"I saw Pvt. Depue's body lying on the bank of the railroad farthest from the Marne which ran parallel with the railroad at this point. It was on July 15th in the afternoon during the Chateau-Thierry Drive. He had been killed in the morning. Cpl. Eicher of the same company was with him when he was killed, for he told me that Pvt. Depue was using his automatic rifle against the Germans when they took it from him and turned it against him, piercing him with about twenty or more shots. I know nothing about the burial of the body. Depue was a little short man with heavy whiskers, about 25 years old. He came from Philadelphia." (Informant appeared reasonably accurate and intelligent)

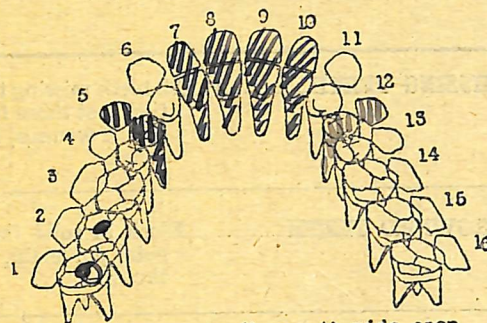
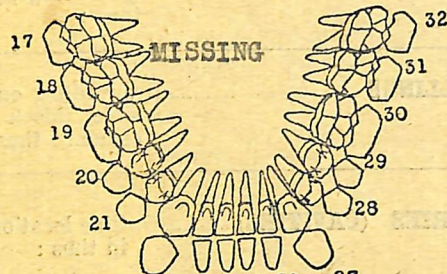


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.
