The Quartermaster General desires you be advised that the investigation in the case of your late son, Private Early Davis, S# 2595632, Coast Artillery Corps, has been successfully concluded. The body has been identified in Grave 12, Row 4, Block C, Brookwood American Cemetery, Surrey, England, where it will remain permanently interred. All bodies of Otranto victims recovered on the coast of Scotland, have been removed to the Brookwood Cemetery.

This cemetery is one of those to be perpetually maintained by this Government and the grave will be marked by a white marble headstone, inscribed with the name of the soldier, his rank, regiment, division, date of death and state from which he came. This will be done without any special action or request by you.

Dear Sir:

The Quartermaster General desires you to be informed that this office is conducting an investigation in an endeavor to identify as many as possible of the unknown American soldiers buried overseas. With this in mind, the following facts are communicated to you with request that you furnish any information which you may have which would assist in identifying the body of your son, the late Private Early Davis, Ft. Screvens September Automatic Replacement Draft, C.A.C. Unit #1.

The records here show that he was on board the Steamship Otranto when it was sunk on October 6, 1918, off the shore of Scotland. The bodies recovered, which were not identified, were thoroughly searched for means of identification, their finger prints taken and a record made of their dental work.

This letter is to request that you secure, if possible, a chart from the dentist who may have treated your son prior to his entry into the Service, showing any dental work which he may have had done. If this cannot be obtained, it is requested that you advise this office of any dental work which you recall your son may have had, such as crowns, - the number, general location in the mouth - fillings, missing teeth or extra teeth. Also, please advise if you recall whether or not your son had any bones that had been broken.

Any information which you may be able to furnish will be appreciated by this Department and will assist in the investigation being instituted. Kindly reply as soon as possible, using the inclosed envelope which requires no postage.

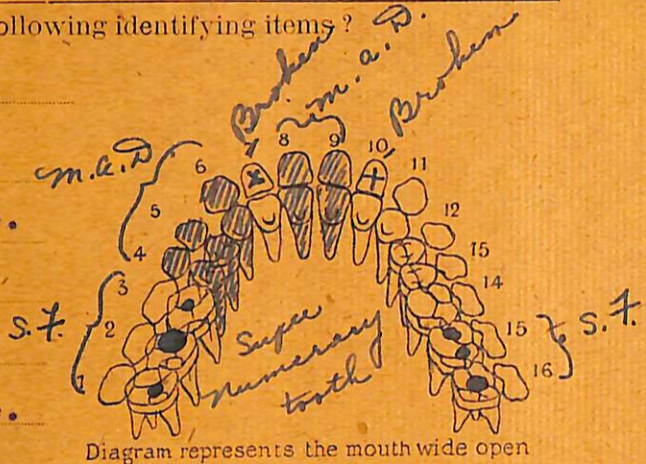
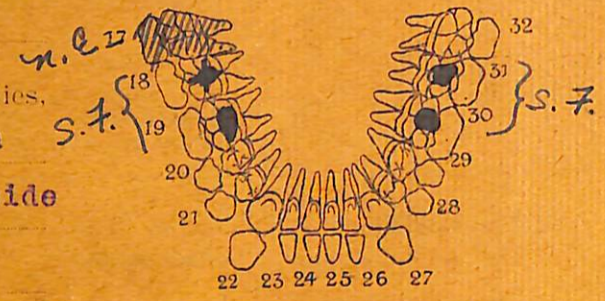


Diagram represents the mouth wide open

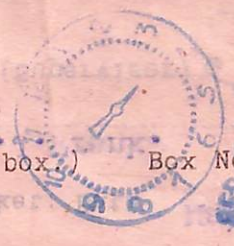
