There was a few of us men bathing in a canal near Longeau, France, on or about 25th August. I saw Dalamont jump into the water and in about a minute, he went under. Two men jumped in and pulled him out of the water. He was alive when he was rescued. He was taken to the first aid station and from there, sent to a hospital, where he died a day or so later. I do not remember the exact date, but it was some time in the later part of August.

Died August 21st 1918 from congestion of the lungs ( Record at Statistical Section Hdqrs, 3rd Division).
