

On the 11th. October 1918, at about 5:00 A.M. the 2nd. Battalion of the 326th. Infantry made an attack on ST. JUVIN (a small village North of the ARGONNE Forest), "G" Company being the leading company. As we crossed the AIRE river the enemy opened fire on us and we deployed on the North bank of the river. Davies, being a Runner, was with me and was lying within a couple feet of me - all of us lying on the ground facing the enemy - when during an extremely heavy hail of M.G. bullets one bullet struck Davies on the top of the head, piercing his Steel-helmet and going into his head. I heard him give a short gasp and say "Oh." and turned, asking him what was wrong, but he was already dead then, his death being instantaneous and painfree. I was evacuated to the hospital shortly after, and did not see him buried, but I am sure he was buried with the rest of men who fell that day in an American Graveyard by a cross-road in St-Juvin.

2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.
3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.
4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.

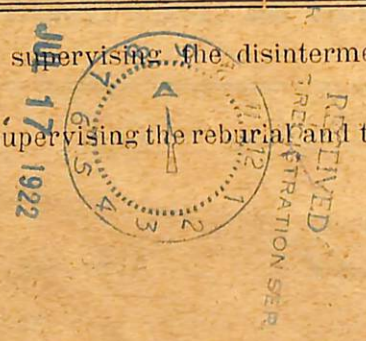

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. 6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
