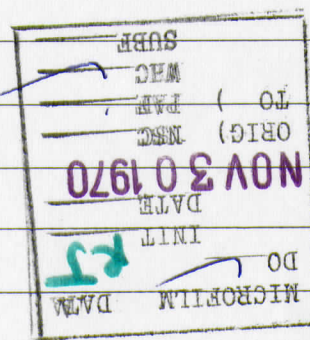

Aviation Negotiations

The United States-Venezuelan civil aviation negotiations that began in Washington on November 17 ended on November 25 without agreement on amendments to the bilateral Air Transport Agreement. It was agreed, however, that there will be a new round of negotiations. The new round, which will probably take place in Caracas, may begin as early as March 1971, but will more likely not begin until midsummer.

Although Venezuelan route aspirations were discovered at an early stage of negotiations to be somewhat less extensive than had been expected, they were nevertheless of such magnitude that, if they were granted, Venezuela's benefits under the Agreement would far outweigh those of the United States. Moreover, while the Venezuelans proposed to augment their own route rights, they simultaneously proposed to diminish ours.

This extreme Venezuelan position was somewhat eroded by the arguments of the United States Delegation and the two sides had drawn appreciably nearer each other by the final day. Serious disagreements remained, however, in such areas as, inter alia, the valuation of existing and possible future routes and the interpretation of certain route descriptions as they are set forth in the present Agreement. Two hoped-for routes to which the Venezuelans attached great importance could not be given serious consideration by the United States Delegation because they figure in on-going negotiations between the United States and other countries. The granting of either or both of these routes at this time would
