Our Recent Work with The Butchers Company:

Run the River

On Wednesday 21st September, runners, volunteers and supporters came together on the banks of the river Thames in London to see the return of Run the River to its iconic location. And between 19-25 September, hundreds of runners around the world took on their own route in a location of their choosing to help tear down hurdles for the poorest schoolchildren.

Overall, we had 1,845 runners across 59 countries, raising a massive £181,000.

After running a virtual-only event for two years it was a huge challenge to bring a hybrid-style event back to London. Without the support of our partners and volunteers, this would not have been possible. We are incredibly grateful to everyone that took part.



This year we were delighted to see another fantastic team from the Worshipful Company of Butchers. 60 members of the Company signed up to take part in our event, either virtually or inperson, raising over £2,000 for our work. This is a huge achievement, and we are so grateful to everyone who ran, walked, rowed or cycled 5 or 10k to support those schools most in need. We also really appreciate both Margaret, Steve and Lucy Thompson who joined the event to help run our bag drop station, the event would not be possible without such great volunteers.

Gressingham Assembly

This year we are excited to have started working alongside Gressingham whose staff kindly gave time out of their working day to talk about their business with local pupils. Staff from Gressingham joined the St Alban's Catholic High School assembly on Tuesday morning, giving an insight into their day-to-day work, and how they progressed in their careers. This was a great opportunity for our pupils, who really benefited from this presentation. We have had some fantastic initial feedback from the teachers involved:

Plans for the New Year

Harper Adams:

Over the last few years, we have worked closely with the Widening Participation team at Harper Adams. Harper Adams has since developed a strong relationship with Bishops' Castle Community Academy, a Teach First school that has previously visited Harper Adams, and benefited from a unique guest teacher lesson from their team.

On the 10^{th of} November, Bishop's Castle is joining the Harper Adams Food Science Open Day. Gerald Shortland will also be attending. This is our first opportunity to trial when a business and school form an independent relationship, without the continued involvement of Teach First. This enables us to maximise the positive impact we can have on our pupils and give us a greater opportunity to work with a larger number of businesses. We look forward to updating the Committee after the Open Day and we know that the school and pupils are really excited about this opportunity.



Thank-you event:

On the 17th of November, Teach First are hosting a celebration of our partners. We have invited all of those who have supported our work over the last year. During the event guests will meet with teachers working on the frontline of our partner schools and hear exclusive updates and unique insights from our Executive Team and Trustees. They'll be sharing their favourite moments that you've helped make possible this year, and their ambitions for the year ahead.

Guest Teacher Lesson:

Again, as we look to plan our school activities for the next year of partnership, we are keen to organise a further workplace visit. These are always a great opportunity for our pupils to experience a workplace and learn from people in a variety of roles.

We have previously worked with some great companies, who have all kindly offered to host another visit next year. We also look forward to working with some new companies within the Livery.

Coaching:

Our coaching programme offers our trainee teachers an opportunity to be coached by members of our partner organisations. This is an incredibly valuable partnership, which provides trainees with unbiased support through some of their everyday challenges.

We are delighted to hear that two members of the Livery, Nicola Chandler and Francesca Wyatt have already expressed an interest in joining the programme once applications open in April next year. Neither has taken part before, but we are sure they will provide fantastic coaching support. We will update the Livery once applications are open next year, and with a confirmation on the number of coaching places available to the Company.

Careers Expo:

In July this year we were delighted to again host our Careers Expo at the Butcher's Hall. This impressive venue is the perfect place to welcome our pupils and partners, and this year we had over 250 pupils from schools across London join us for the day.



As we continue our partnership into the next year, we would love to host our 2023 Careers Expo at the Butchers Hall. If it's available, we will be looking to host this in July 2023. We will be working with the team at Bovingdons over the coming weeks to confirm a date and will share this with the Committee as soon as possible. We would also like to welcome the Livery to host their own stand at the Expo, to introduce pupils to the many opportunities available in the food industry.
