Killed Sept. 28th, 1918

William Phillips, a man's man, acted as scout for his battle group on the Argonne-Meuse offensive Sept. 26-30. He was tireless in his efforts and proved himself a ~~true~~ truly brave man. He was killed at 11:30 A. M. on Sept. 28th, just after an unsuccessful attack on the village of Cierges, in which the Germans were made to suffer heavily. Even when dying he motioned for his comrades to go on, thus showing his spirit to the end. He died within a few moments - a soldier who paid the last supreme sacrifice bravely. He is buried somewhere near the village of Cierges.



Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of September 5, 1930, relative to the pilgrimage authorized by Congress in the Act approved March 2, 1929, and amended May 15, 1930.

As stated in letter from this office of August 25, 1930, it has been held that in order for a woman to have stood in loco parentis to a deceased veteran, she must have provided for him as a lawful father, namely, providing food, shelter and clothing, for a period of not less than five years at any time prior to his becoming eighteen years of age. As your brother supported and took care of you, it is not possible for you to have taken the place of a parent in your relation to him during such period.

In view of the foregoing you are not eligible under the provisions of the existing law to make the pilgrimage to Europe at the expense of the Government.
