These are the official rules and regulations for the 2027 Film Independent Spirit Awards. Please read the rules and regulations in their entirety prior to filling out the submission form.

Beginning August 18, you are invited to upload your screener to our submission partner Vision Media before submission form is completed; you **must** upload screener within 48 hours of form submission for title to be in consideration. Contact Drea Clark (dclark@filmindependent.org) for screener upload deadline extension. Approved titles must be uploaded by the provided extension date for title to be in consideration.

NOMINATING GUIDELINES

The Spirit Awards nominations are determined by three (3) committees: American Narrative, Documentary and International. In addition, Film Independent awards three (3) Emerging Filmmaker Awards: Someone to Watch, Truer than Fiction and the Producers Award. These committees, which are assembled by Film Independent, consist of industry professionals including directors, writers, producers, actors, cinematographers, editors, casting directors, film critics, film programmers and members of Film Independent's Board of Directors.

The Spirit Awards seeks to celebrate the year's highest achievements and culturally resonant independent filmmaking. Any variations of the rules or guidelines are at the sole discretion of the Nominating Committees and Film Independent. The Spirit Awards Nominating Committees apply the following guidelines in making those selections:

- Uniqueness of vision, innovation, diversity / Original, provocative subject matter / Economy of means

RULES FOR ELIGIBILITY

1. All submitted films must be at least 70 minutes long.
2. Cost of completed film after tax incentives, and including post production expenses, should be less than \$30 million. For verification purposes, all films with total budgets exceeding \$25 million, or films with budgets under \$1,000,000 and applying for the Cassavetes Award, are required to submit top sheets from their Final Cost Reports. Absolutely no exceptions to this requirement will be made.
3. Eligible films must have either:
 - a. Been programmed in 2026 at one of the following nine film festivals: Hot Docs, New Directors/New Films, New York Film Festival, Sundance Film Festival, SXSW Film Festival, Telluride Film Festival, Toronto International Film Festival, Tribeca Film Festival, Berlin International Film Festival OR
 - b. Been shown in a commercial theater in the United States for at least one week (seven consecutive days) between January 1, 2026 – December 31, 2026 OR
 - c. Been available through commercial streaming or VOD service between January 1, 2026 —December 31, 2026. Films must have participated in a fee-based service where a publicly accessible “rental/purchase” or “subscription” was required; virtual film festival screenings at non-qualifying film festivals are ineligible.
4. Although films may be submitted in any year they are eligible, such as the year they screen in a qualifying festival or the year of their theatrical / streaming release, once a film is nominated (in any category minus the Emerging Filmmaker Award categories: Someone to Watch, Producers Award, Truer Than Fiction), it is no longer eligible for submission in subsequent years. Films that qualify through a festival screening and will be released the first quarter of 2027 are encouraged to submit this year. Films that qualify through a festival screening but will not be released until after the first quarter of 2026 are encouraged to submit next year, for the 2028 Awards. For any questions or clarifications, please contact the Nominations office.
5. Except for the category of Best International Film and Best Documentary, all nominations go to American productions. The Spirit Awards defines an “American production” as:
 - a. A film in which U.S. citizens or permanent residents are credited in at least two of the following categories of responsibilities: director, writer or producer. This can be fulfilled by one person with multiple duties or by separate individuals; OR
 - b. The film is set in significant part in the United States and/or has significant American content.

The Spirit Awards Nominating Committees and Film Independent reserve the right to determine if a film qualifies as International or American Narrative.

If requested by Film Independent, the submitter (filmmaker or distributor) must supply proof of citizenship or permanent residence of filmmaker(s). Films that have been asked to but do not submit proof of residence or financing will not be considered.
6. Documentary films are only eligible for Best Documentary; international narrative films are only eligible for Best International Film.
7. Eligibility for all awards shall be determined by credits as they appear on the screen. If a film is determined ineligible for any reason or submitted in the wrong category, the Spirit Awards Nominations Staff will contact the submitter (filmmaker or distributor).

CATEGORY INFORMATION

The final categories for which a film may be nominated are at the sole discretion of the Spirit Awards Nominating Committees and Film Independent. Films may be eligible in several categories but will be nominated only once in each category type (e.g., a film cannot be nominated for *both* Best Feature and Best First Feature). Except for the category of Best International Feature, Best International First Feature and Best Documentary, only American productions are eligible. For the purposes of this submission form, all fiction films are referred to as "narrative."

Best Documentary: Both American and International documentaries are eligible in this category. The award is given to the director(s) and producer(s). Films submitted in this category are not eligible in any other category

Best International Feature: All International narrative films, including films made by first-time directors, are eligible in this category. The award is given to the film's director(s). Films submitted in this category are not eligible in any other category beyond Best International First Feature (if first-time director).

Best International First Feature: Eligibility determined by the director(s) for whom this is his/her/their narrative feature directorial debut.

All American Narrative films will be considered for the following categories:

Best Feature: All films, including films made by first-time directors, are eligible for Best Feature. Award is given to the producer(s). Co-producers, executive producers, associate producers and line producers are not eligible.

Best First Feature: Eligibility determined by the director(s) for whom this is his/her/their narrative feature directorial debut, though awarded to both the director(s) and producer(s) of the film.

Best First Screenplay: Writer(s) for whom this is his/her/their first produced feature screenplay are eligible in this category. Screenwriters with "Story By" credit may be submitted.

Best Screenplay: All American narrative feature screenplays, including screenplays by first-time writers, are eligible in this category. Screenwriters with "Story By" credit may be submitted.

John Cassavetes Award: Awarded to the best American narrative feature with a budget under \$1,000,000 and given to the film's producer(s), director(s), and writer(s). For verification purposes, all films submitted in this category are required to submit the top sheet from the film's Final Cost Report. The winning film in this category will be determined by the American narrative nominating committee.

Best Director: Directors of all American narrative features, including first-time directors, are eligible in this category.

Best Cinematography: All American narrative features are eligible in this category.

Best Editor: All American narrative features are eligible in this category.

Best Lead/Supporting/Breakthrough Performance: All American narrative features are eligible in these categories. Only actors in "American Narrative" films are eligible in acting categories.

The Robert Redford Environmental Vision Award, in partnership with The Redford Center: All American narrative features and Scripted Series that center climate themes or environmental issues—or feature a lead character grappling with them—as the core of their narrative are eligible in this category. Awarded to the film's producer(s), director(s), and writer(s) OR series' creator(s), executive producer(s), co-executive producer(s). Eligible films/series must explore an environmental issue—whether it's climate change and solutions for people and the planet; innovation that challenges defeatist narratives around environmental crises; fresh perspectives or artistic approaches that redefine traditional environmental storytelling; systemic bias and injustice in environmental policy; cultural practices rooted in traditional and ancestral knowledge; or efforts to protect and restore land, water, biodiversity and natural resources. Alternatively, films/series may feature a lead character grappling with climate themes at the heart of their journey. Priority will be given to works that embrace an entertainment-first approach to climate storytelling, engaging audiences emotionally and intellectually, while inspiring a sense of possibility and agency in climate solutions, particularly through characters and genres that challenge conventional expectations. One (1) film OR series will be awarded.

REQUIRED MATERIALS

The 2027 Spirit Awards have a submission form site (submittable.com) and a screener upload site (submissions.visionmedia.com).

SUBMISSION FORM SITE

- In addition to contact information, production details, and credits, the submission form site will require:
 - Representative production stills from the film (preferred formats: JPEG, TIFF, PNG)
 - Film Synopsis (100 words or less)
- Final cost report top sheet (required for all films with total budgets exceeding \$25 million, and films with budgets under \$1,000,000 that are applying for the John Cassavetes Award).
- Demographics/diversity information is requested but not required.

SCREENER UPLOAD SITE

- A screener of your submission will need to be uploaded in its entirety to our partner screening portal, Vision Media. DVDs or third party links will not be accepted. The Vision Media portal will open for screener uploads on **August 18, 2026**.
- You are invited to upload your screener before your submission form is completed, provided the titles are identically listed in both submission and upload. You **must** upload screener to Vision Media within 48 hours of form submission for title to be in consideration. You only need to upload screener once even if in consideration for multiple categories (i.e. both Documentary and Truer Than Fiction).

SUBMISSION PAYMENT

Payment can be accepted via credit card or ACH for the required submission fees. You can pay via credit card per individual submissions on the Submittable submission form platform.

If you have multiple submissions that you'd prefer to pay in bulk via ACH, please select "I Am Submitting Multiple" in the Payment section of Submittable; Film Independent will follow up with an invoice request by Sept 29. Spirit Awards invoice numbers **MUST** be included in ACH payment, and all invoiced payments are due by October 29 for titles to remain in consideration.

AFTER NOMINATIONS

Should you receive a nomination for the 2027 Spirit Awards, the primary contact for the film is responsible for supplying all required materials (including nominee and representative contact information, trailer, theme song, title cards and clips) to Spirit Awards Production **NO LATER** than January 2, 2027.

A materials request will be sent to all Nominee primary contacts by December 2026 once Nominations are announced. Up to five Spirit Award trophies will be provided per category to winning teams; additional trophies will be available for purchase for winning teams larger than five. Should a nominee win and not appear at 2027 Spirit Awards, trophy will be sent to distribution representative.

VOTING AND CONSIDERATION

Film Independent Members are the official voting body that determines the winners for the Spirit Awards. Membership is open to all and the community is composed of filmmakers and film lovers from all over the world. To join Film Independent visit www.filmindependent.org/join.

Nominee consideration is essential for the discovery and appreciation of all titles. During consideration, Members will have access to watch nominees in the Nominee Screening Room, powered by Vision Media.

NOMINEE SCREENING PROGRAM

Spirit Award-nominated titles **will be required** to participate in the Nominee Screener program for a \$4,200 fee, which provides voters with digital screener access to watch nominees in our secure digital screening room, powered by Vision Media. THIS INCLUDES ALL ENGLISH-LANGUAGE FILMS AS WELL AS ALL INTERNATIONAL FILMS. (Closed Caption File Spec: Hour Zero Start, WebVTT Format)
