



Subject: Return of remains and details of death.

1. With further reference to your letter of March 31, requesting information concerning the death of the late Private William G. Dailey, #2210940, M. G. Company, 356th Infantry, I beg leave to advise that a report has been received in this office which shows this soldier treated as follows:


"Dec. 29, 1918 to March 6, 1919, endocarditis, effort syndrome; Feb. 12, 1919 tuberculosis, pulmonary, chronic advanced, apex right lung, upper left lung; died 1.00 A. M. March 6, 1919, tuberculosis pulmonary, chronic active, advanced apex right lung, upper lobe left lung, tuberculosis broncho-pneumonia with cavity formation."

2. The report also shows that the remains of this soldier were interred in Cemetery #22, Grave #272A, American Cemetery Savenary, Loire Inferieure, and that the grave is marked with a cross with identification tag attached, the other identification tag being buried with the body.

3. You are further advised that the card expressing the desire of the relatives in this case to have the remains of the deceased returned to the United States, is on file and will be referred to when the transfer of the remains is begun.

4. For your further information it may be added that a bill was introduced in the French Assembly to prohibit the removal of the bodies for three years, beginning January 1, 1919. This bill has not yet passed. The French have an agreement with the other allies not to remove the bodies of their deceased soldiers for three years, but the United States has not agreed to this and hopes that the proposed bill will not become a law. The War Department is negotiating with the French Government, through the State Department, to obtain permission to bring the bodies home as soon as practicable.
