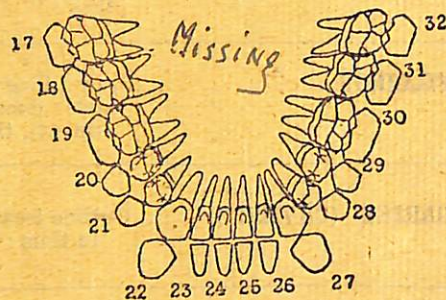
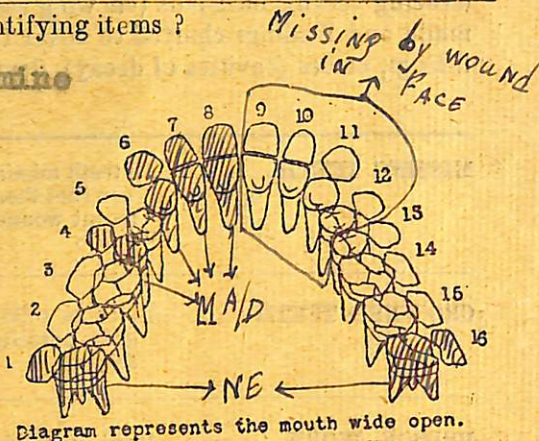

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PROPER COMPLETION OF G. R. S. FORM NO. 16-A**

Enter information, as noted below, on reverse side of sheet in the *corresponding numbered space*. This form is supplemental to and is to be forwarded with G. R. S. Form 1-a, reporting reburial locations. To be used in answer to Question 26, Form 114, in case no means of identification on body.

Receipt is acknowledged of your communication of recent date relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act approved March 2, 1929, as amended May 15, 1930.

It has been held that in order for a woman to have stood in loco parentis to a deceased member of the American forces, she must have provided for him as a lawful father, namely, providing food, shelter and clothing.

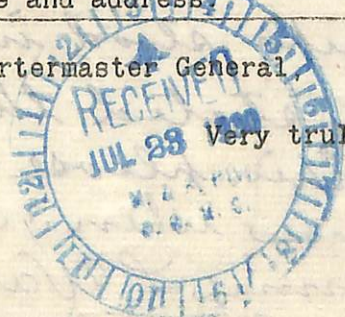

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of recent date relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act of March 2, 1929.

In reply you are advised that the Act of March 2, 1929, provides that an invitation for a pilgrimage shall be extended the mothers and widows of the members of the military and naval forces of the United States who are buried in the cemeteries in Europe, but it does not contain any provision which will permit of anyone making the pilgrimage in the place of the mother or widow.

If you can qualify under the provisions of Section 4 (a) of the Act of March 2, 1929, which states, "or any woman who stood in loco parentis to the deceased member of the military or naval forces," and have not made a previous visit to the grave of your brother, you will be entitled to make this pilgrimage. If this be the case, please advise.

If, however, you can not qualify under this provision, it is regretted to have to advise you that you are not eligible under the Act to make the pilgrimage.

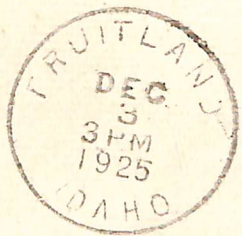

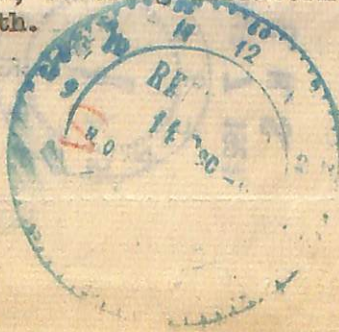

Body buried in uniform. No coffin. Two collar ornaments - one "U.S." - the other crossed rifles, bearing insignia of Company I, 125th Infantry, were found on the blouse. Both feet and lower jaw missing. Head shattered and upper teeth shot away. Nothing further found on this body.

4. Grave 251, section H, Plot 5, American Cemetery #608, Seringes-et-Nesles, (Aisne) supposed to contain the remains of Private George W. Allen, Co. L, 125th Infantry, was opened in an effort to determine who is actually buried therein, with the following results:

Body buried in uniform. No coffin. One collar ornament bearing the insignia of Company C, 33rd Inf., found on blouse. (Probably a National Guard insignia.) One tag was found on the body inscribed as follows: "Edward COLLINS. #263880." Rank and organization had been stamped out. The head, both feet and left leg were missing.

Grave 211. Sect. F. Pt. 4.

Body was buried in uniform, wrapped in burlap, in a box coffin. The remains were almost entirely decomposed and showed evidence of having been exhumed and examined recently. This man had been wounded in the face, Lower jaw was missing. Three feet were found in the coffin. Nothing further found on the body.

2. When grave 250, section H, plot 5, was opened, it was found that the cross marking this grave was midway between two bodies lying aside by side. In order to determine which body belonged to this cross, the earth on either side was removed until it was found that one body was located directly beneath the cross marking grave 251, and another under the cross marking grave 249. Without uncovering the entire trench it is impossible to state which of the two bodies belonged under cross 250, or whether there are more bodies in this plot that there are crosses. Both of these bodies were exhumed, with the following results:

Body between crosses 250 and 251:

This body was buried in uniform and wrapped in slicker, forming a bundle about 4 ft. long. An identification tag was found on the body which, although corroded was, with the aid of a little acid, made decipherable and the following inscription read: Pvt. Henry W. GRASHOFF, Co.M, 168th Inf. (The middle figure in organization was not clear)

Body between crosses 250 and 249:

This body, which was doubled up in a bundle and almost entirely decomposed was buried in uniform without coffin. An identification tag was found, partly corroded. The following inscription could be read: John ---O---, #263816. Inscription on cross marking grave 250 reads as follows: David T. DAVIS, Pvt. Co.D, 151st M.G.Bn. Identification tag on cross reads: David T. DAVIS, Pvt. Co.D, 151st M.G. Bn. #114427.

It is thought that the body buried between crosses 249 and 250 belonged to Company K, or Company L, 125th Inf., as the number for Robert BANNISTER, Pvt., Co.L, 125th Inf., is 263867.

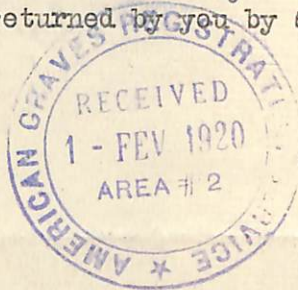

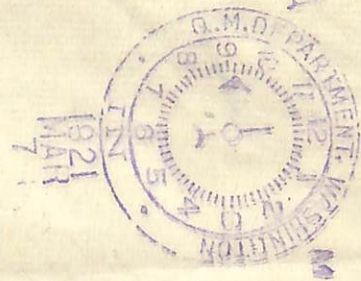

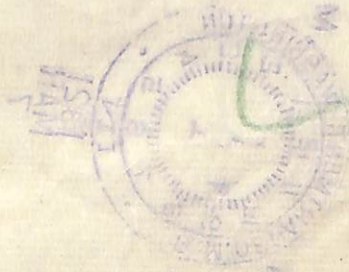

Death occurred a few minutes later. (Sgt., Howard P. Achey, Co. D, 151st M.G. Bn., Informant.) No burial mentioned.

One Form 16 shows reburial from Grave #118, Cemetery #565, into Grave #250, Plot #5, Section H, Cemetery #608. No tags on body or cross. Information taken from Grave Marker. Reported by Forms 1-A #9639 and #11846.

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.

### MISSING TEETH

All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be scratched out, thus:



### CROWNED TEETH

Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, or gold and porcelain), thus:



### BRIDGE WORK

Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge) thus:



### FILLINGS

Draw filling on tooth accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus:



### CARIES (CAVITIES)

Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus:



### DENTURES (PLATES)

Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp"
