





Population Projections: Percent of Population Age 75+




Percent of Population Living with Functional Difficulties, by Older Age Groups



Percent of Population in Henry County Living with a Disability, by Age Group




Unpaid Caregivers

1 in 5 Americans are unpaid caregivers.


The average family caregiver spends over







Chronic Disease: Prevalence of Adults Ever Diagnosed with Chronic Diseases, Ohio, 2019








Elder Abuse


43% Adults 60+ in the AOoA Region live in a **rural area.**

Affordable Housing in Henry County

Over **1-in-4** older adult (age 65+) households (**26%**) live in **unaffordable housing.**



Housing is considered unaffordable if the costs, including utilities, are more than 30% of household income.



There are **only 35 affordable** and available housing units **per every 100** extremely low-income (ELI) renters in Henry County.

54 Henry County **older adults** (age 62+) households rely on **housing subsidies**, including public housing, Supportive Housing for the Elderly (202), and the Housing Choice Voucher Program.



A renter is considered ELI if their income is less than or equal to 30% of Area Median Income.


Homelessness Among Older Adults in the AOoA Region

In Ohio between 2012 to 2018, the largest increase in accessing homeless services was in the **age group 65+** which grew **208%**.


The number of **homeless adults age 60+** will **double** from 2017 to 2030.




Percent of Henry County Age 65+ Below 125% of the Federal Poverty Level by Census Tracts
