The records for the first Dale are straight as burial, organization, serial number, emergency address, and A.G.O. disposition card.

The records for the second John Dale are straight as to burial, organization, serial number, emergency address, but not as to A.G.O. disposition card, which was erroneously sent to the emergency address of the first John Dale; also, the serial number thereon is incorrect, though telephonic communication with A.G.O. elicited the information that the number 1924924 was used or associated with the records of John Dale, No 2, the last three figures of same being the last three figures of the correct number; also John Dale No 2 is mentioned in his records as having belonged to the Pioneer Det 2nd Engrs.

There is no third John Dale with any casualty either in the records of the A.G.O. or with the B.W.R.I.

You will note that the A.G.O. card for Case #2 gives the Serial number 1924924 and the Organization as Pioneer Detachment 2nd Engrs. It is possible that this card may belong to another soldier other than the one named in Case #2. However a search of 5x8 cards fails to show another Dale, John.

Note that both A.G.O. disposition cards are signed by the same man, William M. Dale of Jackson, Ky. It appears that this is an error on the part of A.G.O. as we have had numerous cases where cards for two different soldiers were sent to the same address. Will you please have an investigation made of these two cases?
