SUBJECT: Reaction in Venezuela to Postponement of Mission's Visit

The general reaction among the relatives and close friends I talked to was one of embarrassment and mortification. Those who strongly support the government contended the decision had been wise in the light of likely disturbances and even bloodshed, but they nonetheless felt it most regrettable that the postponement had been necessary. Those who have no particular sympathy with the government bemoaned the fact that it was not the master and had to follow the dictates of militant groups. My brother-in-law, who is a lifelong friend of President Caldera, warmly praised him as a person but added that he was more suitable as President of Switzerland than Venezuela.

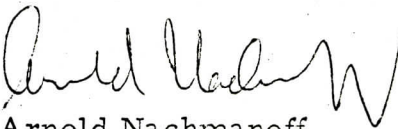

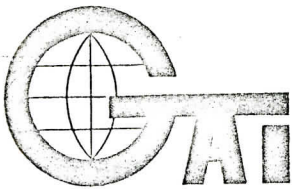

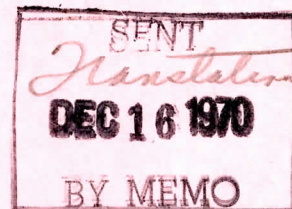
