Mr. President:

We write to express our concern at reports that the residual diplomatic mission will remain in Rhodesia.

The failure to close the Salisbury consulate seems to us a tragic mistake. We are ashamed of the message conveyed to both black and white Rhodesians that the United States acquiesces in the course of the present regime, and disturbed at the implied acceptance of the recent referendum--truly a mockery of democratic process--in which ninety thousand people, virtually all European, sought to entrench their highly privileged position and settle the political future of a nation of almost five million people, more than nine-tenths of whom are African. And we regret the lost opportunity to disengage ourselves symbolically from a society which, as we can assure you from our first-hand observation of Rhodesia and Rhodesians, stands diametrically opposed to the history-shaping demands of equal dignity and equal opportunity for all men.

We urge that the consulate be closed, and we hope that your administration will take this and other steps to demonstrate America's dedication to creating stable societies, built on majority consent and the observation of fundamental human rights, throughout Southern Africa and elsewhere in the developing world.
