



Defiance County Senior Centers and Meal Sites





Chronic Disease: Prevalence of Adults Ever Diagnosed with Chronic Diseases, Ohio, 2019








Research shows that most elder abuse goes unreported. The estimate here likely represents only a fraction of elder abuse in the Northwest Ohio region.

Over 1-in-4 older adult (age 65+)households (26%) live in unaffordable housing.




Housing is considered unaffordable if the costs, including utilities, are more than 30% of household income.



In Ohio between 2012 to 2018, the largest increase in accessing homeless services was in the age group 65+ which grew 208%.






Percent of Defiance County Age 65+ Below 125% of the Federal Poverty Level by Census Tracts
