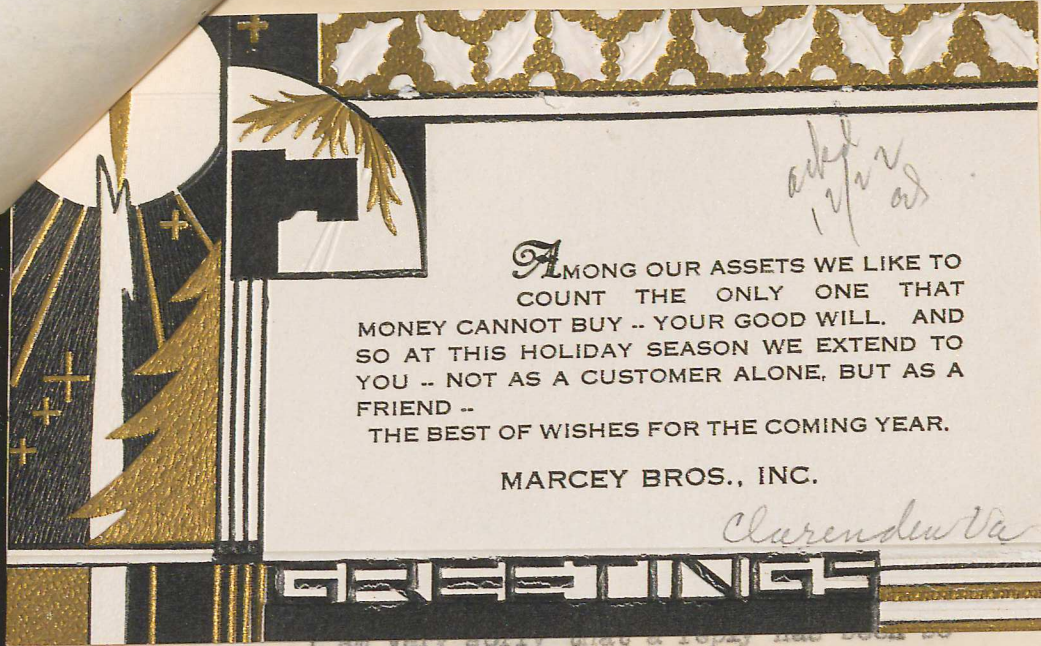

I am making a Novena of Nine Tuesdays, praying that She will ask Her Divine Son to guide you in your great work of bringing prosperity back to our Country and to Bless you with strength and good health to carry on in this great undertaking. I shall also attend daily mass and offer Holy Communion for you.

I do not want to burden you with too long a letter - this is just an example of how the Blessed Mother helped in answer to my prayers.

A very dear friend, 67 years of age, suffered a stroke six years ago and was just recovering her speech when she contracted "sleeping sickness". Two of our leading physicians said there was absolutely no hope for her. When I heard this, I took a Perpetual Help medal out to the hospital and asked her daughter to pin it on her mother's gown or pillow slip. They are not a Catholic family. The medal was pinned to the sheet on her bed. Two days later the doctor said there was an improvement and the mother would very likely recover. Three weeks later the mother was

allowed to go home - entirely cured; - how, the doctors said they would never understand.

The daughter returned the medal to me the following Wednesday. I asked her to give it to her mother to keep always - because I was confident her mother was saved by Mary's intercession. This family were of the opinion, however, that good care, and their mother's will power, kept her on this earth. The following Friday the mother had another stroke and these same doctors said nothing could be done to save her. The daughter phoned me, asking if she could have the medal again to place near her mother. The medal was pinned to her mother's gown. Ten days later the mother was sitting up and last week (one month after her second stroke) the daughter brought her mother to see me. She feels and looks better than she has for years. The mother said "I have the little medal pinned inside my coat and will keep it always - my doctors said my recovery was miraculous"

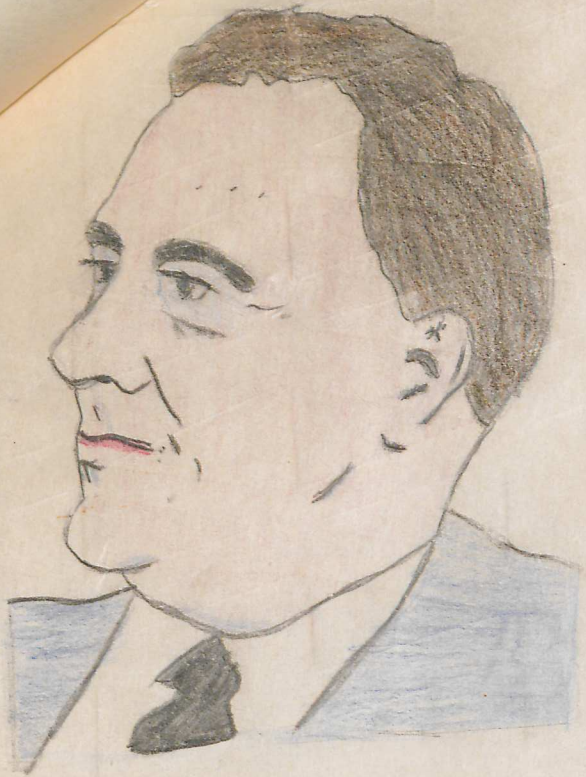
