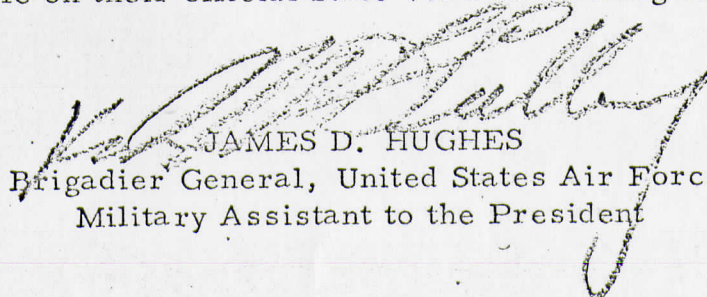

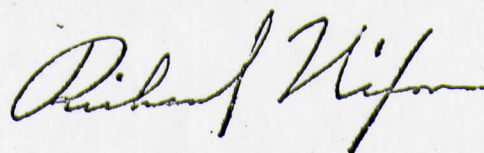
Dear President Caldera:

Your message about the petroleum policy measures announced on June 17 was most welcome. As we agreed during your visit to Washington, these measures were designed to increase Venezuela's share in the United States petroleum market for the next six months.

You may be sure that we will continue close consultations with your Government during the formulation of our long-range oil import policy. The next consultations will, I hope, focus on the economic and technical information which will contribute to a mutual and better understanding of our overall petroleum relationships. I trust these talks will also assess the steps necessary to develop greater Venezuelan petroleum reserves in support of hemispheric security requirements, which should, at the same time, improve your great country's opportunities for future development, at home and in markets abroad.

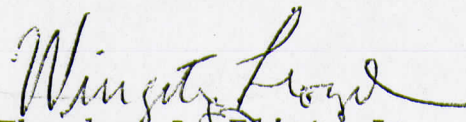
