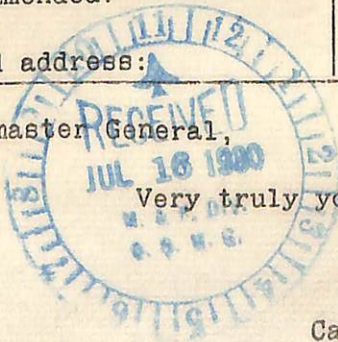

It is regretted that your request for the shipment of the remains of your son, the late Private Gaetano D'Orio, Company B, 325th Infantry, to you in Italy, was received too late for compliance, owing to a decision made by The Secretary of War. In your letter you state that you submitted your request on September 10th, 1921. It is thought that you made an error with reference to the date, for the records show that your request to the European Office was dated September 28, 1922. You will note from letter of July 10, 1924, that The Secretary of War ruled that no original requests for the disposition of a body would be considered after April 1st, 1923.

The Department will gladly consent to the removal of the remains to you at private expense, should this be your desire. In this event, kindly advise the Chief, American Graves Registration Service, Q.M.C., in Europe, 20 Rue Molitor, Paris, (16eme) France.

Please be assured that you will have no cause to regret that you left the remains of your son buried among his comrades in the Meuse-Argonne American, France, for the grave will be appropriately marked and maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the supreme sacrifice made by this hero.

Dear Madam:

The Quartermaster General desires that receipt be acknowledged of your letter of June 24, 1924.

The Department regrets that it cannot comply with your request for the shipment of the remains of your gallant son, the late Private Gaetano D'Oric, Company B, 325th Infantry, to you at Government expense, at this late date. The decision to fix a date beyond which no changes of requests would be favorably considered was delayed as long as possible in view of the progress of the work in France. This date was August 15th, 1921. The Secretary of War has also ruled that no original requests for the disposition of a body would be considered after April 1st, 1922.

The necessity for making the decisions is regretted, but you will understand that some time limit had to be fixed for the acceptance of requests. Otherwise the work would have required an excessive time for completion and the expense be unreasonably increased.

It will be seen that should an exception be made in the case of Private D'Oric, how unfair it would be to other relatives who have sent in requests after the time limit for acceptance. The Department will, however, gladly consent to the removal of the body to Italy, at private expense, should this be your wish. In this event, kindly address a letter to the Chief, American Graves Registration Service, Q. M. C., in Europe, 20 Rue Molitor, Paris, (16eme) France. He will assist you in every way possible towards expediting the removal of the body to you, without involving any expense to the Government.

The Quartermaster General desires that you be informed that the permanent grave of Private Gaetano D'Orio, Company B, 325th Infantry, is Grave 9, Row 25, Block B, Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, Romagne-sous-Montfaucon (Meuse), France.

This is one of the permanent American military cemeteries to be maintained by this Government in Europe. Each grave will be marked by a headstone of white marble, of suitable design, with name, rank, division, organization, date of soldier's death and State from which he came. The headstones will be placed at all graves in connection with the improvement work now in progress, as soon as possible and without waiting for special action or request on the part of relatives.

In effecting removal, the utmost care and reverence were exacted and more than willingly accorded by those performing this sacred duty. The grave of the deceased will be perpetually maintained by this Government in a manner befitting the last resting place of our heroes.

With great grief I am respectfully appealing to you for the return of the body of my son, Dorio Gaetano, who died while on duty serving with the American Army in France.

As a brave hero, after having served in Libbia 1911-1912, he came home. A few months later however, he left for America and arrived at Mamaroneck, N.Y. the 18th of May 1913, which place he made his permanent residence. About the end of 1916 Dorio was registered and a short time after drafted into the U.S. Army. Glad and proud as an old soldier, he was assigned to Co. B, 325th Infantry and soon after left for France. There he went through several battles in Argonne where he died in action October 1, 1918 and was buried there. the remains of

Having been informed by the American Consul in Rome that/all the Italians who served and died in France while serving with the American Army would be sent to their native country if their families so wished and having seen on September 27th the arrival here of two bodies from France, I am requesting also that the body of my poor son, Dorio Gaetano of Co. B, 325th Infantry, A.E.F, who died in France Oct. 1, 1918, be sent to me here in Italy.

I am sending you here enclosed the picture of his grave, his full name being legible on the cross, so that I may help you to locate the grave, and as soon as possible I would ask you kindly to send him to me as I am crying days and nights for my brave hero.

I hope that you will be able to locate the body of my son and to send him to me here in Roccasecca the same as you sent the body of Gazzelone and Roso.

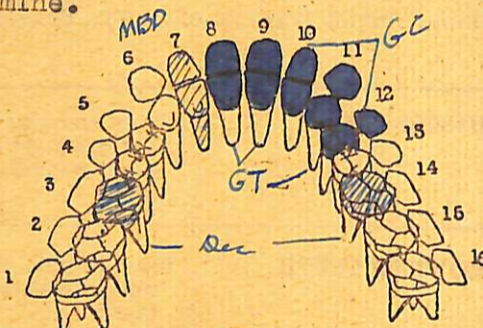
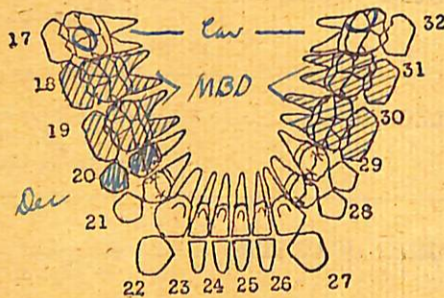


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

1. Show soldier's name, serial number, rank and organization, and by whom disinterred and reburied.

2. Give date and accurate information as to location from which the body was disinterred and the group and unit which made disinterment.

3. Give date and accurate information as to location of reburial and the group and unit which made reburial, and how reburial was made—in casket, wooden box, etc.

4. State to what degree decomposition has progressed, whether recognition is possible, and how the body was originally buried—in a casket, box, burlap, etc. This statement should be as complete as possible.

5. (a) State whether identification tags were found buried with body and on grave marker by reporting "Yes" or "No".

(b) State whether or not body appears to have been a hospital case. Were any identifying articles found in or on body or grave? List any personal effects, letters, money-order receipts, and the like found on body or in grave. Give any and all information which it is thought might be of use in identifying the body, other than that tabulated under Item No. 6.

6. Give all information as to body description and dental chart as nearly correctly as the condition of the body will allow. Items (e) and (f) under the body description are very important and should be very complete. The dental chart is also very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

FILLINGS.....Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus:



CARIES (CAVITIES).....Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus:



DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."
