



Receipt is acknowledged of your reply to the form letter sent you from this office relative to the pilgrimage of mothers and widows to the cemeteries of Europe, authorized by the Act of March 2, 1929, in which you indicate you stood in loco parentis to the late Arthur Dehart.

It has been held that in order for a woman to have stood in loco parentis to a deceased veteran of the American forces, she must have taken the part of a legal father in providing food, clothing and shelter for a period of not less than five years prior to the service man reaching eighteen years of age.

The information contained in your communication does not indicate that you provided for this late veteran as a father would have, and it is regretted to advise you are not eligible within the meaning of the law to make a pilgrimage to his grave at the expense of the Government.

If he was survived by a widow who has since remarried it is also requested that a statement to that effect be made.
