The Transportation Service will furnish transportation covering journey of escort from Hoboken, N.J., to San Francisco, California, and covering shipment of remains from Hoboken, N.J., to destination set after each name. The Finance Service will pay escort a per diem allowance, in advance, at the authorized rate, (4 rations plus \$.50) for seven (7) days, as provided in paragraph 1223-(g), Army Regulations, it being impracticable for the Government to furnish subsistence in kind. 


Diagram represents the mouth wide open.

DENTURES (PLATES).....Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."







The Argonne American Cemetery at Remagne-sous-Montfaucon, Department of the Meuse, where the remains of this soldier are interred, lies within the "Zone of the Armies", where under our agreement with the French government, operations for the removal of our soldier dead, will not commence before September 15, 1920.

3. You will be notified by telegram upon shipment of the remains from a European port, and again upon arrival of the body at Hoboken, thus enabling you to make the necessary plans for final burial.






