FRENCH TV QUESTIONED

ANDRE GUERIN NOTES IN A FRONT-PAGE EDITORIAL IN AUREORE: "ARE YOU FOR THE AMERICANS? I AM WITHOUT ILLUSIONS, OF COURSE. VESTED WITH HUGE RESPONSIBILITIES AFTER TWO WORLD WARS, THEY HAVE NOT ALWAYS PROVEN EQUAL TO THE TASK BECAUSE, BOTH PRESUMPTUOUS AND CHILDISH, AND ABOVE ALL PROFOUNDLY IGNORANT OF OTHER REALITIES THAN THEIR OWN, THEY HAVE WALKED LIKE ELEPHANTS AMONG INDOCHINESE, AFRICAN AND OTHER CHINA. THIS BEING SAID, IT WAS BECAUSE OF THE AMERICANS THAT PART OF EUROPE WAS EVENTUALLY SAVED. WITHOUT THE AMERICANS, WHAT WOULD THERE REMAIN OF THE INDEPENDENCE AND FREEDOMS OF THE WEST? IF ILL LUCK HAD IT THAT I HAD TO MIGRATE ONE DAY, I WOULD PROBABLY FIND IT MOST DIFFICULT TO GET USED TO THE CUSTOMS AND PREJUDICES OF AMERICAN DAILY LIFE. YET IT IS OVER THERE AND IN BRITAIN IT SEEMS THAT ARE FOUND THE MOST REASSURING RESPECT FOR INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS, THE BEST GUARANTEES ALSO. PEOPLE WILL RESPOND: RACISM, WITCH-HUNTING HAWKISHNESS. THERE IS SOME TRUTH IN ALL THESE REPROACHES... YET I FIND IT MOST UNPLEASANT, WHEN I SWITCH ON MY TELEVISION SET, TO BE OFFERED PROGRAMS SO SYSTEMATICALLY AND GLARINGLY ANTI-AMERICAN. ONE WILL AGAIN ANSWER ME THAT AMERICAN TV CAMERAMEN ALSO DO NOT SCRUPLE TO SHOW HARDLY FLATTERING IMAGES OF THEIR COUNTRY AND LEADERS. BUT AMERICAN TV ALSO SHOWS OTHER ASPECTS OF AN AMERICA WHICH IS NOT MADE EXCLUSIVELY OF CRIME, DRUG ADDICTS, BRAWLS FOR DOLLARS, OBSCENITIES, GENOCIDES AND DESERTIONS... FRENCH TELEVISION APPEARS TO BE MAKING SUPERHUMAN EFFORTS WHEN IT SHOWS US SOMETHING ELSE ABOUT AMERICA THAN SCENES OF DEGENERATION AND LEWDNESS. MARINES APPEAR ON THE SCREEN AND THERE ARE IMMEDIATELY SAVAGE YELLS FROM NAZI-LIKE INSTRUCTORS. IN COMPARISON WITH SUCH BEASTS, THE NORTH VIETNAMESE

COMMUNISTS ARE LAMBS WHICH ONE IS SURPRISED NOT TO HEAR BLEATING.

ALL NEGROES ARE HEROES AND ALL WHITE POLITICIANS CORRUPT ...

THE EFFECTS OF SUCH A PROPAGANDA SHOULD NOT BE UNDERRATED ...

IN ANY CASE WE ARE STILL WAITING FOR REAL AND COURAGEOUS REPORTAGES

ON THE USSR AND CHINA ON OUR DEAR TV SCREEN ... WE WOULD RATHER

LIKE TO WATCH THAT, BUT YOU CAN BE SURE IT WON'T HAPPEN TOMORROW."

SUGGESTED REPLY

Dear Governor Davis:

I was pleased to receive your letter expressing support for the Partnership Program between the State of Vermont and the Republic of Honduras. The various activities conducted in this joint venture are most commendable and I hope that they will be continued.

Please be assured that the scheduled reduction in future funding of the Washington Office of the National Association of the Partners of the Alliance does not reflect a lessening of interest in the program. We have high regard for the work being accomplished and hope to see this kind of effort expanded to all 50 states.

We have felt, following the recommendations of a recent evaluation of the Partners program, that Government should play a less prominent role and permit the Partners to become a truly people-to-people activity.

Subject: Davis Letter to President Nixon

The Partners of the Alliance was established in 1964 as a means of involving people as well as governments in the development process. Private sector committees in states of the United States were paired as Partners with countries or areas of Latin America to implement mutually agreed upon programs based upon sharing the efforts and pooling the resources of both groups. One of the goals sought was to introduce North Americans to Latin Americans, with the hope that knowing each other and working together friendship and understanding would develop.

From being acquainted, from seeing the needs and recognizing the opportunities, it was also hoped that the Partners program would stimulate interest in private investment in Latin America.

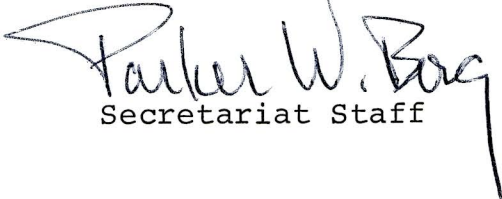
In 1967, A.I.D. provided \$141,500 in grants to help establish the National Association of the Partners of the Alliance (NAPA). Incorporated as a non-profit entity the national association was conceived as a logical next step toward moving the Partners program into the private sector on a self-sustaining basis through funds contributed by private foundations and corporations. In 1967, it was estimated that NAPA could be self sufficient administratively and financially by June 30, 1971. This was subsequently changed to June 30, 1973. A.I.D.'s financial assistance has always been considered temporary and was so stated in the grant which provided:

"The Grantee shall make every reasonable effort to secure maximum contributions for this program from private foundations, corporations and organizations so that it can be fully funded from such sources no later than June 30, 1971."

A.I.D. financial assistance to NAPA January 1, 1967 through December 31, 1971 totals \$2,124,250. This amount has been divided with \$736,500 for travel and program activities and \$1,387,750 for administrative needs.

A recent evaluation of the Partners program recommended that most of the programming activities be transferred to the States with NAPA functioning as a servicing agency only. As such, funding for NAPA administration could be reduced. However, support for travel, programming and technical assistance costs of Partners' members should be maintained at the same or a higher level.

Budget constraints in FY 1972 have required the Latin American Bureau to reduce funding for many programs. In addition, NAPA reported to A.I.D. that it expects to raise \$100,000 in Fiscal Year 1972 and \$200,000 in 1973. Therefore, it is the Agency's determination that funding be reduced over the next years as voluntary contributions increase.

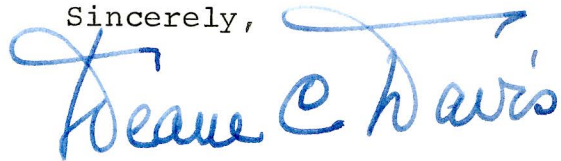
It would be most unfortunate, I firmly believe, if these

Dear Mr. Derrick:

Your kind letter of February 11 has come to my attention, and I am pleased to accept the position of Honorary Chairman of the Partners of the Americas. I do so because I fully share your belief that the Partners can contribute significantly, in the years ahead, to a feeling of greater understanding between the nations of this Hemisphere.
