DID YOU KNOW?

During the 1970 season, the Eastside Blazers did not play any home games. This was due to construction of the current high school on East Green Street and its original athletic facilities. "Home" games in the 1970 season were played at the following locations: at Woodlan High School (Woodlan game); at Angola's former Boomershine Field (Carroll); at Heritage High School (Heritage) and at DeKalb High School (Norwell - homecoming game). Eastside did not win any of these contests.

In the 1972 season opener, John Fallis, a former assistant coach at Adams Central, made his varsity head coaching debut at Eastside. He would be the first coach to compile a winning season and a winning record at Eastside, going 20-18 in four seasons. Fallis later coached at Jennings County and Greencastle, where he would assist a former Eastside coach, Jim Hummer. Fallis was elected to the Indiana High School Football Hall of Fame in 2004.

In the 1979 season opener, the Blazers hosted the Caston Comets. Making his varsity head coaching debut in that game for Caston was Dan Drotar. Drotar won this game, played at Eastside, by a 13-6 score. Drotar would later coach Eastside from 1986 to 1991, compiling a record of 38 wins and 16 losses.

In the 1992 season opener, 22-year-old Jim Hummer made his varsity head coaching debut at Eastside. Hummer was a member of DeKalb's 1986 Class 4A state championship team. Hummer would coach the Blazers from 1992 to 1998, compiling a record of 38 wins and 30 losses. After Eastside, Hummer was head coach at Greencastle, where he succeeded former Eastside coach John Fallis. Fallis also served as an assistant coach with Hummer.

In the 1999 season opener, 1981 Eastside graduate Lonny Emenhiser became the first Eastside alumnus to serve as head football coach. Emenhiser would win his first game as head coach with a 19-13 victory over West Noble. He became the first head coach in Eastside history to win his first three games at the helm.

In the 2004 season opener, 1994 Eastside graduate Brennen Kitchen became the first former Eastside varsity player to serve as head football coach. Kitchen's first victory came in his second game as head coach, a 33-6 win over Prairie Heights. This also marked the first home game under the new lighting system and with the new press box and elevated bleachers.

In the 2017 season opener, 1992 Eastside graduate and former player Todd Mason coached his first game as head football coach. Mason's first victory came in his second game, a 28-7 win over Adams Central.
