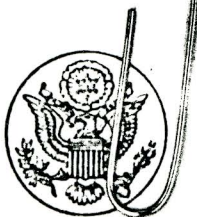

Dear Mr. Mayor:

President Nixon is indeed pleased to learn that the citizens of Kalamazoo, Michigan have established a sister-city relationship with the people of Kingston. He has asked that I write to express his conviction that the affiliation will contribute to better understanding between the peoples of the two cities and our two countries.

The President endorses and encourages the expansion of sister-city programs. He is honorary chairman of the Town Affiliation Association - the private, national coordinating organization for the affiliation of more than 400 American communities with their counterparts in 60 countries of the world. The President has said: "This commendable achievement is in the best tradition of America's commitment to a peaceful, prospering world community."

President Nixon congratulates the people of Kalamazoo and Kingston who helped establish this affiliation, and wishes them every success in advancing the cause of world peace through closer people-to-people contacts.
