jokes, jibes and interviews with people of the same political coloration.

political thought or preference also? I therefore make this suggestion:

The President of the United States and/or the Republican party heads should exercise the rights of all sides of the political thought to be heard on a purely political or social matter by the public over the air waves. In all fairness to both sides of the question of a matter under the above heading, a Committee should be originated and carried through with the purpose of watching the daily nightly news programs especially, other special news programs of importance and regular programming regarding interviews and jokes. Then, when the Committee sees an apparent flagrant violation or fault, then they should demand equal time under the system of a free democracy presenting both sides of a question or argument, etc.

As I said, I am a square liberal, but I am patriotic. There is a danger in the present system to undermining freedom itself by giving a one-sided political monopoly who ever is in control of a news broadcast unfair monopoly over what is to be said to the public. This goes for any segment of the political spectrum -liberal or conservative, Democrat or Republican, etc. This is not censorship but fair play with the public having the right to know especially when they own the air waves.

Now, I wish to criticize the recent decision in favor of Abortions on Demand. As a good, law abiding citizen, however, I do abide by all decisions of our great Supreme Court. I just cannot agree with this one decision. Have you and our President ever stopped to think that if every woman would now exercise this new right of Abortions on Demand, it would destroy our nation in about 30 years or so? How can we say that it is right to take an infants life within its mother and then say it is inhumane to kill the worst criminal offender? I frankly don't get it -do you? And, then I hear talk about public funding for programs for free medical expenses for Abortions by the poor. Is this the new liberality of the future in treating our poor people? Frankly, I don't get it because we are by far the richest people on the face of this earth -rich and poor alike.

In closing, remember to keep my name out of this and in strictest confidence.



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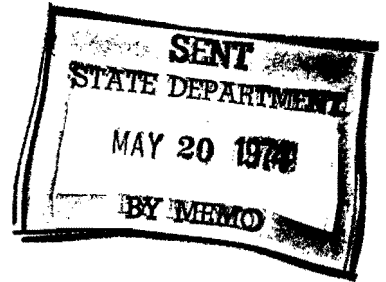

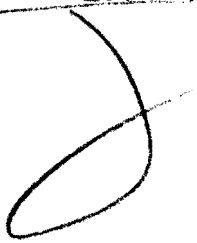
