Dear Mr. President:

On February 25 of this year I sent a special message on American foreign policy to the Congress of the United States. Knowing that we and the peoples we represent have a deep mutual interest in building and strengthening a durable structure of international relationships, I wanted you to have a copy of the report.

My report emphasizes the immediate and broad applicability of the "Nixon Doctrine" in Africa. Our goal is to encourage the self-reliance of all nations. Within the framework of African efforts, however, we can also contribute to three primary needs -- peace, economic development, and justice -- and we will support those aspirations as generously as our resources will permit. The steps I have outlined in the report are intended to further that purpose.

I greatly appreciate the support you have given to our efforts to end the fighting in Vietnam, and I want you to know that your understanding has been most reassuring. In addition, all of us are grateful for the warm welcome you gave to Assistant Secretary of State Newsom and his party last November. I hope you found their visit as useful as we did.

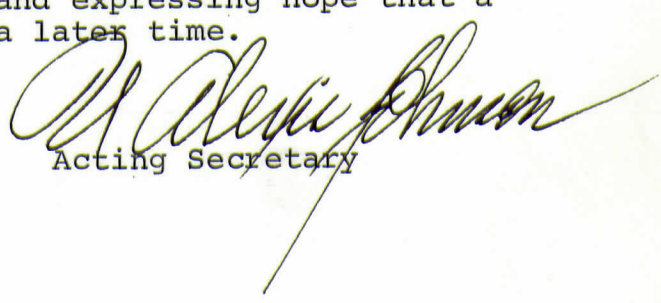

Prior to the United Nations' voting this fall on Chinese representation, President Banda undertook personal demarches to leaders of three African states in support of the American resolutions. Moreover, Dr. Banda is a conspicuous moderate on relations with southern Africa, endorsing policies of contact and dialogue with the southern African governments while condemning apartheid.

I recommend that you agree in principle to an office visit for President Banda in the spring of 1972. If your schedule will not permit such an appointment, I suggest that you sign the attached letter to the Malawi President, informing him of that fact and expressing hope that a meeting can be arranged at a later time.
