Dear Sir:-

In order that the records of this office may be complete in the matter of final disposition of the remains of the late Pvt.1/c Glen Debroux, #3747583, Co.G, 343rd Inf., it is necessary that you advise whether the deceased is survived by a widow and children, giving the name and address of each. If he was not married, kindly forward a statement to that effect. This information is necessary due to the fact that instructions for disposition of remains can be issued by this office only upon properly executed authority of the legal next of kin; and in this case if the soldier was married, the widow (and if she has been divorced or remarried, the children of the late soldier) would be the legal next of kin.
