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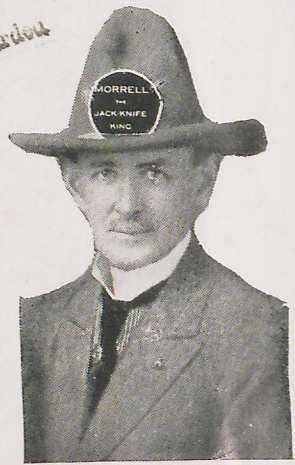

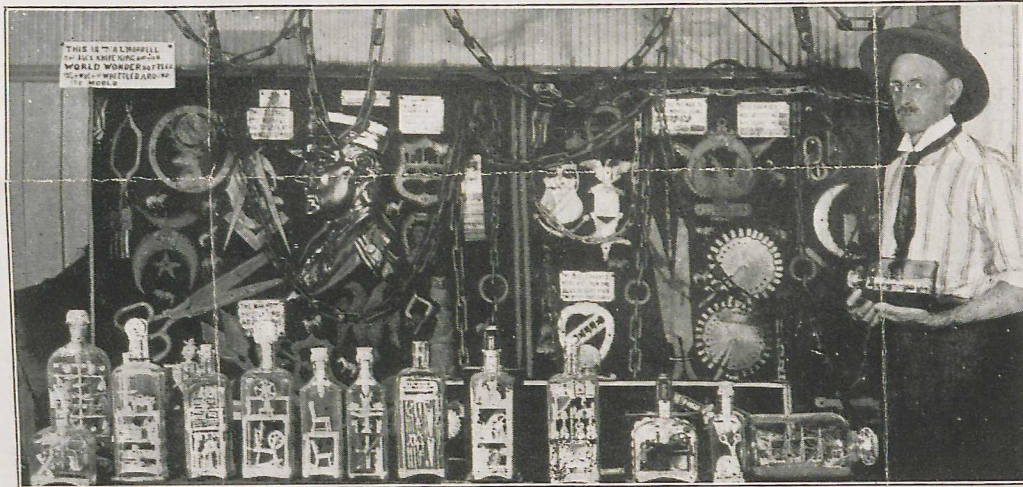

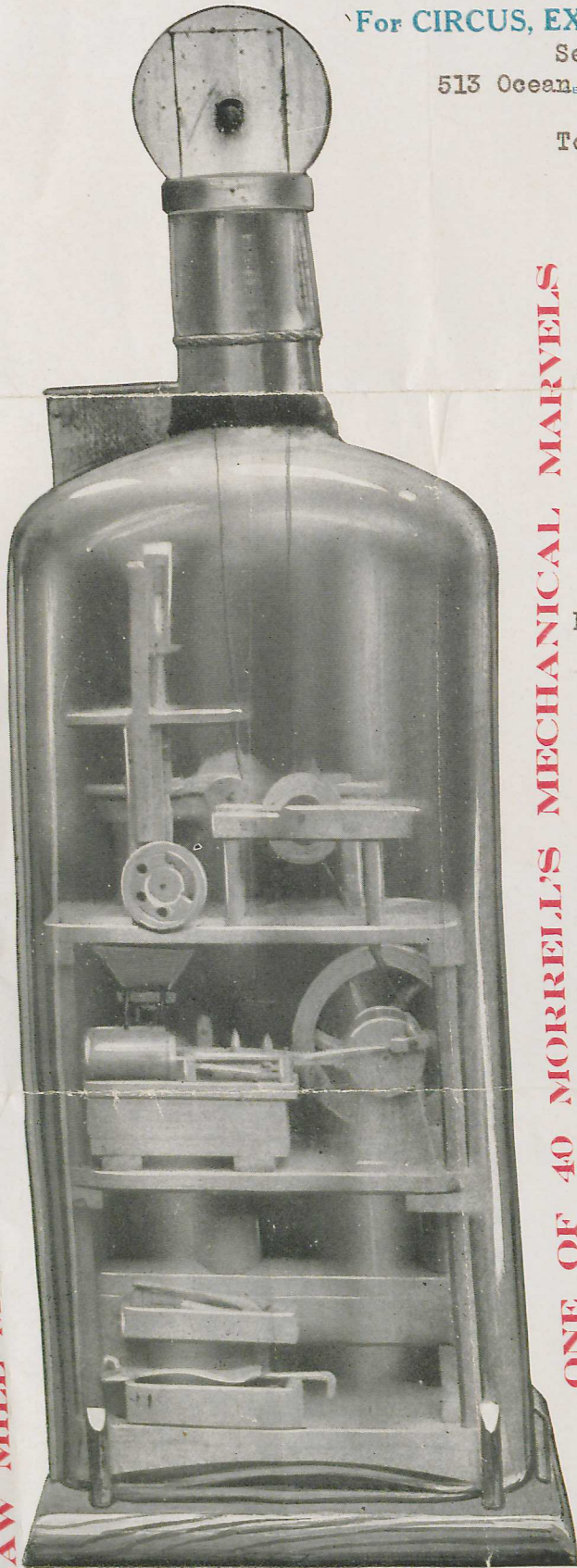

The Mystic Meaning of that Strange

“V”

DANIEL
Chapters 2 and 7

RADIO ADDRESS
KHJ • AUG. 2, 1941

◆ In the past few weeks throughout Europe there has appeared the mystic “V” or number FIVE. Millions of times this number FIVE or Roman numeral “V” has appeared before the eyes of humanity. This has not been a passing incident, but it has a deeper meaning than the public has yet known. I now give you a bible interpretation of this number Five.

NUMEROLOGY

Numerology is the Science of Numbers, the mathematical foundation of the universe; also the numerical foundation of the holy scriptures. The full and mystical import of numbers in the bible we understand only in a most limited degree. For illustration, *One* is unity. *Deut. 6:4*, “The Lord our God is one LORD.” *Two* is competent witness; *Deut. 17:6*. *Three* is trinity,—“Father, Son and Spirit.” Trinity is written everywhere. Man is a trinity,—body, soul and spirit; water is trinity,—one element appearing as water, steam or ice; a business is trinity,—president, secretary, treasurer,—one business, three persons. A tree is trunk, limbs and leaves, one tree, three parts: the family is father, mother and child, three persons but only one family. We could multiply examples indefinitely, for trinity is the essential number. *Four* is the earth number. *Six* is man’s number,—man created on the sixth day; man works for six days and then rests. *666* is the satanic number, *Rev. 13:18*. *Seven* is the number of perfection, occurring all through holy scripture. *Eight* is the new beginning; Christ’s resurrection number. *Ten* is the perfect number,—the Ten Commandments, etc.

Twelve represents complete administration,—twelve tribes of Israel. *Thirteen* is the number of rebellion and separation. *Gen. 14:4*. Manasseh is the 13th tribe; America descended from the tribe of Manasseh and came into being through rebellion. *Fourteen* is the sacrificial number of Christ, the Paschal Lamb. *Ex. 12:6; Matt. 1:17*. *Forty* is the number of trial or testing. *Seventy* is the number of captivity. *One hundred and forty-four* (144,000) is the perfection of the saints. *Rev. 7:4*. *One hundred and fifty-three* is the Israel number, *John 21:11*. 153 kings have reigned on the throne of David, including the present ruler of England, King George VI. On my visit to Palestine to examine the harbor of the coming battle of Armageddon, I found to my surprise and delight that it contained exactly 153 acres. The Israel number!

NUMBER “V”

Let us consider this number Five as it appears in the holy scriptures,—for the bible is our only source of accurate and permanent knowledge. Our first reference is *Genesis 14:9*, which refers to a battle. Joseph gave Benjamin *five* times as much as to the other brothers. Israel marched up out of Egypt *five men in each row, armed for war*. *Leviticus 26:8* reads, “five of you shall chase a hundred.”

FIVE IS A WAR NUMBER

David took five stones to slay Goliath. It is also the earthly number of Christ. He took five barley loaves and fed five thousand. In the pool of Bethesda there were five porches,—at which place Christ healed the crippled. *John 5:2* We have *Matthew 25*, five wise and five foolish virgins. Thus, wherever we look we find that the number five in the holy scriptures is the number of Christ; secondly, it is the number of war,—of marching soldiers and divine victories. It is the power of Christ healing Israel and bringing redemption to His people under His military leadership. *Rev. 19:11-16*.

“VOICE OF DOOM”

Recently an outstanding British Major has been broadcasting “The Voice of Doom,” in which he urges that the letter “V” should be placed everywhere—wherever men have eyes to see. Now, what is the true significance of this strange letter suddenly leaping into spiritual significance, and does it have a bible meaning? Is it a sign to men concerning some purpose of God and some approaching event of more

than usual significance? You will recall that Jesus spoke in parables, as recorded in *Matthew 13*, so that one class of hearers would understand, while another class would not understand. To the wise His parables were revealing; to the unwise they were concealing. If men were spiritually minded they would perceive the parable; if they were hard of heart, its meaning would never appear.

EIGHT SIGNS

In *Matthew 24* and in *Luke 17* our Lord gave eight simple signs of His advent. Signs so simple and yet so plain that everyone could see. These eight signs now appear simultaneously and in an intensified form, telling us who have eyes to see and ears to hear that His approach draweth near. Millions of people daily see these signs, but to them they have no speaking voice. They are signs and nothing more.

In *Matthew 14* our Lord rebuked the people of His day, saying that they could interpret the signs of the weather but they could not discern the signs of the time. They could know whether tomorrow would be a hot day or not, but they could not see that the Messiah stood in their midst; and so it will be at the again coming. Spiritually people will read the signs correctly; the world at large will see nothing, and the day will come upon them unawares. *Luke 21:34*.

ONE MORE SIGN

And now God is flinging across the whole world, before the eyes of all humanity, one more outstanding sign, which has the deepest bible significance. It is now blazing across Europe and I have no doubt it will soon appear on the American continent, and especially throughout the British Empire, since it has a peculiar significance both to America and to Great Britain. Nothing in recent years so speaks in divine accents to these two great nations as this mystic “V” with its promise of hope to the Israel nations, and indeed the voice of doom to the Gentile powers of the world. *Ps. 2; Rev. 16*.

I now ask you to consider the prophecy of Daniel, chapters 2 and 7, in which the whole course of human history is outlined. Any one who will master these two chapters has a foundation for understanding the prophetic scriptures, the world events of today, including this war, and the things that are coming upon the earth. *Luke 21:25-28*.

THE GREAT IMAGE

In chapter 2 we have the great Image which King Nebuchadnezzar beheld in a vision of the night. When he awoke, the dream was gone, and he could not remember it. Enraged, he decreed the death of all the wise men of Babylon because they could not recall to him his dream. The time—606 B.C. Then Daniel prayed to God for wisdom, that he might interpret the dream,—which he did. The king saw a great Image, 60 cubits high, with head of gold, breast of silver, thighs of brass, legs of iron, and toes of clay and iron. This terrible Image, in its supernatural grandeur, represents the time of the Gentile domination of the Israel people.

2,520 YEARS

In these 2520 years, four world empires would rise, rule and pass away. The head of gold was the Babylonian King and the Babylonian Empire, lasting from 606 B.C. to 538 B.C., at which time Babylon was overturned by the Medo-Persian Empire, represented in the Image by silver. The Persian Empire lasted from 538 B.C. to 331 B.C. Then followed the Grecian Empire under Alexander the Great, who overthrew the Persian hosts in 331, and the Greek Empire lasted to 30 B.C. The Greek Empire was represented by the brass or copper in the Image. Then followed the fourth Empire of iron and clay. Its two legs represented its eastern and western capitals, and later its pagan and papal character. The Roman Empire extended from 30 B.C. until 476 A.D. Thus, we have delineated in this Image the four world-empires of past history.

THE FOUR BEASTS

In chapter 7 we have virtually the same picture, written under the Vision of four "Beasts." The glittering Image of gold, silver, brass and iron is now presented under the symbolism of four ravenous beasts,—which was the divine estimate of these four world-empires. These four empires were Gentile Powers, and according to Leviticus 26th chapter their domination was to last for "seven times." One "time" is 360 years; seven "times" is 2520 years. This period is called in the New Testament, Luke 21:24, "until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled." In Romans 11:25 we read, "until the fulness of the Gentilee be come in," referring to the same period. In other words, for 2520 years one or more of these world Gentile powers would have domination over other

peoples; Israel peoples. When the time of 2520 years expires, we are to look for and expect some great historic event to take place in the world in connection with these "times."

LION AND BEAR

The first "beast" was a Lion, with eagle wings, representing Babylon; the wings were plucked,—therefore the Lion could not fly. It may interest you to know that the modern successors to that Babylonian Empire is no other than Germany and kindred peoples.

The second Empire was represented by a ferocious Bear, in which Persia was stronger than Media, and it appeared with three ribs in its mouth. Today Russia is that Bear, which walks like a man; and you might say that Latvia, Estonia and Lithuania are three recent "ribs" in its mouth. This bear devoured much flesh. It is remarkable to know that one-sixth of the world lies within Russian boundary lines.

ALEXANDER

The third animal was a Leopard, with four wings, signifying the Greek Empire, which with unspeakable swiftness overcame the Persian Empire and ruled from 331 B.C. to 30 B.C., under Alexander the Great. I remember standing one day in Constantinople by the side of the marble sarcophagus in which are supposed to lie the ashes of that restless man. Bear in mind for the moment that that Empire included Greece, Macedonia, Syria and Egypt. Syria and Egypt are now brought under Israel dominion.

TERRIBLE BEAST

The fourth was a terrible beast,—a complex monstrosity which no one animal could represent. This was the Roman Empire, which ruled the world from 30 B.C., until 476 A.D., and you will note that today Italy, the heart of the Roman world, represents a very complex problem, with three men struggling for supremacy,—the King, Mussolini and the Pontiff. I pause here to say that the Roman Empire will never be revived, nor will there be any superman called "the Antichrist" who will rule the world for seven years; nor is there in existence such a religious organization as the "Gentile Bride of Christ."

"IN THE DAYS OF THESE KINGS"

You will find in Daniel 2 that "in the days of these kings" or rulers who ruled from 606 B.C. until 486

A.D., the God of heaven would set up a kingdom. It was to be a divinely instituted kingdom. It was never to be destroyed. It was not to be left to other peoples, and there would be no kingdom to follow it. It would continue to exist as long as time should last. It is stated that it would "stand forever." So it appears from the holy scriptures that *while these four world powers come into being and endure*, another kingdom would also be established.

Now let me give you a bit of history. Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon was given world-domain as a Gentile power in 606 B.C. From 604 to 585 B. C. the Jewish people were carried into Babylonian captivity, for 70 years. King Zedekiah was taken captive; his two sons were slain, and thus the Jewish Dynasty came to an end,—so thought the King of Babylon. *At this time* God began to build another Kingdom in another land, under unbelievable new conditions. Jeremiah, the great Jewish prophet, rescued two daughters of Zedekiah, took them into Egypt, and later carried one of them at least into Ireland,—by name Tea Tephi, who subsequently was married to the ruling prince of Ireland, who was of Israel blood; and thus, Israel's kingdom was re-established in Ireland, later in Scotland, and in 1298 A.D. in England, where the King was crowned in Westminster Abbey, wherein is to be found the literal throne of David today! And so, "in the days of these kings," God established a new empire, and that Empire was composed of the Tribes of Israel which had been preserved through the centuries, and now today are known in the world as the English-speaking peoples and their allies. Precisely 2520 years after Israel's captivity by the Assyrians, the little Island of England blossomed out into Empire; and in 1776 was born the American Republic. Thus, without knowing their identity, the ten-tribed Israel nations have now become America and Great Britain! We are not Gentiles but Israelites.

STONE KINGDOM

In Daniel 2:34 the prophet saw a stone cut out of a mountain, without human hands,—a supernatural event: and that stone increased in size until it filled the whole earth. It was written that whosoever fell on the stone would be broken; but whomsoever the stone fell upon would be ground to powder. Now who and what is this "Stone Kingdom"? Clearly it was not merely a human kingdom, but it is one builded and guided by the God of Israel; in other words,

a new kingdom—a kingdom with an unearthly origin. Jesus said, "My Kingdom is not out from this world." Here is a kingdom that shall fill the whole earth, never to be destroyed, and to "stand forever." Here are the dates of its origin and its imperial duration.

THE FIFTH KINGDOM

What is this kingdom? This, my friends, is the FIFTH KINGDOM of Daniel's prophecy. This is the "V" kingdom; and this kingdom is composed of Israel people; and the good news is that America and Great Britain compose the nucleus of this kingdom. The kingdom was set up at Mount Sinai in July, 1491, B.C. When we discover, as a religious tenet of faith and as a political principle of action, that America and Britain compose the Fifth Kingdom of the Israel people, that will be the greatest hour in our history, since July 4, 1776; to know *who* we are; to know our identity and our name; to know our place in the purposes of God; and to know why we are engaged in the present conflict will give us that calmness and courage, that faith and tenacity of purpose that shall eventually place the Stars and Stripes and the Union Jack on the ramparts of the Gentile nations and on the citadel of God's finished purposes!

We are moving out into world-dominion because we are Israel, and we battle for Jehovah. Our new war bases, our troops in Iceland, our convoys, our men in training, our gigantic national defense program,—all these are voices that proclaim that the FIFTH KINGDOM is mobilizing for the final world war, which shall determine the destiny of the world for a thousand years to come. *Rev. 20:1-6.*

"The Navy is ready," says Knox.

And now there leaps into life, visible to all the world, that strange, mysterious and mystic number "V" to tell the people of God and the Gentile nations of the world that the FIFTH KINGDOM has now begun to manifest itself. Across the world, God flings one more sign of the end of the age and the New World Order, which is the Fifth Kingdom; and therefore the letter "V" appears before the vision of all men! No wonder Germany has the "jitters" and is seeking to counteract the ill effect of this marvelous "V" upon her own people!

HANDWRITING ON THE WALL

You will note in Daniel 5th chapter that the

Babylonian King was impiously drinking wine from the golden goblets which came from the Temple of the living God. On the white plastered wall of his palace, there suddenly appeared, without warning, merely the fingers,—living fingers,—that wrote four words of doom, which struck consternation and despair to the hearts of the King and all who reveled in the palace halls! Just four strange, mystic words,—MENE, MENE, TEKEL, PERES. "Thou art weighed in the balances and art found wanting." That night Belshazzar was slain, and Babylon fell to rise no more. The Babylonian system of gold and silver was doomed. As it was then, so it is today.

And now there appears on the "wall" of the world at large, in the midst of her wickedness, another strange and mystic sign - numeral - symbol - the letter "V" — the number FIVE — that speaks a supernatural message, a message which the wicked will pass by but the wise shall understand. This letter, this word, this numeral, tells men everywhere that the old world-kingsdoms have run their course, and now arises in power the Stone Kingdom of Daniel, THE FIFTH KINGDOM, the last kingdom that this world shall ever know. And this letter "V" will appear over the whole earth, to tell us that Babylon, Persia, Greece and Rome are passing out of the picture for ever; that the Gentile Powers are tottering to their doom! How significant it becomes when we know that Russian and Prussia are ancient Babylon and Assyria!

PROPHECY FULFILLED

This "V" speaks eloquently of the fulfillment of the prophecies of Daniel chapters 2 and 7, in which thrones are cast down, 24 in 1914-1918 and 14 lately, and 4 more to follow,—Japan, Italy, Germany and Russia. This numeral "V" tells the Israel people everywhere who they are, and that they now arise to their true identity, and are preparing to take over world-dominion in this war of supremacy. We are the FIFTH KINGDOM; this "V" tells men everywhere that God is faithful to the Covenants which He made with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. This "V" means not only the Israel kingdom established, but around it shall be built the coming Kingdom of God on earth. FIVE is the KINGDOM number. Five is the mystic, strange, ineffable CHRIST number. Five is the prophetic number of Daniel. FIVE is the MILLENNIAL AGE number. I shall go even a step farther and say that this "V" is nothing short of

Christ's rule on earth, and every "V" that appears, large or small, in any part of the world, is but another voice saying "the kingdoms of this world are become the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ."

This letter that spells doom to dictators, that brings hope to Israel, that carries to fulfillment the prophecies of the age, and that bears in its very heart the Gospel of the Kingdom,—this may be the last material and visible sign given to the children of men concerning the things that are soon to occur.

"Behold, I come quickly."

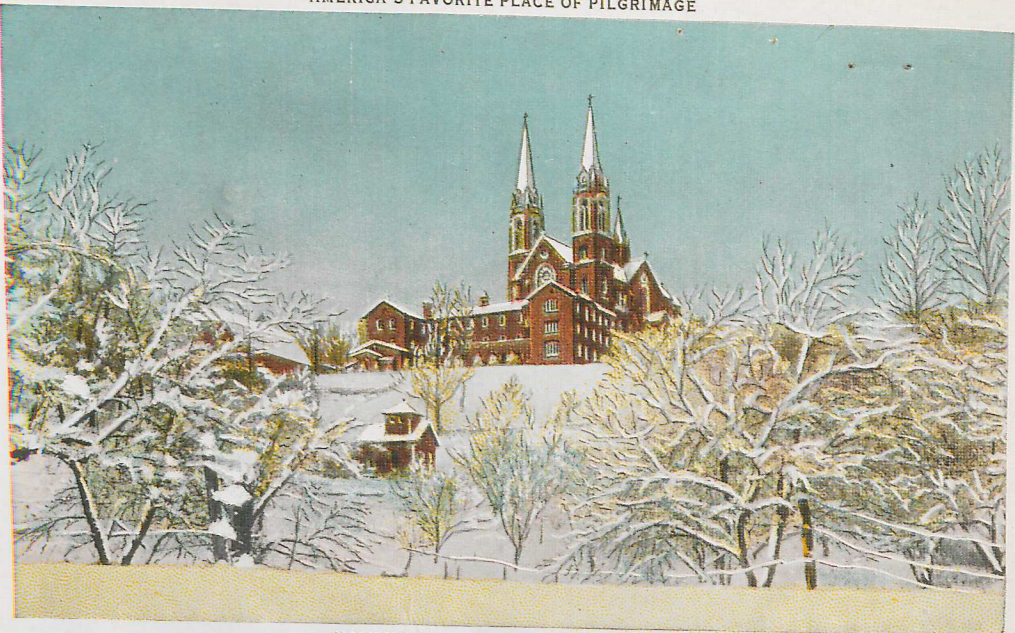

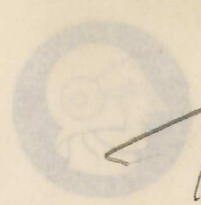

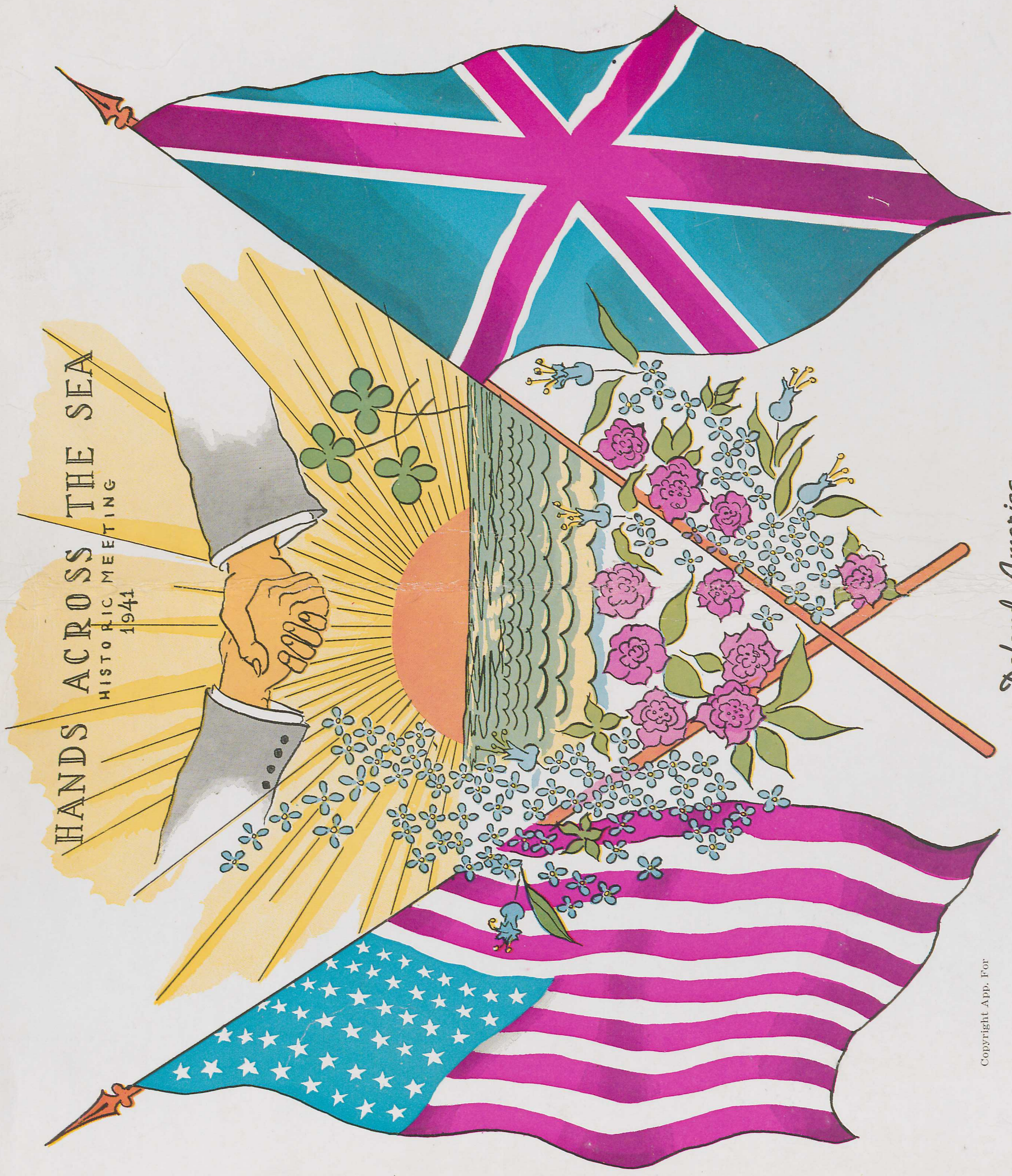

Murphy, Esq., ^{x 480} from a stewardess job of giving messages to the Pan American Union, ^{x 480} made and down and wrote a few lines in Washington, D. C. ^{EAK} to England. Only last week I learned that your mother, who was so happy and cheered by the sympathetic expressions of your mother, was killed in a bomb raid.

At the close of the Fair we visited the Swedish exhibit and Mrs. Roosevelt saw a straw hat which she liked very much. I said "Mrs. Roosevelt, if that hat fits you, I will give you a present". She smiled and replied in a most joyful way "Mr. Murphy, if you only knew how long it took to arrange for it, I will be - however, I am willing to take you up on your generous offer. The hat was perfect and only last May I received a note from the Post of an invitation to visit the Fair and see how beautiful the new hat.

My dear Mr. President:

I well know what your duties must be at this present crisis, and that your time must be given only to matters of great importance. I also know of the grief that is yours in the loss of your dear mother who was my very good friend. It is with this in mind that I take the liberty of writing these consoling thoughts of your mother.

I came to know your mother during the New York World's Fair of 1939 and 1940, while I was detailed to the Pan American Union pavilion. I do not believe there was ever a time that Mrs. Roosevelt visited the Fair that she did not come to see me or invite me to tea at the Federal pavilion. We spent many happy days together visiting the other pavilions; pavilions of nations that were deeply grieved over their homeland and the present war. In one pavilion we talked with a lady who was writing her aged mother in England. Here we heard a most pathetic story of how the war had separated her family - the husband being in Ecuador and three small children with the grandmother in England. Your mother with tears in her eyes, and fatigued from a strenuous day of giving autographs and standing for pictures to be made, sat down and wrote a few consoling words to this lady in England. Only last week I learned that this lady, who was so happy and consoled by the sympathetic expressions of your mother, was killed in a bomb-raid.

At the close of the Fair we visited the Ecuadorian exhibit and Mrs. Roosevelt saw a straw hat which she liked very much. I said "Mrs. Roosevelt, if that hat fits you, I will make you a present". Whereupon she replied in a most jovial manner, "Mr. Murphy, if you only knew how long it took to arrange the chapeau I have on - however, I am willing to take you up on your generous offer". The hat was perfect and only last May I received a note in the form of an invitation to visit Hyde Park and see how becoming was the new hat.

In 1939 we had a Pan American Day at the Fair. It was also your mother's birthday. Many photographs were taken on that day, and I thought you might like to have the one which I enclose. I also have a very nice color-movie in sound which was taken on that day, in which your mother appears several times.

I also want to take this opportunity to say how proud we Americans are of you, my dear Mr. President, and the wonderful work you are accomplishing. That God will guide you in your work is now assured in that He has called your mother to be with Him in His heavenly home.

May God bless you with continued good health, and guide you in your strenuous tasks. These are my sincere wishes for you always.
