


INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.
2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.

5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No 6.

6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

1. The body of Dileo 2413056 Rocco, Pvt. Co.K, 148th Inf. is buried in Gr. 4, Block C, Row 1, Flanders Field American Cemetery, Waergghem, Belgium.

2. Prior to the date on which the body of Pvt. Dileo was placed in Gr. 4, Block C, Row 1, the remains of Pvt. 1cl. George Crawford rested in this grave, same having been exhumed from the Abeele British Military Cemetery, Poperinghe, Belgium. Subsequent to reburial of Pvt. 1cl Crawford, it was ascertained that this case was a "do not disturb" and the remains were exhumed from Gr. 4, Block C, Row 1 Flanders Field Cemetery and again reburied in the Abeele British Military Cemetery, Poperinghe, Belgium where same are now buried.

3. The remains of Pvt. 1st cl. George Crawford, however, will be exhumed from the Abeele British Military Cemetery and reburied in Flanders Field American Cemetery within the next ten days, this action being taken in accordance with your directions contained in Par. 2, 1st Ind. dated January 2, 1923, File No. 293.8 C-R.




