Informant was an eye witness. Ground was held. Death not instantaneous. Pvt DAHL had a wound four or five inches long in the abdomen, caused by shellfire. The next morning the Corporal Carter saw the body lying in the same place, but did not identify positively as Pvt DAHL. Informant does not know where body was buried. Corporal Carter knew Christian name and Initials of deceased. Informant was in same platoon with Pvt DAHL for almost a year. There was no other man with the same name in company nor battalion. Deceased was simply known as "DAHL". Consider Cpl Carter accurate and intelligent.

Information concerning death of Pvt DAHL has always been fragmentary.



The Quartermaster General desires you to be informed that the permanent grave of **Private Albert I/ Dahl, Company B, 363rd Infantry,** is **Grave 40, Row 3, Block D, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon (Meuse), France.**

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. Headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

You are assured in effecting removal of the remains, the utmost care and reverence were exercised and more than willingly accorded by those who performed this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.



Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

**DENTURES (PLATES)** ..... Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."
