Field Day: The Score

Field Day has many aspects. It takes a long time to get ready, 24 hours to operate it, and almost as long as preparation, to solve all the logging issues and figure out an entry score, as yearly they alter the forms, change the rules, or local happenstance of difficult conditions impedes the logging of all contacts. We know we got 610 contacts into the computer, we are still looking for a few more on hard copy.

That is why we have both an electronic and a check log of hard copy using W5SIO QWIK LOG sheets. They provide hard copy scratch notes that sometimes log a contact that does not get put into the computer in the excitement or weather of the occasion.

This year is was again heat as the big obstacle. Very humid at times, but plain hot and dry in the sun. Many thanks to all the workers and operators who made the 24 hours fly by and upped our effort from years past and low sunspots.

The sunspots were not great this year, but we had had a couple within the week of Field Day. That helped it seems or ears were tuned better to hear those elusive signals and calls.

Claimed score for contacts and bonus points plus GOTA station contribution and bonuses seems to be at least 3044, better than last year. In the 3A W5KA entry, we had 40m 93 contacts for 18 per cent (Not counting *(Continued on page 4)*)

GOTA, which added 116 on 40m! That resulted in a 40m total of 209. That brings 40m to 34.26%. 20m 282 contacts 57%. 15m 108 contacts 21% (going 3A was worth it!) 10m 11 contacts 2%

GOTA K5LBJ had on 40m 112 contacts and 4 contacts on CW! (A first) Lack of overnight operators again cut into what could be done on 75m, and thus it was not a contributor this year, when one 75m regular had to leave early.

Peter Jordahl, K5GM, had top contact honors of 104 on CW. Keita Bryce, KE5VYA had the top number of contacts in the under 18 youth section of the GOTA station with 40 contacts. Erin Gordon, KF5BFM, had 20. 8 persons had QSO numbers in double digits on W5KA, and 5 in doubles on the GOTA K5LBJ effort.

The CW station did 176 QSOs among several bands, after losing a computer port that prevented any RTTY activity. Thanks Lew W5IFQ, for two antennas, and HF multi mode Captain's duty as well as sending all our messages.

The 20m phone station did 160 QSOs, really pushing CW's record Thanks Bob Morgan WB5AOH for set up, teardown of the HF vertical ground plane, NVIS antennas, and the mobile NVIS loop demonstration.

The combined 10 and 15m phone station did 158 contacts, a superb effort by an all new set up crew. Thanks to Jerry Self for Captain's duty and a rig at the last minute. Thanks for getting rigs from Jeff Schmidt N5MNV and thanks to Jeff and Lori who were in our thoughts when they could not be at Field Day.

FCC: Vanity Call Sign Fees To Decrease August 17th

On July 19, the FCC announced via the *Federal Register* that the cost of a 10-year Amateur Radio vanity call sign will decrease 10 cents, from \$13.40 to \$13.30. The new fees take effect 30 days after publication, making August 17, 2010, the first day the new fee is in effect. In FY2010, the FCC anticipates granting 14,800 vanity call signs, bringing in \$196,840 from the vanity call sign program. Earlier this year, the FCC released a *Notice of Proposed Rule Making and Order (NPRM)*, seeking to lower the fee for Amateur Radio vanity call signs. The notice in the July 19, 2010 edition of the *Federal Register* -- entitled "Assessment and Collection of Regulatory Fees for Fiscal Year 2010; Final Rule" -- includes all FCC regulatory fees; these fees are expected to recover a total of \$336,712,213 during FY2010, encompassing all the Services the FCC regulates. The FCC is authorized by the *Communications Act of 1934, As Amended*, to collect vanity call sign fees to recover the costs associated with that program. The vanity call sign regulatory fee is payable not only when applying for a new vanity call sign, but also upon renewing a vanity call sign for a new 10-year term.

President: Paul showed off our ARRL Membership Drive Certificate of Appreciation; called for a By-Laws committee that will report to the officers in 90 days (volunteers were Stuart Rohre, K5KVH, Pete Jordahl, K5GM, and Mitch London); and asked the club to think about creating a Quartermaster & Historian position.

Ham of the Month: everyone who showed up to the AARC Field Day 2010.

Door-prize: Mitch London won 3 rolls of 3M tape (2-electrical, 1-splicing).

Space Weather: Lew Thompson, W5IFQ, had very little to discuss. It's been quiet.

Old Business: Field Day had 610 contacts, 95 attendees, ~1100 bonus & ~3044 overall points, a great showing from the GOTA station, and a visit from News8. More to come.
